## Regular Meeting August 26, 2013

1	MAYOR NYCE: I will call this Regular
2	Meeting of the Village of Greenport Board of
3	Trustees to order. Please stand for the
4	Pledge of Allegiance.
5	(Whereupon, all stood for the Pledge
6	of Allegiance, followed by a moment of
7	silence.)
8	MAYOR NYCE: This is the August Regular
9	Session for the Board of Trustees for the
10	Village of Greenport. We have a couple of
11	announcements tonight. The first is, the next
12	brush pick-up will be on September 3rd. The
13	next announcement, to be discussed is for the
14	public interest, we discussed at the work
15	session. I would like to read a letter that
16	some of you may have received in the mail with

your billing statement. And then I will give another brief explanation similar to the one that I gave at the work session. Billing information from the Village of Greenport Electric Department. This notice provides information on changes in your Purchased Power Adjustment, beginning with this month's bill. The operations of the Village's Electric Department have not changed and the base rates

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are remaining the same. However, certain
long-term transmission contracts will expire
on October 31, 2013. Similar contracts, used
in delivery of your purchased power, are more
expensive. These contracts are necessary to
protect the Electric Department's customers
from the high transmission costs caused by the
State's deregulated market for electricity.

Beginning in August of 2013, the
Purchase Power Adjustment will increase your
bulls for a 28-month period. In an effort to
ease the impact on our ratepayer's, the end

13	result is a cost "pass through" with an
14	expected average monthly billing increase for
15	the next 28 months of: \$7.75 t0 \$10.69 per
16	month for our residential customers and \$25.12
17	to \$39.77 per month for our commercial
18	customers. We are continuing to work with the
19	New York Power Authority to identify other
20	options to help ease this burden on our
21	electric customers. Thank you for your
22	confidence and continued support.
23	With that read, what I would like to
24	start by saying is that we're continuing to
25	work with the New York Power Authority on this

1	item. They're our regulator. We're
2	continuing to work with them. In October of
3	2013 the Village had transmission contracts
4	with several entities to upstage to us. Those
5	contracts were due to expire in October.
6	Those contracts were negotiated along time
7	ago. They cover the cost of that electricity.

8	And electricity costs fluctuates based on
9	certain factors. One of the being congestion.
10	Over the last couple of years these agencies
11	have offered what's called a fix TCC or a
12	fixed price for a transmission congestion
13	charge. As our contracts were coming due, the
14	Village was offered the opportunity to buy
15	into a fixed TCC opportunity rather than
16	staying with the transmissions the way it was.
17	Which would congestion charges and etcetera,
18	etcetera. We had both financial and legal
19	consultants look into this for us. Legal
20	being Dunkin, Gengsler and Weinberg and
21	Bollam, Sheedy and Torani our financial
22	advisors. What the, advised to us was that
23	this hedge in congestion charges was a good
24	idea. It was done by other municipalities.
25	It's much success. Given the opportunity to

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do so, it was a good hedge against -
particularly summer-time peak congestion

charges. In February of this year, we entered

into a contract with New York Power Authority and our other transmission authorities agencies, to purchase pre-purchase these fixed rate TCC's. I say pre-purchase because the fixed rate for the transmission congestion charges were purchased a year in advance and then that is your fixed transmission charge for the year. When this happened in January, we went to the New York Power Authority said we don't have the cash to do this. We need the cash in our account for our working capital and for capital improvements. They said in order to get the contract done, pay the first 25% and we will begin to work with you to figure out a way to recuperate the additional 75% before October 31st, when the final payment is due, which is what we did by RESOLUTION in January of this year. We authorized the contract to be executed and by February we paid that first 25%. Long story short, we had not gotten a satisfactory story with how to recuperate with the New York Power

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1	Authority. So the Village went back to it's
2	financial and legal consultants. We had
3	contended all along that transmission charges
4	are recoupable through the power purchase
5	adjustment portion of the ratepayer's bill.
6	We were reassured that by both legal and
7	financial. So we have begun to recoup that
8	money through here. What we have done is
9	spread it out amongst a 28 month period. That
10	will what will happen is, over the next
11	several months, the old transmission charges
12	that had been in there will drop off as of
13	October 31st, and then we will be paying this
14	year's transmission charges and beginning to
15	collect for the prepayment of the following
16	year. This will normalize back to a fairly
17	regular bill after the 28 month period. The
18	problem in this first year, we have to prepay
19	those transmission charges. So there is that
20	little bit of spike. So we're spreading that
21	over those months. Again, we have been

reassured by legal and financial that we can
do so. We're not increasing rates. We're
increasing our PPA which we're entitled to do
our tariff's. We're not self regulating.

