| 8  | arguments to why I am against this.       |
| 9  | It is a very complex issue for            |
| 10 | me. Firstly, I want to take off the       |
| 11 | table is that I am not against it because |
| 12 | I am worried about the competition.       |

| 14 | own niche because it is environmentally   |
| 15 | friendly.                                 |

| 8  | to be taking a jet ski into places where  |
| 9  | birds and mammals and creatures have been |
| 10 | living a very solitary life, you are      |
| 11 | interrupting all of that and that is      |
| 12 | important. Not to talk about the          |
| 13 | copepods and the plankton and the impact  |
| 14 | that it will have and does have.          |
| 15 | It is all written information             |
| 16 | available anywhere. On the small          |
| 17 | plankton and algae that sustain our       |
| 18 | oyster businesses now in the bay as well  |
| 19 | as making Peconic Bay considered by the   |
| 20 | Nature Conservancy one of the ten most    |
| 21 | beautiful places in the world.            |
| 22 | I want to refer the                       |
| 23 | committee here to the LWRP, if I can,     |
| 24 | Chapter 139. Now I know the LWRP has not  |
| 25 | been assigned on but I also know that the |

| 23 | Now, I'm business friendly. I             |
| 24 | have my own personal business. I am a     |
| 25 | small business man. So this is not about  |

| 24  | Now that the fishermen are increasing.    |
| 2.5 | Do we want to jeopardize this so one      |

| 22 | out at that time and people were not able |
| 23 | to stand up at a slower speed than idol   |
| 24 | and they started falling over. So         |
| 25 | Governor Pataki passed a law because      |

| 8  | the law.                                  |
| 9  | Also regard fueling up, I am not          |
| 10 | fueling if he was at the last meeting.    |
| 11 | I am not fueling up at anything with      |
| 12 | gas containers or using a launch and to   |
| 13 | haul them out of the water by trailer.    |
| 14 | They are being driven over to a gas dock  |
| 15 | at Shelter Island were other jet skis and |
| 16 | other vessels are and they are also       |
| 17 | registered as a boat of New York State.   |
| 18 | And there is no pollution. They           |
| 19 | are running cleaner now than any other    |
| 20 | boats that are out there on the market.   |
| 21 | There is three mufflers and there is a    |
| 22 | catalyst that has to be changed every ten |
| 23 | hours. That is a \$125 part.              |
| 24 | They are allowed on every                 |
| 25 | national lake in the United States now    |

| 3  | ultra low emissions. So they burn         |
| 4  | cleaner than any other boat that is out   |
| 5  | there. They are not two stroke any more.  |

| 7  | fumes. There is no clouds of smoke        |
| 8  | coming out of them. And they are whisper  |
| 9  | quite.                                    |
| 10 | Anybody that has done any                 |
| 11 | research or that has written anything     |
| 12 | that is new, that is 2017 knows that you  |
| 13 | barely could hear you can't even hear     |
| 14 | it run. They are whisper quite. There     |
| 15 | is no fumes coming out of them.           |
| 16 | The 1500 foot rule is you have to         |
| 17 | stay 1500 feet off the shore when you are |
| 18 | operating a PWC. You can't ride 500       |
| 19 | feet along the shore line where there is  |
| 20 | a swimming area. So the law states,       |
| 21 | Albany's law of New York State is 1500    |
| 22 | feet you have to stay off the shoreline.  |
| 23 | So that means you have to stay in the     |
| 24 | channel when going around Shelter Island. |
| 25 | Also, I am not going to any coves or      |

| 8   | off of the ruins 1500 feet off that       |

| 14  | is against the law. And I will be         |
| 15  | following the law by staying 1500 feet    |

| 19  | going in idol to the light buoys. And     |
| 20  | then when the ferries that have parked on |
| 21  | both sides that are letting cars out that |
| 22  | is when we are going to leave. And they   |
| 23  | follow me in a single file line. They     |
| 24  | stay 500 feet away from the instructor.   |
| 2.5 | That's me. And keep the same distance     |

| 3  | accidents. And also there is a fifteen    |

| 8  | putting my hands up and letting them know |
| 9  | to go to idol and that is at four miles   |
| 10 | an hour off the throttle and they have to |
| 11 | wait until both ferries are parked on     |

| 13 | through the channel and we are staying in |
| 14 | the channel markers.                      |
| 15 | And also jet skis that are the            |
| 16 | PWC are allowed in Sag Harbor. There is   |
| L7 | no ban in Sag Harbor. There is no ban in  |
| 18 | Greenport. The only ban is in Montauk.    |
| 19 | Okay. And Three Mile Harbor and           |
| 20 | Aquaponic. And the law is if you power,   |
| 21 | you tow out by a boat that is what        |
| 22 | Uihlein's Marina does in Montauk. They    |
| 23 | tow all their jet skis out of Montauk     |
| 24 | Harbor and they bring them out of the     |
| 25 | harbor and they bring them outside the    |

| 3  | their jet skis to let people bring their  |
| 4  | Wave Runners out. They go from buoy to    |

| 8  | staying with me in a group so nobody can  |
| 9  | get lost, loses their bearing. Nobody     |
| 10 | breaks down. They are always going to be  |

