1	MAYOR NYCE: Good evening. I will call
2	this meeting o the Board of Trustees to
3	order. Please rise.
4	(Whereupon, all rose for the Pledge of
5	Allegiance, followed by a Moment of
6	Silence.)
7	MAYOR NYCE: This is the December
8	Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of
9	the Village of Greenport. On behalf of
10	the Board and myself, I would like to wish
11	you all a Happy and Healthy New Year, Merry
12	Christmas, Happy Kwanzaa and Boxing Day.
13	The winter season is upon us. Please be
14	prepared to keep sidewalks clear during
15	snow, remove vehicles from the street for
16	proper plowing, and check in with your

17	elderly neighbors and family members. Help
18	them out. Last couple of years we had a
19	great deal of snow fall. It takes a strain.
20	Village Offices will be closed for the
21	entire day on December 25, 2013 and on
22	January 1, 2013 for Christmas and New
23	Year's Day respectively. And for the
24	afternoons of December 24th and
25	December 31st, in celebration of Christmas

1	and the New Year. The Village Offices will
2	be also closed on January 20th, in
3	observance of Martin Luther Kind, Jr. Day.
4	Also, the work session for the month of
5	January will be held on Tuesday, January
6	21st.
7	Under Informational, we're announcing
8	that there were Liquor License's that were
9	applied for: Vino n Vittles, Ltd., 110
10	Front Street. Sakura, 240 Front Street.
11	Rinocito Hispano, Sterlington Commons, Unit
12	#7.

13	There are no Public Hearing's. I will
14	ask if there is anyone that wishes to
15	address the Board?
16	MR. SWISKEY: William Swiskey, 184
17	Fifth Street. The main concern that I have
18	here, going back in the, November Regular
19	Meeting, there was a RESOLUTION passed and
20	you all voted for it. The Board approved an
21	agreement for bid documents, engineering e
22	and blah, blah, blah with Genesys
23	Engineering. So I FOIL'd for that document.
24	The first response that I got was from
25	alright. This was on the 27th of November.

1	We got a copy of your FOIL and basically,
2	it was respectively receive a response on
3	December 19th, which was another 20 days or
4	so. So come December 19th, I get this
5	response from the Village: "Please note
6	that the requested document does not yet
7	exist. Once it's drafted and fully

8 executed, a copy will be provided in 9 response to your FOIL request." How do you spend \$285,000.00 and you have nothing? I 10 mean, that's like -- basically you approve 11 12 \$285,000.00 worth of work for this guy and 13 you don't even know what he's going to do. 14 Now, one thing I would like to ask every 15 individual on the Board, George, did you 16 see this agreement? Mary Bess? 17 TRUSTEE HUBBARD: Work in progress. 18 MR. SWISKEY: How do you approve work 19 in progress when you approved an agreement 20 with -- whatever the agreement was, it's 21 not a work in progress. Did you see the 22 agreement Mary Bess? 23 TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Yes, I did see the 24 agreement and the wording that was in it. 25 MR. SWISKEY: When did you see it?

1	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Before the motion.
2	MR. SWISKEY: Because the Clerk is
3	telling me it's doesn't exist.

4	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: That I can't answer.
5	I can't tell you what the Clerk's give you
6	as far as information. I can tell you that
7	I saw an actual copy of the document. I do
8	understand that they are still in
9	negotiations with it. So I can't tell you
10	whether they received it or not. I can't
11	answer that.
12	MR. SWISKEY: Wait a minute. The Village
13	approved this, \$285.000.00. There better be
14	a
15	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: That's not how the
16	RESOLUTION reads.
17	MR. SWISKEY: The RESOLUTION reads, and
18	I will read it Mary Bess, the minutes say
19	to execute the agreement with Genesys
20	Engineering for engineering service,
21	preparation of bid documents. This is
22	saying it exist.
23	MAYOR NYCE: It doesn't say pay them.
24	It says execute the agreement. Once the
25	agreement is finished, it will be executed

