2 Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 (Whereupon, the meeting was called 3 to order at 7:00 p.m.) 4 MAYOR HUBBARD: I'll call the 5 meeting to order. 6 Pledge to the flag. 7 (Whereupon, all stood for the 8 Pledge of Allegiance.) 9 MAYOR HUBBARD: Please remain 10 standing for a moment of silence for 11 William Haring Hamilton, Lilian Marie 12 Wallace, James Dinizio, Sr., and 13 Margaret Bishop Brehmer. 14 (Whereupon, all remained standing 15 for a moment of silence.) 16 MAYOR HUBBARD: Okay. 17 We have a couple of announcements. 18 The Village's offices will be 19 closed on February 15, 2016 in 20 observance of Presidents' Day. 21 The annual Tax Sale well be held 22 on March 8, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. at 23 Village Hall. 24 The liquor license applications, 25 we have a renewal application for Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

That's posted. 4 Anybody who wants to make comments, you 5 can send them to the Liquor Authority. 6 The next order of business is a 7 presentation from Bill Freitag from 8 SaxBST, our auditors. 9 I hand it over to you, Bill. 10 MR. FREITAG: Okay. 11 My name is Bill Freitag. I'm a 12 partner with the accounting firm of 13 SaxBST, and I want to thank you for the 14 opportunity to present the audited 15 financial statements for year ending 16 May 31, 2015. 17 I don't know if you have one in 18 front of you, the audited financial 19 statement. If you don't, I'm going to 20 briefly go over the results of 21 operation of all your operating funds 22 for the year. 23 Can everyone hear me okay? 24 Okay. 25 The financial statement is a very Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 large document. It's about fifty pages long, so obviously we're not going to go through that in its entirety. I'm just going to give you some of the brief bullet points related to the financial statement.

8 We were here back in July to do 9 the electric funds portion of the 10 Village, and then in September we came 11 down again to finish up the rest of the 12 Village and perform what's called a 13 single light. A single light is 14 related to your federal program 15 maintained by the Village.

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16 During September and October, we 17 worked with the Treasurer's Department 18 to wrap up various items that were 19 still outstanding when we left in 20 September, but financial statements 21 were issued to the Treasurer's 22 Department in draft form on October 16, 23 2015 which is a very similar timeframe 24 as the prior year's audit and certainly 25 a lot quicker than it had been in Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 previous years before 2014. 3 After review and approval by the 4 Village and the Board, the financial 5 statements were issued on December 1, 6 2015 and during December your financial 7 statements were submitted to the 8 federal government to meet your 9 compliance requirements under the HUD 10 Grant. 11 The New York Power Authority and 12 the report for your electric utility 13 was filed on time, that was by August 14 31, 2015. It has already been reviewed 15 by the New York Power Authority, and 16 one of the things that we are doing on 17 our trip here this week is, we're 18 working on the New York Power Authority 19 report for the six-month period ending 20 November 30, 2015. The Power Authority 21 had asked while the capital improvement 22 plan was going on, that you furnish 23 them on a six-month basis with your 24 financial reporting. 25 Okay. Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 With regards to the May 31, 2015 3 audit and the financial statements, we 4 performed a financial audit of the 5 Village and also a compliance audit 6 related to the Village's internal 7 controls and compliance with its 8 federal program which is the Section 8 9 housing program issued by HUD. 10 We issued -- as a result of our 11 audit, we were able to issue what is 12 called an unqualified opinion, it's 13 also known as a clean opinion and it's 14 the highest level of assurance you can 15 get on financial statements from an 16 independent auditor. 17 Okay. So no changes from prior 18 year, so that's a clean audit opinion 19 unqualified. 20 The financial statements were 21 prepared in accordance with general 22 accepted accounting principals for 23 governmental entities, it's also known 24 as GAP. 25 As with most audits, we did make Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 some adjustments to your accounting to 3 records. The effect of our audit 4 adjustments on the Village as a whole 5 were quite insignificant. As a matter 6 of fact, it was probably the least 7 amount of adjustments we made in the 8 last four or five years, and certainly 9 in terms of dollar adjustments it was 10 the least amount of dollar adjustments 11 we made to your financial records. So 12 basically what that's saying to you is 13 since there wasn't a lot of significant 14 dollar adjustments during the course of 15 the year, you can rely upon the 16 financial information that you're 17 getting from the Treasurer's office on 18 a month-to-month basis. Okay. As a result of our audit on the 19 20 financial statement and our audit of 21 compliance with the Village's federal 22 programs, we did not identify any 23 significant deficiencies or material 24 grievances in the Village's internal 25 control over financial compliance Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 reporting. So basically what that is saying is, your internal control and your safeguards that underline your accounting records are operating properly and effective to safeguard the Village's assets.