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1 We're not doing anything that we're not 2 supposed to be doing. I believe that is what 3 I covered during the work session. I would encourage anyone that has a question about 4 5 this, to please contact Village Hall. 6 Everyone in Village Hall is well versed in 7 what's going on. They can help you through the process. So please be aware that those 8 9 are average numbers. They should be within 10 those numbers. With that, we have -- under 11 next on our agenda. We have public hearing applications that were postponed for this 12 13 month for lack of information. At this point, the applications are not complete. Which 14 15 brings us to the public portion of the agenda. I will ask if there is anyone from the public 16 17 that wishes to address the Board.

18	MR. BERGSON: My name is David Bergson
19	and I run Glory. And I have been running a
20	childhood foundation called Glory Going Races
21	for 2011, a 501C3.
22	MAYOR NYCE: Just your address for the
23	record.
24	MR. BERGSON: Okay. For the record, my
25	address 508 Sterling Place. Anyway, I just

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wanted to give the Board of Trustees an assessment of what we have done this summer. We have been running an eight week school free program for the fifth graders aboard the Glory one hour a week, with myself and Meg Bennett, Diane Asler. We have done this for free. We have done repeated school programs for science for free. We're going to start our October program again, and I would like to ask the Village for their indulgence so we could use the schoolhouse again. Last year our program was supposed to run two months. It ended up

13	running six months. I would like to run 9:00	
14	to 10:30. I would like to run later because I	
15	would like to sleep later, but I can't. So I	
16	would like to say from 9:00 to 11:00, if we	
17	could use the school house once again for the	
18	children of the community every Saturday	
19	morning. I would be much oblige and they	
20	would be as well.	
21	MAYOR NYCE: October through?	
22	MR. BERGSON: Last year we went through	
23	October 26th through Memorial Day.	
24	MAYOR NYCE: Okay.	
25	TRUSTEE MURRAY: Dave, I have a	
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1	question for you? Are you funded for this	
2	program or are you still needing assistance?	
3	MR. BERGSON: If I were to say I needed	
4	assistance, it would be a grave	

understatement. In fact, if anyone here has
any wear with all they would like to spend for
a tax deductible 501C3, I would be much

8 oblige. No. Funding is much appropriated to

9	do these projects. It can't be done without
LØ	it. I try and keep an arm's length distance
L1	from everybody in the Village so that no one
L2	can turnaround and say that I am getting
L3	favored treatment or anything. If anyone has
L4	any ideas for helping raise money for any of
L5	these school programs, I would be much oblige.
L6	I appreciate it. If we could have that, we
L7	could start planning our programs now. Thank
L8	you.
L9	MAYOR NYCE: Thank you.
20	MR. TASK: Good evening, Mr. Mayor and
21	Members of the Board. I am here on a very
22	good opportunity
23	MAYOR NYCE: Name and address for the
24	record, please.
25	MR. TASK: Arthur Task, 17 Beach Street
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in Greenport. My fellow residents on Sandy

Beach are all very pleased to learn that the

Village is finally taking some concrete steps

4	to provide sewer service to Sandy Beach and
5	the Beach Road area. We have been waiting for
6	it for 70 years. I can remember in 1945, that
7	several of us in 1945 burned the outhouses on
8	Sandy Beach during the war. So all I can say
9	is that we hope that the RESOLUTION that will
10	be passed be respectively passed tonight.
11	So that the Village will provide service. I
12	can say when they come over there, they will
13	be met with a brass band and every resident on
14	Sandy Beach with a checkbook on their hand.
15	Thank you very much.
16	MAYOR NYCE: Thank you. Is there
17	anyone else that wishes to address the Board?
18	MR. SALADINO: John Saladino, 6th
19	Street. Are there any RESOLUTION's not on the
20	agenda?
21	MAYOR NYCE: There are SEQRA
22	RESOLUTION's that go along with the grants and
23	bonding RESOLUTION's that the Village Attorney
24	provided for us after the agenda was complete.
25	And Trustee Phillips has wording for one of

