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1 2 (The meeting was called to order at 4:01 p.m.) 3 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: We're going to open the Village of Greenport Planning Board Work 4 It is December 28, 2017, at 4:01 p.m., and 5 Session. I have as number one on our agenda: 6 "Motion to accept the conditional use application for applicant 7 Kara Hoblin. The applicant is proposing to open a 8 9 studio/retail space at 15 Front Street. This 10 property is located in the Waterfront Commercial 11 District, and a public hearing is required. This property is not located in the Historic District. 12 Designated as Suffolk County Tax Map number 13 1001-5-4-31.1. 14 15 So since it does have to be set for a public hearing 16 and I've discussed with the Board Members, I'm not going to ask for comment on this application this 17 18 evening because the comments can be done at the public hearing. So I'm going to make a motion to 19 20 accept the conditional use application for the 21 applicant. 22 Do I have a second? 23 MEMBER THOMAS: Second. 24 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: All those in

25 favor?

1 2 MEMBER THOMAS: Aye. 3 MEMBER BURNS: Aye. ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Aye. 4 Motion carried. 5 MS. BERRY: I have a question for the 6 7 applicant. ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Yes, I'm sorry. 8 MS. BERRY: On the application it mentioned 9 10 that -- Kara? 11 MS. HOBLIN: Yes. MS. BERRY: But it also referenced 12 permission to the North Fork --13 14 MS. HOBLIN: It's the same entity. 15 MS. BERRY: It's the same entity? 16 MS. HOBLIN: Yeah. MS. BERRY: So the proposal is for 17 Fashion --18 19 MS. HOBLIN: No, it's the same, we're just 20 moving the space to -- because the space that we're 21 in right now is going to be something else. 22 MS. BERRY: Okay. Because I think on the 23 application it said apparel or something like that. MS. HOBLIN: Oh, that's her application 24 (pointing). 25

1 2 MS. BERRY: Right, but I think on yours, 3 maybe somebody just copied it and I dont' know. It seemed -- I just wanted to confirm the use. 4 MS. HOBLIN: No, no, it's the same. 5 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: I would like to 6 7 comment on an event that was held in your space that you presently own now, which was not a permitted 8 9 use, if I'm correct. It was a concert? 10 MR. PALLAS: That's my understanding. 11 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Uh-huh. I got a violation about that 12 MS. HOBLIN: and I've already been talking to the Village to 13 figure out -- it said it was like a mass -- I think 14 15 I have it but it doesn't -- I'm, like, talking to 16 them now because what they thought it was, it wasn't and there was like some terminology that we never --17 I didn't know I had to get a permit if it was a 18 private, not a public event. So there's -- so I was 19 20 confused about it and so -- and the violation says 21 going further everything has to be gone through and 22 figured out, which is what I plan to do. 23 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Okay, great, 24 qood. 25 MR. PALLAS: I'm sorry, I wasn't listening

1 2 at the end of that but there is an active notice of 3 violation. Just to clarify, you characterized it as a private event -- again, we're not here for that 4 purpose but if someone is selling a ticket --5 ACTIVE CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Right. Ticket 6 7 sales constitute --MS. HOBLIN: We didn't sell anything 8 9 though. 10 MR. PALLAS: Somebody did and if somebody sells a ticket and you go to the venue, that's not, 11 by definition, private. So, I just want to make 12 sure -- I don't want it to be left on the record 13 that it was a private event. 14 15 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: I was going to 16 clarify that as well, thank you. 17 MS. HOBLIN: I guess I didn't know that if we weren't selling the tickets and it was considered 18 an art event to us, but I didn't know and reading 19 20 this now, if I go and if we chose to do that again, 21 which maybe not, but if we do, we'd have to get an 22 approval to do so. 23 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Good. 24 MS. BERRY: Can I also make a comment? 25 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Sure.

1 2 MEMBER BERRY: Art galleries -- in that, are kind of a difficult item sometimes because --3 MS. HOBLIN: Yeah, it's more like a 4 collective and it's a new thing. I know that it --5 MS. BERRY: Well, whether it's 6 7 merchandising or it's considered an assembly -- so when you applied it was mercantile and so the 8 9 occupancy is different. There are different 10 limitations and also the requirements for bathroom facilities are different. If you start operating 11 like a gallery that has major events, then the 12 requirements for the space are different. So I 13 think you need to go and check that again to make 14 15 sure you comply with the approvals that you 16 received. 17 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Right. I just 18 want us all to be on the same page and know where we 19 stand and what's allowed and what isn't. 20 MR. PALLAS: I'm sorry, just the plans that 21 we have -- you're in space one? 22 MR. LOEBS: (Indicating.) 23 MR. PALLAS: It's two? Okay. 24 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: So, I think the same work -- I think the same described work is 25