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8 As with most audits, however, we 9 did make certain observations that if 10 you considered to implement them, it 11 could increase the Village's operations 12 and procedures. We issued a letter 13 along with our financial statements 14 which was addressed to the Board. Α 15 couple of things we talked about, and 16 we're not going to go over them in 17 detail, but some things that we did 18 talk about was what we would like you 19 to consider in regards to some of the 20 sewer connection fees that you received 21 during last year and in the upcoming 22 year to use those for infrastructure 23 repairs and upgrades. We talked about 24 an updated tracking system for the 25 water fund inventory items. We talked Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 about monitoring and doing an analysis of various different fund balances. 3 We 4 talked about monitoring the financial 5 health of the Housing Authority, and we 6 also talked a little bit about a 7 long-term approach to reviewing the 8 operations of the water fund and the 9 sewer fund from an operating and budget 10 standpoint. 11 Those were all issued to you, and 12 if you wanted to look at those further 13 and get further insight on that, you 14 can refer to the letter that was issued 15 at the end of the report. 16 In regards to the financial 17 statements, we will take the three 18 enterprise funds first, the electric, the water and the sewer and just 19 20 briefly talk about those. 21 The electric fund had a very 22 strong year in 2015. It appears that 23 the rates that were put in place in 24 2007, so we're working on eight years 25 of new rates, have allowed the electric Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 fund to stabilize from an operational perspective. It also allowed you to invest in your plant as part of the \$5-and-a-half million capital plan to renovate your distribution system and the generating plant, and it also allowed you to have cash flow to pay down various debt. The electric fund produced a net income of about \$570,000 in 2015, and that was about \$4 million of total That net income, when you revenue. divide that out by the value of the plant, comes out to about a nine percent rate of return, and that rate of return, which is used by the Power Authority to design rates in the future, they like you to be in a rate of return range of between eight and

ten percent. You are currently at nine

percent, so you are right in the middle

of that range, so your rates are not

only allowing you to operate

11 Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 to invest back into the plant, and it's 3 also allowing you to pay down debt 4 service and still establish cash 5 balances from various different 6 reserves, so the electric fund is doing 7 quite well. 8 Total cash balances at the end of 9 May 31, 2015. The electric utility was 10 about \$3.8 million. 11 Of that \$3.8 million, you have a 12 \$1 million depreciation reserve fund, 13 which is used for future capital 14 improvements. You had \$1.2 million of 15 unused bond proceeds which are going to 16 be used to continue the capital 17 improvement program that you have 18 going, which you're about seventy-five 19 percent through at this point in time. 20 You have about \$400,000 in a 21 reserve for a cost that's called 22 transmission congestion charges to help 23 with your winter and peeking bills, and 24 that's paid in -- the Power Authority 25 allows you to collect that money in Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 advance of the payments so, therefore, 3 you're putting that away in a reserve. 4 You're sitting on about \$700,000 5 of operating cash which represents 6 about three months of your normal 7 operations, which is exactly where the 8 Power Authority wants you to be. 9 So the rates that the Power 10 Authority designed way back in 2007 11 have allowed the electric utility to do 12 exactly what it was designed to do back 13 in 2007 as we sit here in 2015. So the 14 rates that are in place right now, 15 which is your base rates to your 16 customers are certainly holding true, 17 and my guess on a go-forward basis, 18 yeah, those rates probably will sustain 19 you for quite some more time. 20 Okay. 21 During 2015, electric fund also 22 invested about a guarter of a million 23 dollars in its plant. Most of those 24 improvements were made to the 25 substation and they're all part of the Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