- 1 the agenda items that has to do with the
- 2 bonding.
- 3 MR. SALADINO: I have a question about
- 4 a couple of the RESOLUTION's. RESOLUTION #15,
- 5 is you're going to adopt a negative
- 6 declaration for Clark's Beach Green Energy
- 7 Park. And the RESOLUTION says that you're
- 8 applying for a grant for a planning and
- 9 feasibility study. But the SEQRA report says
- 10 that you have reviewed the completion of the
- 11 proposed feasibility study. I am not sure I
- 12 understand. I am reading from your document.
- 13 Whereas, the Board of Trustees of the Village
- of Greenport has reviewed the completion of
- 15 the proposed feasibility study. So I am just
- 16 confused how you're applying for it --
- 17 MAYOR NYCE: You should read the grant
- 18 application. You should not read the
- 19 feasibility study. There is no feasibility
- study.
- 21 MR. SALADINO: Well, you can understand
- I would not know that because I am reading

14	when we get to it. I'm sorry, I didn't mean	
15	to cut you off. I had too much coffee today.	
16	MR. SALADINO: And I hadn't had enough	
17	or else I would be interrupting. But just as	

from this document.

18	a comment, MBE is minority and WBE is women.
19	Just so I am on the same page. I am just not
20	sure why it says for the Village to incur.
21	The Village is looking for a waiver because to
22	do business with a minority group or a women's
23	group, it would cost them 194%. Could you
24	explain to us what business the Village is
25	doing?

MAYOR NYCE: It has to do with the

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2 grant for the sewer and water runoff project 3 at both Manor Place and Fifth Street. I will 4 clarify that. 5 MR. SALADINO: That is good that you're going to explain it but in all fairness --6 MAYOR NYCE: I will explain it now to 7 8 you. 9 MR. SALADINO: The last thing that I 10 would ask, I was at last month's Village Board Meeting and I asked a question of the Board 11 12 and Trustee Hubbard was nice enough to respond 13 that he didn't know and he was going to get me

14	information. And he actually did. I am not
15	comfortable calling someone at work or calling
16	their home. So I was wondering if you could,
17	just for the benefit
18	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: Sure. Yes. It had
19	to do with a dock permit or a dock lease on
20	the Railroad Dock was his question. And I did
21	not have the answer at the time, and I asked
22	about it. The lease is for a long-term use.
23	So that they're basing a business of the dock.
24	A permit is just someone that is using it on
25	and off. Like a fishing boat is there on and

off and not using it all the time. Not running a business there. That is why they have a permit for it. A lease, Peconic Starr, the FIREBOAT, will be permanently based there and where they will be running their operation out of. That was the explanation that I had gotten on that, John.

MR. SALADINO: Okay. So the only

9	criteria is the length of time that somebody
10	spends at the time of the dock. So to
11	eliminate any confusion with the MTA and the
12	County, it would seem that all the Village
13	would have to do is change the word lease to
14	permit. And just draw a permit that specifies
15	yearly or two years. But thanks.
16	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: Sure.
17	MR. SALADINO: I had something else but
18	I know Billy is chopping in.
19	MAYOR NYCE: Is there anyone else that
20	wishes to address the Board?
21	MR. SWISKEY: William Swiskey, 184
22	Fifth Street, Greenport. Before I get into
23	what I you told John, a permit is for a
24	year at the dock, right? It's a permanent
25	thing?

1	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: It's renewed yearly
2	MR. SWISKEY: All right. And the only
3	difference between a permit and say I wanted
4	to put a excursion boat at the dock for a

year, could you then issue me a permit and I
wouldn't have to have a lease? Because that
was my understanding of what was just said.

Perhaps I am a little slow at the uptake but
that is what I just heard. So you could issue
the FIREBOAT a permit for one year and he
could go to the dock because after that you
can tell him to leave or he can apply for a
permit again. Now, that is what I got out of
that whole thing.

MAYOR NYCE: My understanding Bill, and the Village Attorney can correct me if I am wrong, it had to do with the intent of the use. Fishing boats are by their nature, transient. They're not at sea. They have a permit at several different docks throughout there. An excursion boat does not. An excursion boat will come back to the same dock all the time, therefore it would have a permanent location. It has to do with the intent of the use. The FIREBOAT is not

- looking for a permit. They do not intend to
  be at several different docking spaces. They
- 3 intend to be at this dock.
- 4 MR. SWISKEY: Still doesn't make much
- 5 sense to me and I got other things that I
- 6 wanted to talk about. Just one other thing,
- 7 since we're on the subject. It's probably
- 8 costing us, that 140 foot that that FIREBOAT
- 9 takes up at the marina -- and I have been
- 10 doing the calculations and we can rent that
- space for three days a week, basically it's
- costing us about \$1500.00 a week to be there.
- 13 It has been there for three months. That's a
- 14 significant amount of money. What do we plan
- to do with the FIREBOAT because it's really
- 16 costing the taxpayers a lot of money.
- 17 MAYOR NYCE: It hasn't cost the
- 18 taxpayers a dime as of yet.
- 19 MR. SWISKEY: What? We couldn't rent
- 20 that 140 foot space? He's lying --
- 21 MAYOR NYCE: That's the answer.
- Doesn't make it wrong. If it's space that we

