It helps the taxpayers. 15 The entire Village kind of loses out. There 16 17 are some businesses that benefit from that. You know, the dry cleaners. They don't profit 18 as do the restaurants. So the tax payers 19 20 should get some of the profit. The resident

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21 tax payers that aren't business owners, that 22 don't have a restaurant or a bar. They should 23 get something. The last thing, is if we can 24 believe Bill, and he does have your document 25 from the Village, and I am not sure if you