13 Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 \$5-and-a-half million capital 3 improvement plan. 4 The electric fund also made a 5 distribution to your general fund of 6 \$88,000, so basically there was, like, 7 an upstream dividend to the general 8 fund from the profits of the electric 9 utility. 10 The debt of the electric fund is 11 all in bonds. You're at about 12 \$3-and-a-half million in debt. This is about \$200,000 less than the prior 13 14 year, and that was because of your 15 amortized pay-down schedule, and 16 those -- that debt will probably go 17 through, I think it's 2028. 18 Okay. 19 One of the things that we gave 20 you, and obviously that was a very 21 brief analysis, but back in September, 22 I wrote as byproduct of our preparing 23 the annual report to the Power 24 Authority, I wrote a letter to you, the 25 Board, about five-page letter that Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 basically did an in-depth analysis of the financial condition of the electric 3 4 utility, so if you want to learn more 5 about that, refer to that letter. Also 6 in that letter, we gave you a five-year 7 statistical analysis of various 8 different operational and financial 9 indications in a graph format to track 10 your time over the last five years and 11 to see the strength of your electric 12 utility, so I think if you want to 13 learn more about the electric utility, 14 that would be a good document to refer 15 to. 16 That's the electric Okay. 17 utility. 18 The waterfront. The waterfront 19 generated a net income of about \$6,000 20 on \$450,000 in revenue. Very similar 21 to the prior year. 22 Operating cash stands at \$660,000 23 at May 31, 2015, and if you did a 24 calculation of what that means in terms 25 of how much cash do you have on hand in Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 terms of months cash on hand, you're 3 basically sitting on about seventeen 4 months of operational cash; so, 5 basically, what that means is if you 6 went ahead and didn't collect another 7 penny, you could go seventeen months 8 based upon your normal trend of 9 operations, but a lot of those dollars 10 can be used for capital improvements 11 and renovations. 12 The waterfront has no debt. It's 13 your only fund that has no long-term 14 The fund balance at May 31, 2015 debt. 15 is \$1-and-one-half million of which 16 \$740,000 of that is unrestricted and 17 could be used for future budgets. 18 So the waterfront in general is 19 doing pretty well. 20 Sewer fund. The sewer fund 21 actually reported at \$300,000 net 22 operating loss in fiscal year 2015. 23 One of the reasons why this is 24 generating in that operating loss is 25 the depreciation expense on the sewer Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 funds plant and infrastructure is about 3 \$330,000 a year, and while that is not 4 a cash expense, it is a true economic 5 expense because it is the devaluation 6 of your -- of the plant, but if you 7 were to strip that out of the loss, you 8 actually have a net income on a cash 9 basis of about \$40,000, so cash-wise, 10 the sewer fund is still doing quite 11 well from a cash perspective. It's the 12 depreciation expense or the devaluated, 13 devaluing your system that is creating 14 the loss. 15 During 2015, you also received the 16 first installment of what I call a 17 one-shot revenue for sewer connection 18 charge. There was -- Peconic Landing, 19 I think it was. Okay. You receive the 20 next set of dollars in the next fiscal

I think one of the things that you want to do in the sewer fund though, on a go-forward basis because it's not regulated and you are in charge of Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

year, fiscal year 2016.

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Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 designing rates and you're in charge of 3 the burden of the operations of the 4 sewer fund, I think you just want to 5 make sure that the sewer rates on a 6 go-forward basis are accomplishing all 7 the things that you want it to 8 accomplish, like meeting the day-to-day 9 cost to operate the utility, also to 10 put away reserves or make capital 11 improvements and pay down debt. Sewer 12 funds debt at the end of the year was 13 about \$2.1 million, \$350,000 in bonds 14 and a million seven in State loans that 15 were related to the sewer project that 16 was completed a few years ago. 17 Operating cash balances total 18 about \$1.2 million. That includes the 19 sewer connection receipts that you got 20 right before the end of the fiscal 21 year. Your fund balance in the sewer 22 fund sits at about \$8.2 million at May 31, 2015; however, 7 million of that 23 24 \$8.2 million is actually, it's hung up 25 in the investment of the sewer plant,