24	MR. SWISKEY: It's sitting	
25	MAYOR NYCE: If you don't like the	
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1	answer, it doesn't make the answer wrong.	
2	MR. SWISKEY: It doesn't make your	
3	answer right either. Enough said. Skipping	
4	ahead. We have one RESOLUTION here	
5	establishing now you know, when certain	
6	Trustees were running for office and I said	
7	they only worked 20 hours a month and they	
8	really shouldn't have any hospitalization.	
9	Well, it seems now we have Trustees that are	
10	jumping into the retirement system and who are	
11	acknowledging by their own thing that they're	
12	only working 20 hours a week. Mary Bess, I am	
13	speaking, please.	
14	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Since you're such a	
15	gentleman of wanting straight truth, there is	
16	your answer and the information that goes	
17	along with it.	
18	MR. SWISKEY: I see there is credit	

needed, it would be gone.

here with the New York State Retirement System for 20 hours a month for two Trustees. What I said was the average. So you take approximately \$12,000.00 of salary Trustees receive, and you take the \$22,000.00 worth of family benefits because that is not only medical, that's dental and optical, which the

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1 average Trustee pays about \$50 bucks a month 2 towards it. It's probably what the -- Village 3 picks up the majority on a Tier 4 or 5 retiree, so basically the Village is probably 4 5 picking up two to three grand a year for these people to belong to the retirement system. 6 7 When you do all the math -- you can shake your 8 head, George, it's simply math. \$125.00 an 9 hour for part-time Trustees. That's what it amounts to. Do the math yourself. You don't 10 11 have to believe me. We did the math today. I 12 was shocked. Plus, we have a treasurer here 13 who works one day a month and we're

contributing to her retirement. Do you
realize what can happen? Any of these people
you're the last public employer. If these
people get retire and get vested in the system
and they retire by state law, if it's a
single person, you're going to have to pay 50%
of their hospitalization costs or 35% for a
family. And that's the law. I mean, so this
could be this is just outrageous. I mean,
I have been coming to the Village Board
meetings forever. And I have known all the
Trustees and nobody ever did this. This is

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just like -- you're stealing from people. I think you should really just look into it. All right. I have a next item on here. You have a bond resolution attached. You're going to spend another million dollars in the light plant. Half the stuff don't work right now. It hasn't worked since you took it apart last June. You're going back to the same engineer. And by the way, is there a Board RESOLUTION 

hiring him again for this new project because
I don't seem to recall one? I go to every
work session and every Board meeting, and I
mean, this guy just stuck it too you real big
time. You know, he spent all your money. He
took your money. He got crap and now you're
going to hire him again? I saw that list of
projects that he had. I actually FOILED for
it. Nobody ever looked at it. There was
nothing on there. What projects do you want
to specifically do? I heard the Mayor say
"come back to us with a list, Bob." No, he
works for you. You tell him. "I want this
done and this done." I haven't seen that.
That is no way to run a business. You can
smile at it but that's about the stunidest wa

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to run a business I have ever seen. I have some experience in this. I just don't buy it. It's unbelievable to me. Anyway lets get back to this -- what you don't call a rate hike and

5 I call a rate hike. Now, you just said something else here at the beginning of this 6 7 transmission. You said that these are congestion charges. Are those congestion 8 9 charges above our normal costs? Because that's what you said. 10 11 MAYOR NYCE: No. That's what you 12 heard. 13 MR. SWISKEY: The audience heard. But 14 maybe I am mistaken. What were our 15 transmission costs last year? Does anybody 16 know before anyone votes on this? They 17 weren't any where near that because I get the papers every month. You're going to be almost 18 doubling your transmission costs here. I 19 would advise you until at least the Power 20 21 Authority rules on the complaint that has been 22 made and is in their hands and gives you

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permission to do this, I would vote to table

Authority comes back and says no, you can't do

this. Because all you do -- if the Power

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this. You're going to have to pay that money
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- back. It's just -- I mean, it's not good
- business. It's -- I would urge any Trustee
- 4 that really cares to say, hey, let's hold off
- 5 on this until we get a final determination
- from the Power Authority that we can do this.
- 7 Because believe it or not, there are certain

- 9 in the PPA. And your lawyer will tell you
- 10 anything. You pay him. Lawyers have been