1	and we have bee authorized to do that.
2	MR. SWISKEY: I can tell you
3	MAYOR NYCE: Once the contract has been
4	executed and the work completed, we will
5	pay it. Because we agreed to the amount,
6	does not mean we pay the money out before
7	there is an agreement in hand.
8	MR. SWISKEY: Well, the agreement
9	MAYOR NYCE: If you don't understand
10	how the process works
11	MR. SWISKEY: I don't understand how
12	your process works because it's not written
13	in the real world. I have never heard of
14	this before. I know, Mr. Mayor, like it was
15	going to be \$7.00 to \$10.00 for the PPA
16	and suddenly it's an 80% jump. This month
17	it's about a 45% jump. That's a lot more
18	than \$7.00 to \$10.00. Plus, I know a lot
19	of people called Village Hall and I went to
20	Village Hall and inquired about a PPA, and
21	the point is, the Power Authority's

22	response to me was, With regard to the
23	Village's lack of response in helpfulness
24	in response to customer inquiries, NYPPA
25	will inquire into this matter with relevant

1	Village personnel. I mean, you have a bill
2	from the Power Authority or wherever, and
3	you are paying this bill, and you have no
4	idea of what you are paying for. That
5	would be like I took my car to a mechanic,
6	he gives me a bill for \$5,000.00. Here's
7	the bill. I said, "what did you do?" "I
8	fixed it." Well, that's not an answer. Most
9	bills somebody has to be able to
10	explain. Did you change the head? Did you
11	change the oil? I am just baffled by this
12	Board, to tell you the truth. It's like
13	Here is another one about this transmission
14	agreement. Well, I FOIL'd for that a while
15	ago. And what I am looking all the
16	Village can provide me with, which is not
17	the agreement that I asked for, which says,

18	we're going to pay, blah, blah. They
19	provided me with two pages, which basically
20	says the Mayor agrees to whatever these
21	people say. That is kind of foolish. I am
22	just a little bit baffled on that one.
23	Anyway, one good thing that came out of the
24	last meeting was that you didn't turn the
25	lights off because it wasn't necessary.

1	MAYOR NYCE: Is there anyone else that
2	wishes to address the Board?
3	MR. SALADINO: John Saladino, Sixth
4	Street. I have a question about the
5	alternate. I am not sure about the number
6	of the RESOLUTION, but for the changes of
7	the amount of people on the Planning and
8	Zoning Board. It reads that the local law,
9	each member may participate in replacement
10	of a Board member that has a conflict of
11	interest. So you are going to put two
12	additional members on the board in case one

13	member or two members have a conflict if
14	interest. It's a five man board. Why would
15	you increase it? There is no warrant for
16	that. If there are three members there
17	is I don't understand the need. Did I
18	tell a joke or something? There is a five
19	man board now you are looking for two more
20	members. Has the Zoning Board and the
21	Planning Board not addressed the
22	application because three people on the
23	Board have a conflict of interest?
24	
25	George, to your recollection, has that

1	happened?
2	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: No. Right now, there
3	is one member that is medically unable to
4	attend.
5	MR. SALADINO: But that's
6	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: John, at the work
7	session, I asked the Board when this would
8	apply and these people be used. They would

9	be asked by the Chairman of the Board to
10	sit in for somebody else who either has a
11	conflict or unable to do it, and would be
12	with that process of that hearing from
13	start to finish. They wouldn't come in at
14	last minute. The only way that they would
15	be asked to do anything, the Chairman of
16	the Board would ask, "John Saladino, would
17	you sit in for this hearing. It could be
18	two or three months and give us a hand
19	doing this?" It's an alternate if need be.
20	MR. SALADINO: But that's not what it
21	says here. It specifically says to
22	conflict of interest.
23	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: Two alternate members
24	also if somebody is unable to attend.
25	God forbid somebody got cancer or whatever.