| 13 | and making sure that everybody is still   |
| 14 | okay and still keeping up.                |
| 15 | But that is the rule. You can             |
| 16 | paddle be towed out. I talked to Ed       |
| 17 | Michaels from East Hampton Town. If that  |
| 18 | was an issue I would be ticketed,         |
| 19 | multiple tickets. I have been jet skiing  |
| 20 | for fifteen years now. And I have been    |
| 21 | launching and I have been paddling out of |
| 22 | Clearwater Beach. That is where I am      |
| 23 | from. I have not received one ticket.     |
| 24 | I met with Ed Michaels. I had a           |
| 25 | meeting with him. He says he has no       |

| 3  | Clearwater or using the facilities and    |
| 4  | leaving out of the harbor. Ed Michaels    |

| 7  | building over in Mitchell Park. I talked  |
| 8  | to him. He said he was going to send an   |
| 9  | e-mail to the Board and explain to them   |
| 10 | that he is fine with everything. I had a  |
| 11 | 20 minute meeting with him and he said he |
| 12 | will talk to everybody that he needs to   |
| 13 | and get a hold of and let them know       |
| 14 | that he is fine with everything.          |
| 15 | And the town attorney just wanted         |
| 16 | to make sure that I have on the bottom of |
| 17 | the insurance certificate that he is      |
| 18 | co-insured. That the Town of Greenport    |
| 19 | is co-insured at the bottom of my         |
| 20 | insurance certificate. And also I have    |
| 21 | Preston's Dock co-insured at the bottom   |
| 22 | of my insurance certificate. So if there  |
| 23 | is if someone trips Preston's is not      |
| 24 | liable. It goes under my insurance.       |
| 25 | The gentleman from The Glory              |

| 3  | the ultra low emissions and they are      |
| 4  | allowed in every national park and lake.  |
| 5  | And if that was the case regarding        |

| 9  | Thank you. And if anybody else            |
| 10 | needs to come up I'll answer any more     |
| 11 | questions.                                |
| 12 | MR. BERSON: Yes. I would like             |
| 13 | to respond to that.                       |
| 14 | First of all, I am glad that you          |
| 15 | clarified that it was 1988 that Governor  |
| 16 | Pataki passed the law. You see, I didn't  |
| 17 | know that it was that long ago. So as     |
| 18 | early as 1988 the government gave         |
| 19 | municipalities permission. It is true     |
| 20 | what the gentleman says about the two     |
| 21 | strokes versus four strokes, but I have   |
| 22 | done my research and here is the reality: |
| 23 | The two strokes would give on 10 gallons  |
| 24 | of gasoline and oil, mixed together, they |
| 25 | would lose about three gallong 33 and     |

| 3  | true because of the lobbying for places   |

| 8  | skis only drop of gallon and a quarter    |
| 9  | for a ten gallon trip. And I have done    |
| 10 | my research.                              |
| 11 | Also let's talk about noise.              |
| 12 | Noise travels or sound I should say       |
| 13 | four time faster in the water than it     |
| 14 | does in the air. So what we are talking   |
| 15 | about is mitigating the noise in the air. |
| 16 | But let's think about the fish. Let's     |
| 17 | think about the economic well being of    |
| 18 | Peconic bay. Fish have already been       |
| 19 | shown and why do we care about fish?      |
| 20 | Ask the commercial fisherman. Ask the     |
| 21 | fly fisherman out here. All of whom are   |
| 22 | against this by the way. Why do we care   |
| 23 | about the fish? Because the fish          |
| 24 | hemorrhage when they get exposed to large |
| 25 | sound, loud sounds in the water. Also     |

| 3  | in the water. It also travels four times  |
| 4  | a greater distance.                       |
| 5  | Every argument this gentleman             |

| 9  | Hampton? Why, if Sag Harbor allows you    |
| 10 | to do this, you are not operating out of  |
| 11 | Sag Harbor?                               |
| 12 | And who, by the way, is the               |
| 13 | Harbor Master of Greenport? I know of     |
| 14 | no person who is the Harbor Master. I     |
| 15 | know of people who work in Mitchell Park. |
| 16 | But could you give me the name of the     |
| 17 | Harbor Master?                            |
| 18 | MR. HOFFMAN: I spoke to the               |
| 19 | Harbor Master.                            |
| 20 | MR. BERSON: Who and what is his           |
| 21 | or her name?                              |
| 22 | MR. HOFFMAN: He has e-mailed the          |
| 23 | Board.                                    |
| 24 | MR. BERSON: Can anybody on the            |

You can't. 5 Even our first season at the end 6 7 of the season -- I crossed paths with Dave and probably the only time had him 8 9 mad at me was because I had the same 10 fueling issues that he had. And I started fueling with fuel cans on the 11 12 dock because I didn't have a choice and I 13 wanted to stay in business. It is not 14 legal. It is not what I should have been 15 doing. And that is why after the first 16 year I moved. 17 So all of these issues that come up I have faced and I have dealt with 18 19 first hand. All of those issues lead me to leave that dock after the first year 20 21 and seek out a marina space that allows growing safely. That really is why I am 22 23 adamantly opposed to this being here. Because I don't need this. My business 24 25 is a mile and a half down the road.