- it's what your regulator says and that's what
- 13 it is. I just don't understand it. And for
- these women and minorities, 194%? Come on.
- We have all been through these contracts

- 18 that. That's not a reasonable explanation at
- 19 all. In fact. Governor Cuomo was basically

MAYOR NYCE: Okay. With that, I will answer a couple of questions. In response to

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that, Mr. Winkler, we allowed the FIREBOAT to
come here on a temporary dockage basis while
asking the County for an interpretation. The
County has been dragging it's feet for almost
a year. And we still haven't gotten a
straight answer. At no point did we promise
the FIREBOAT dockage. At no point, did we say
they could be there full-time. As I recall,
they could be there from winter of last year,
with the stipulation where we had room, that
they could not stay there and that we would be
asking the County for an interpretation prior
to a license or sublicense on the commercial
dock. To make sure that we can do that. So
we did not bring a boat here not knowing where
it's going to go. We gave them a temporary
dockage with the idea that we would ask the
County for an interpretation. And that is
where this is. As far as the other ones, we

will be getting to them as the RESOLUTION's
come up. I will go through them quickly. The
grant application with the SEQRA. I will ask
the Village Attorney to look at that. That
should be just for the grant application and
not for the project itself. For the home

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1	court, RESOLUTION, no there is no cost
2	associated with hat. This RESOLUTION is just
3	to allow the Tall Ships America know that
4	we're interested and everything else would be

We're looking at a waiver to subsequent that bid. It does not mean that it's going to be granted. It allowed under the law because it's under the threshold. I hope that explains that. The other one is RESOLUTION #5. Establishes a standard work day. It does not say that anyone is going to work six hours a day. The New York State

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RESOLUTION every year that sets a standard work day. In order to do that, part-time, a standard work day is six hours. That's all that it's doing. The other thing that everyone else should know that is that if you work for ten consecutive years, and to pay into the pension program you cannot recover from the program. So Mr. Swiskey, yes, your math is always shocking to me too.

11	MR. SWISKEY: Yes, just shocking.

I still feel that we're getting much closer to this. I am a fan of this proposal. I think we need it in the Village. We heard from many of you that -- there was one gentleman who was speaking, I will not say his name but he is exactly who we need this permit for. He doesn't want us in his apartments and I think we need this to protect the citizens of Greenport. I know there is a lot of people who don't like this but need this for the Village. We need to be able to get in there and make sure this is safe. So I am in favor of moving this forward. That is my stand.

TRUSTEE HUBBARD: All right. My feeling on it, we have laws on the book and we

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1	overall package of the rental law is going to
2	be hard to enforce. It's going to be costly.
3	I don't know if we have the manpower and the
4	people to do it. I think we should follow the
5	laws on the books. I think this should be a
6	year round thing. I think it needs more work.
7	That is my opinion on it.
8	MAYOR NYCE: Trustee Robbins?

10	support this law. I have experience in the
11	building issues for many years and now working
12	as a realtor, I am aware of the fact that

17	those that are seconded homeowner. When
18	you're a primary homeowner, the Building

Department is going to come in and regulate.

They are going to inspect your house. Even though I am aware of the housing codes of the Village, I feel that we do need a uniform rental law to encompass all of these things.

I do believe there is some language in here that needs to be defined. I do not believe

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there should be imprisonment. But I
absolutely support the spirit of the law and I
hope that we can continue to do a few minor
changes. Thank you.

MAYOR NYCE: Thank you.

TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: As being part of the code committee and discussing this, questions were asked, we already have code on the books in the State of New York. Are we enforcing that now? The second question was how are e going to pay for this? What plan of action are we going to take? Our Building Department has been struggling since I was first elected many years ago, I had proposed to the Mayor and the Board that we should come up with a

16	plan of action. This is just going to add to
17	the stresses. I do have a problem with some
18	of the definitions. One of the problems I
19	have is the Licensing Review Board. I do
20	agree with Trustee Hubbard. I understand and
21	I have been around the Village and being a
22	Chair for the ZBA, I saw a lot. I do believe
23	there should be a responsibility on the
24	property owner and the tenant or tenants. I
25	think there should be a compromise to that. I

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think that people should take pride in their
home. We have a very diverse community.
That's all I have to say.

MAYOR NYCE: Thank you. I appreciate the the comments. I really do. I appreciate the process of this. That this started four years ago where it was brought up the idea. It has gone through Code Committee once and sent back. At this point, I think we have a fairly good piece of it. I agree with the

imprisonment. I looked through this again