1	They will be out for six months and you
2	need another person to show up, they would
3	be asked by the Chairman and this person is

4	going to sit in for the time being. Only
5	when needed.
6	MAYOR NYCE: This was explained at the
7	work session. This was not done at our
8	request.
9	MR. SALADINO: Are you talking to me?
10	MAYOR NYCE: Yes, I am. The Chair I
11	am addressing your question in the overall
12	sense. The request was done at the Chair's
13	of those Board's because they perceive a
14	problem. They asked that we address it. It
15	went through the channels. It went to the
16	Code Committee. We had a Public Hearing .
17	It's now here for a vote. This is not being
18	done to stack the Boards. It was done at
19	these Board's request, and we're going to
20	go through the process.
21	MR. SALADINO: I don't have a question
22	of the timeline. I have a question on the
23	motivation. That's my question. I am not
24	asking about what the process was. I am
25	questioning the motivation. As much as I

1	believe George, that is not what it says.
2	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: And the law is what
3	we're adopting.
4	MR. SALADINO: But illness doesn't
5	constitute conflict of interest.
6	MAYOR NYCE: I agree.
7	MR. SALADINO: Again, so I come back to
8	my original question. Has there ever been
9	a case, other than the Chairman section,
10	there might be a case in a particular
11	future, but has there ever been a case
12	where three members of the Board had the
13	same conflict of interest on one particular
14	item that they couldn't vote?
15	MAYOR NYCE: No, not with three
16	members, but if you only have a quorum
17	where you have to have three members make
18	a unanimous decision in order to move the
19	project forward. So if you have two and one
20	with a conflict of interest, the Board is
21	hampered by the fact that they all have to
22	vote in favor in order to move on, rather

23	than allowing those three members the
24	difference of opinion. So John, I am not
25	going to get into a debate over this with

1	you. The reason for this is clearly spelled
2	out in the law. It has been discussed at
3	length at the work session and at the
4	Public Hearing .
5	MR. SALADINO: First of all, I dispute
6	that, Mr. Mayor. It wasn't discussed at
7	length at any work session that I have
8	attended. I have attended every work
9	session that you have, number one. Number
10	two, we weren't privy to what happened at
11	the Code Committee. There are no minutes
12	MAYOR NYCE: It's a public meeting.
13	MR. SALADINO: Well, maybe I had
14	something to do that day. There are no
15	minutes available.
16	MAYOR NYCE: There are minutes
17	available.

18	MR. SALADINO: Are they on the website?
19	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: They are supposed to
20	be.

MR. SALADINO: For this sake, it's not.
MAYOR NYCE: You can certainly request
them.

24 MR. SALADINO: The law is specific the25 way you write it. My question still stands,

1	perhaps to another Trustee. To your
2	recollection, has there ever been a case
3	where a Board, either Zoning of Planning
4	couldn't move forward because three members
5	had a conflict of interest?
6	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: John, in all
7	honestly, I can't answer that question.
8	Let me explain, but, we or those who have
9	been on the Board have to take required
10	courses. Four hours of required courses.
11	Within the Department of State's
12	recommendation to small municipalities, it
13	is recommended that they pass some type of

14	legislation so that conflict of interest
15	can be taken care of, if it should ever
16	arise. Okay. That is a Department of
17	State's recommendation. In all honesty, at
18	first I hesitated with this until I went
19	back and started doing my research on what
20	I had learned over th years. This is
21	because and the Mayor was right. If you
22	have three people, you need to have a
23	unanimous vote to make an application move
24	forward. We have had that problem in the
25	past. I do know that the Chairman of the

1	Zoning Board has mentioned to me several
2	times in the past, that an upcoming permit
3	application, there may be some conflicts of
4	their members. So he has requested that we
5	put this into place, so that we can make
6	this easier on applicant's on their
7	projects and not holding them up. The
8	Department of State actually recommends

9	that we do this. It is one of their
10	recommendation. My understanding is, that
11	law is let's say for instance, a
12	gentleman is a neighbor of a project that
13	is coming up. There is a conflict of
14	interest in the ZBA Meeting. He has to
15	recuse himself. It's a conflict of
16	interest. So now it's my understanding that
17	someone who has been brought up to speed,
18	cannot act on something, cannot do
19	something until they're brought up to speed
20	on that particular application. It's not
21	going to be on any other's. It's just on
22	that application. That is my understanding
23	and how it was explained to me.
24	MR. SALADINO: You have also been
25	around a long time, that when conversations