1 2 attached to both applications 3 MR. PALLAS: That's correct. ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Okay. 4 IS 5 everyone okay now? May I proceed with setting the date for the public hearing? (No response) Great. 6 7 I make a motion to set a public hearing for work session on January 25. Do I have a second? 8 9 MEMBER THOMAS: Second. 10 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: All those in 11 favor? 12 MEMBER THOMAS: Aye. 13 MEMBER BURNS: Aye. 14 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Aye. Motion 15 carried. So the public hearing is set for 16 January 25th, 4:00 p.m. 17 Item number two, again, 15 Front Street. Motion to accept the conditional use application and 18 19 signage application for applicant Crinoline Fashion 20 Boutique, Ltd. The applicant is proposing to open a 21 retail space at 15 Front Street. This property is 22 located in the Waterfront Commercial District, and a public hearing is required. This property is not 23 located in the Historic District. Suffolk County 24 Tax Map Number 1001-5-4-31.1. Any comments on this 25

1 application? Glynis? Paul? 2 MS. BERRY: Oh, I have a quick --3 4 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Sure, Glynis. MS. BERRY: On the sign application 5 portion. To me, you didn't have the dimensions and 6 you had pictures of the other sign and --7 8 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: We do. 9 MS. BERRY: You do? I didn't see the 10 dimensions. CLERK LINGG: She had submitted it again 11 this week. 12 MS. BERRY: It's limited to twenty-four, 13 that's too big. A hanging sign is limited to two 14 15 square feet. 16 MS. TINTLE: I'm putting laminate over what's already there. 17 18 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: It's the same 19 size as the existing one for Calypso? MS. TINTLE: The Ink Spot is doing it for 20 21 me. They're going to laminate over the sign that's 22 already there. 23 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: The Calypso 24 sign. 25 MR. PALLAS: We'll get a clarification

1 2 prior to the hearing whether that can stay the same 3 size or not. ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Okay. We're 4 5 going to get -- yes, sir? MR. LOEBS: I believe it's grandfathered. 6 7 MR. PALLAS: I'm not going to comment, I have to review --8 9 MR. LOEBS: The hanging sign --ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Stop this right 10 Please take the podium and state your name and 11 now. address for the stenographer so that we have it on 12 record. That's the proper procedure. Thank you. 13 MR. LOEBS: Hi, it's Steve Loebs, 8 Dory 14 15 Lane, Southampton, New York. 16 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Okay. Go ahead. MR. LOEBS: I was under the impression that 17 18 that was grandfathered if it was in place prior to 19 2011. 20 MR. PALLAS: Again, unfortunately -- I 21 apologize that I haven't been brought up to speed on 22 this particular application but I will review. Ιf what you're saying is accurate, I will bring that to 23 the Board's attention at the hearing. 24 25 MR. LOEBS: In case the Board's not

1 familiar with the building, there are currently four 2 3 hanging signs over the sidewalk and what we're proposing to do is basically leave them in place, 4 and just as Carrie said, laminate over the existing 5 6 signs. 7 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Right. Ι understand and he'll get clarification on what's 8 9 allowed and what isn't. 10 MR. LOEBS: Thank you. 11 MS. HOBLIN: I have a quick question. ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Please take the 12 podium. Is this on the current application, because 13 that's what we're discussing. 14 15 MS. HOBLIN: It's about the date of the 16 public hearing. ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Okay. Which is 17 the 25th. 18 19 MS. HOBLIN: Is there any way -- I think 20 I'm going to be travelling then and then -- I have 21 to double check my itinerary but I'm pretty sure I 22 leave the 22nd. Is there any other leeway or other

date previous we could have it or after I travel or 23 -- is there -- I just don't know.

25 MEMBER PALLAS: Not previous.

1 2 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: No, not 3 previous. The next available date would be the first, at our regular session. 4 5 MS. HOBLIN: February 1st? ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Yes. 6 7 MS. HOBLIN: Umm, can we just leave it at the 25th then and I will --8 9 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Yes, but you understand that that's when it's going to be if we 10 set if for that because there's going to be a public 11 notice that goes out and it's going to be legally 12 binding. 13 14 MS. HOBLIN: For the 25th? 15 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: That's correct. 16 MS. HOBLIN: I'm just going to change my flight because I'm going be away the rest of 17 18 February. 19 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Okay. So, did I 20 make a motion to accept the -- okay. So much for a 21 little discussion. A motion to accept the 22 conditional use application and signage application for Crinoline Fashion Boutique, Limited. Do I have 23 24 a second? 25 MEMBER THOMAS: Second.

3 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: All in favor? MEMBER THOMAS: Aye. 4 5 MEMBER BURNS: Aye. ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Aye. Motion 6 7 carried. Motion to set the public hearing for January 25th, for this application. Do I have a 8 9 second? 10 MEMBER THOMAS: Second. 11 ACTIVE CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: All in favor? 12 MEMBER THOMAS: Aye. 13 MEMBER BURNS: Aye. 14 ACTIVE CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Aye. Motion 15 carried. Do I have a second? 20 MEMBER THOMAS: Second. ACTIVE CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: All those in 21 22 favor? 23 MEMBER THOMAS: Aye. 24 MEMBER BURNS: Aye. 25 ACTIVE CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: Aye. Motion

Item 21 Number six; motion to schedule the Planning Board 22 Regular Session meeting for 4:00 p.m. on February 1, 2018. Do I have a second? 23 24 MEMBER THOMAS: Second. 25 ACTING CHAIRPERSON GIVEN: All those in
