14	anything to anyone, Bill, there were
15	several things found as part of the

17	don't crack like that, something
18	dynamically happened to it to you
19	have been running it for tests for
20	years, even under the previous
21	administration, previous engineer and
22	previous in other words, this water
23	problem never showed up, now it shows
24	up. Something happened to that engine.