1	are supposed to be very specific about one
2	specific item, it perhaps doesn't happen
3	sometimes the conversation drips into other
4	things. Now you have people that are

5	entitled not to be in that conversation
6	because they don't have a time of offering
7	opinions. You have perhaps, three people
8	from the regular board and two people who
9	are appointed members offering opinions
10	about something
11	MAYOR NYCE: They only serve when the
12	Chairman asks then. They are all appointed.
13	MR. SALADINO: So why not make it a
14	seven man board? We live in a community
15	that has a lot of elderly. People get sick
16	all the time. Just make it a seven man
17	board? Why goes through all of this? Is it
18	germane to this, is there is a conflict of
19	interest? If so, then we're going to ask
20	the chairman and he's going to decide if
21	it's legitimate. And then recuse them. And
22	then how do you decide which alternate to
23	put in? You get two alternates for each
24	board
25	MAYOR NYCE: It's up to two alternates.

1	MR. SALADINO: So we're doing to debate
2	that it's up to two alternates?
3	MAYOR NYCE: You're the one debating
4	it, John. I am just stating the law.
5	MR. SALADINO: It's my right. If I am
6	inconveniencing you, I apologize to you and
7	the public. I kind of live here and I am
8	entitled to ask these questions.
9	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Can I ask a
10	question?
11	MR. SALADINO: Absolutely.
12	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Are you going to put
13	your name as one of the alternates?
14	MR. SALADINO: If I thought that there
15	I was going to use an ethnic joke. I
16	think I have as much probability of winning
17	the Mega Ball then I do as being
18	appointed.
19	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Seriously
20	MR. SALADINO: I have been.
21	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: I am asking if you
22	were asked, would you serve?

23	MR. SALADINO: Yes. I am a retired guy
24	and I am volunteer type guy and I do
25	whatever my Village thought I needed to do.

1	MAYOR NYCE: I asked you before and you
2	said, no.
3	MR. SALADINO: And what was my
4	reasoning? Because I didn't know the job
5	well enough. I don't think that I should
6	be on the Planning Board. I think it's
7	ludicrous to have anyone on the Planning
8	Board who aren't professional planners. I
9	am a little ranty. I apologize. I would
10	certainly do any job that I felt that I was
11	qualified to do.
12	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: So you can put in
13	your application to the ZBA or Planning
14	Board.
15	MR. SALADINO: ZBA, I feel I am
16	qualified. The Planning Board, I do not

17 feel that I am. In looking around this

18 room, I don't know anyone that is. I have

19	a quick question, are there any other
20	agenda items that aren't on the
21	MAYOR NYCE: No.
22	MR. SALADINO: Also, do you plan on
23	going to Executive Session?
24	MAYOR NYCE: No.
25	MR. SALADINO: Thank you. Merry

1	Christmas.
2	MAYOR NYCE: Is there anyone else that
3	wishes to address the Board?
4	MR. CORWIN: David Corwin. This is in
5	relation to what Mr. Saladino was just
6	talking about. I had sent in a letter to
7	the Public Hearing. I don't know if it was
8	read but I question to putting alternate
9	members onto the board, on the ZBA or the
10	Planning Board. First of all, you have
11	enough trouble filling it in the first
12	place. Secondly, a new member, it really
13	takes a few months to get up to speed and

14	understand what is going on. So unless an
15	alternate wants to put in the time and sit
16	in on the meetings, I really don't see it
17	working out. The other thing that I would
18	like to address is the fees for wetlands
19	permits. It's going up to \$350.00 and then
20	a fee for what was built. When you say
21	\$5.00 a cubic yard for dredging, I think
22	that is a little excessive. For example,
23	what is the county decides that they are
24	going to do a little dredging in the creek
25	and what if it's a couple of thousand yards

1	that they are going to pump on Sandy Beach,
2	you are going to say to them, \$350.00 for
3 0	an application fee and \$10,000 just to do
4	some dredging. So I am questioning that.
5	You might want to give it a little thought.
6	MAYOR NYCE: To that, we discussed it
7 0	at Code Committee. We set up prices that
8 1	were significantly lower then the Town's
9 1	per cubic yard. But your comment is well

10 taken.

11	Is there anyone else that wishes to
12	address the Board?
13	(No Response.)
14	MAYOR NYCE: If not, that concludes the
15	public portion. There are two RESOLUTION'S,
16	RESOLUTION #18 is being omitted. It is
17	being omitted because we're not going to
18	have the draft ready in time. We will take
19	that up at the January meeting. RESOLUTION
20	#17, right before it, will also be those
21	part-time rates will be as of December 2nd,
22	as they have already been hired and begun
23	to do that work.
24	I also want to note that Trustee Murray
25	is absent this evening. He is excused. He

1	and his family left early for the south for
2	Christmas. I didn't think it was necessary
3	to hold him up for that.
4	So with that, I will offer RESOLUTION

5	#12-2013-1, adopting the December 2013
6	agenda as just amended.
7	So moved.
8	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Second.
9	MAYOR NYCE: All those in favor?
10	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: Aye.
11	TRUSTEE ROBINS: Aye.
12	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Aye.
13	MAYOR NYCE: Aye.
14	Any opposed or abstentions?
15	(No Response.)
16	MAYOR NYCE: That motion carries.
17	I will read along with you, but I was
18	also going to suggest that the Osinski's
19	are here. If the Board does not mind, maybe
20	we will move to them. Rather at the start,
21	then the end of the meeting. I will ask
22	Trustee Hubbard to read RESOLUTION #25.
23	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: RESOLUTION
24	#12-2013-25, RESOLUTION to approve the
25	Wetland's Permit application as submitted

1	by Michael Osinski of 307 Flint Street, to
2	build a dock 140 feet into Greenport Harbor
3	with a 26 square foot work platform, and to
4	make minor repairs on existing structures
5	in Widow's Hole, per the Public Hearing,
6	which was held on November 25, 2013 at
7	6:00 p.m. at the Third Street Firehouse.
8	So moved.
9	MAYOR NYCE: Second that. I am going
10	to ask if there is any discussion on this
11	motion?
12	TRUSTEE ROBINS: Yes. Actually, I am
13	going to ask that we table this motion. I
14	still have questions about the expansion of
15	this business in the residential
16	neighborhood. The application as presented
17	to us right now still does not address that
18	adequately. According to the plans that I
19	see, the operation in the Creek will remain
20	and we will have an additional business
21	going out in the bay. And I do feel that
22	we need to have some additional discussion
23	on that.

24 MAYOR NYCE: Under discussion, I was25 going to offer a slight amendment to the

22

1 RESOLUTION. I was going to suggest that we 2 basically codify what we discussed in both 3 the Public Hearing and the work session, 4 and that would be -- the purpose of this is 5 to move the operation from Widow's Hole to 6 this dock, and to alleviate the problems or 7 the perceived problems, that the neighbors have within Widow's Hole. So what I was 8 going to offer was an amendment that 9 basically that states that is the purpose 10 of this and that the commercial operation 11 12 of oysters be that as it is permitted. 13 That is the upweller's in Widow's Hole, the 14 docking of the boats, etcetera, etcetera, which would alleviate any of the concerns 15 16 of the neighbors, I believe. It would also 17 allow Widow's Hole to continue doing the 18 work that they're doing with the permits

19	that they already have. And basically to
20	an extent, it ties it up. I don't know if
21	that answers Trustee Robins concerns or
22	not. If so, there is no second to table.
23	We need another motion to table or we
24	could discuss a motion to amend as an
25	alternate.

1	TRUSTEE ROBINS: My concern, I want the
2	language of the application reflect what we
3	are talking about here. That is my
4	concern.
5	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: So you want the
6	application to reflect a change of the
7	permit within Widow's Hole, is that what
8	you're asking?
9	TRUSTEE ROBINS: No, I am not asking
10	for a change. The language that we were
11	discussing at the Public Hearing and what
12	we have presented at the table is that
13	basically Mr. Osinski is going to move his
14	business out from Widow's Hole into the

15	bay, but he's not. He's keeping his
16	business in Widow's Hole and moving his
17	dock out onto the bay. Okay. To me, that
18	looks like a major expansion of his
19	business with more product, and the product
20	that he is putting out does not get shipped
21	from the water. They are coming out to
22	Flint Street extension and a residential
23	road. I mean; is that correct?
24	MR. OSINSKI: Am I supposed to discuss
25	this?

1	MAYOR NYCE: No, we're discussing this.
2	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Let me ask a
3	question. What is the difference between a
4	bay scalloper and someone who is within the
5	Village of Greenport and as per DEC, can
6	open a bay scallop shop in any garage in
7	any residential area in the Village of
8	Greenport? Because we have permissible
9	water, it is very easy for a gentleman or a

10	lady, who is doing bay scallops to do it in
11	their house because of the permissible law
12	requirements for the shucking of clams.
13	That activity would be far worse with bay
14	scallop shells and they do have trucks in
15	and out. The Osinski's is not as
16	complicated as that. They are taking
17	un-open product and just moving it from one
18	spot to another. I am assuming that, the
19	way Mike and Isabelle were explaining to
20	me, and maybe somethings we might need
21	clarification, their nursery stock is
22	staying within Widow's Hole to protect it
23	from the windstorm and then the bulk of
24	their "noisy" operation that has concerned
25	the neighbors, and I have to say, I

1	understand where they are coming from, but
2	it's being moved out onto the platform. If
3	that is the way that I am reading things.
4	So that is my understanding. The nursery
5	stock is within Widow's Hole. The Ag

6	scheme or agricultural has been cleaning up
7	Widow's Hole. That's part of the business
8	that we use, the filtering system. They
9	are cleaning out the algae in Widow's Hole
10	and they are making the area better. I
11	understand the neighbors concern and yes,
12	it's an enterprise commercial fishing
13	industry and that is the umbrella of
14	agriculture fishing industry. And that,
15	agriculture farmers has this type of noise
16	once in a while, but the Osinski's are
17	making an attempt to try and move this away
18	from the neighbors. But the nursery stock
19	is staying within Widow's Hole.
20	MAYOR NYCE: Which is why I am
21	suggesting the amendment that I was, to
22	clarify this for everyone. The upweller's
23	are already permitted in Widow's Hole,
24	which is where they are doing the nursery
25	work. They already have nursery there.

1	Again, the reason that I suggested was just
2	to clarify all concerns of what exactly we
3	are permitting and it doesn't change any of
4	the activities. The activities that are
5	going on are already permitted. It's just
6	adding it to the RESOLUTION.
7	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: I believe what you
8	are adding there, if you look at the
9	pictures of the application, it shows the
10	platform with the sorting machine and
11	everything else. That is where this is all
12	going. We are just reaffirming the
13	application.
14	MAYOR NYCE: Exactly.
15	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: It is all moving from
16	the inside to the outside.
17	MAYOR NYCE: Right. So under just
18	procedurally, we have a motion to table
19	with no second. If there is no second, the
20	motion to table does not get taken up. I
21	would offer a motion to amend based on the
22	conversation that we had and go to the
23	Board, if there is a second to amend?

24 TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Second.

25 MAYOR NYCE: All right. And that

1	motion to amend would state that the
2	Widow's Hole would be stay with those
3	already permitted, which would include the
4	upweller's and the activities that are
5	already approved in Widow's Hole and the
6	rest of the activity would be as per the
7	application that is moved out to the
8	commercial dock. The Village attorney
9	informed me the Army Corp is waiting on our
10	approval to finalize their approval, and he
11	has asked that we add to this RESOLUTION
12	that if they change anything that we
13	reserve the right to review the
14	application. But I think the Army Corp is
15	waiting for our approval and then they will