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Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 in pipes and everything in the ground. The sewer fund does have an 3 4 unrestricted fund balance of about 5 \$1 million as of May 31st for future budgets, and also has \$185,000 in 6 7 reserves for capital improvements on a 8 qo-forward basis. 9 So those are your three enterprise 10 funds. 11 The last fund that I'm going to 12 talk about here is the general fund, 13 which is the Village's operational 14 fund. During 2015, the general fund 15 made a significant change in its 16 financial reporting. Effective June 1, 17 2014, the Village had changed its 18 accounting policy related to the 19 activities that were previously 20 reported in the recreation fund. 21 Okay. 22 On June 1, 2014, the recreation 23 fund ceased operations as it was known 24 from an accounting position, and all 25 its assets, liabilities and its Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 operations were transferred to the 3 general fund. The reason why this was 4 done was the recreation fund was partially supported by user charges, 5 6 the carousel, the ice rink; however, it 7 required annual transfers from the 8 general fund to not only help sustain 9 its operations but to pay off the debt 10 service of the bonds. 11 Due to significant support from 12 the general fund, management, you 13 determined that it would be more 14 appropriate to present the operation in 15 the rec fund in the general fund since 16 these activities were significantly 17 funded by the general fund. We agreed 18 with this change, and I think it 19 portrays a more realistic picture by 20 combining the two funds on what is 21 actually happening in between the 22 general fund and the former recreation 23 fund. 24 General funds operated at a 25 surplus in 2015 of \$42,000. Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 transferred for various different 3 capital improvements that were done in the capital projects fund. The general 4 5 fund transferred about \$600, 000 to the 6 capital projects fund for certain 7 paving projects and also infrastructure 8 improvements at the marina and Village 9 parks. 10 Okay. 11 In regards to how did the general 12 fund do in accordance with the budget 13 that you got adopted, on the revenue 14 side, you had a \$240,000 favorable 15 variance so that basically your revenue 16 was higher than what you originally 17 budgeted. Also you had a favorable 18 variance on your expense side by about 19 \$135,000, where your expenses actually 20 came in lower than what you budgeted. 21 That gave you a favorable overall 22 variance of \$376,000 which allowed you 23 to transfer money to the capital 24 projects fund without taking too much 25 of a hit in terms of cash. 21 1 Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 2 As of May 31, 2015, the general 3 fund has a \$3 million fund balance. \$2 4 million is restricted or earmarked for 5 capital improvements and future debt 6 service payments. \$1 million is 7 unrestricted and can be used for future 8 budgets, which you probably obviously 9 did when you put your 2016 fiscal year 10 budget together. 11 Over the past couple of years, the 12 unrestricted fund balance of the 13 general fund has grown, and it has 14 grown to a position where it has placed 15 the general fund in a pretty solid 16 footing in regards to financial 17 position. One of the suggestions that 18 we have made to management in a recent 19 letter to you was that you may want to 20 consider enhancing some of your 21 reserves in regards to that 22 unrestricted fund balance, such as, and 23 this is just things for you to 24 consider, maybe even a tax 25 stabilization fund or certainly an Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 infrastructure replacing the reserve. 3 The reason why you want to do that 4 is because your fund balance, 5 unrestricted fund balance is trending 6 up, if the New York State Comptroller's 7 office were to come in, they would 8 probably say that, you know, what are 9 you doing with this money and maybe, 10 therefore, you setting up reserves 11 would earmark the money, and you 12 wouldn't have any adverse condition 13 from the Comptroller's office, but the 14 general fund is in very good shape, 15 good health. 16 A few last items that we're 17 required to talk to you about is 18 because you hold both taxpayers' and 19 ratepayers' money in trust, all your 20 cash deposits at May 31, 2015 were 21 fully collateralized by either FDIC 22 insurance or government securities that 23 were pledged by your bank, so basically 24 what that's saying is, if the bank 25 holding your cash were to ever, in a Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

1 Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 2 situation like we had years ago in 2008 3 with some of the smaller banks, you 4 would be fully collateralized for the 5 security and the deposits would not be 6 harmed. 7 Total debt of the Village is 8 sitting at about \$11.6 million and 9 that's all across your funds. That is 10 made up of \$7 million in bonds, \$1.7 11 million in State loans and about \$2.2 12 million in a liability that not many 13 people think that it's real liability, 14 but it is, it's for post requirement 15 health insurance premiums. 16 Several years ago, the 17 Governmental Accounting Standards Board 18 required local governments to recognize 19 the liability for post retirement and 20 insurance premiums and you have that 21 actuarially determined every year. 22 That is not only for current retired 23 employees, but anybody who is currently 24 working for you that will eventually 25 earn that right so they make you put Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

24 Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 this liability on the books, but that's 3 not something that has to come out of 4 cash every year. It's a kind of 5 pay-as-you-go basis. 6 The last thing I want to bring up 7 is for next year's financial statement, 8 there is a new governmental accounting 9 pronouncement for all local governments 10 to adopt and the easiest way to 11 describe this is, every local 12 government that's in New York State, 13 their employees are part the New York 14 State Retirement System, okay. It's 15 lucky that we all live in New York 16 State because the New York State 17 Retirement System, as we sit here 18 today, is ninety-eight percent funded, 19 so basically it's two percent not 20 funded, which is pretty close to 100. 21 A lot of places, like the State of 22 Illinois, the State of Kentucky are 23 about fifty percent funded. 24 So what did the gurus of the 25 accounting world say? They said, well, Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 where is that money coming from if it's 3 an unfunded status, and it would come 4 from the local governments, so 5 beginning next year, all local 6 governments in New York State are going 7 to be sent a letter from the New York 8 State Retirement System saying that if 9 the world were to end tomorrow, what 10 would be the Village of Greenport's 11 share of the un-funding of the State 12 Retirement System, so everyone gets a 13 little piece of this, so because if the 14 end of funding was ever come to 15 fruition where people would have to 16 pay, what is each local government's 17 share of that and, therefore, they need 18 to record that as a liability on the 19 books next year. 20 So given that New York State 21 Retirement System is almost 100 percent 22 funded, my guess for the Village of 23 Greenport is that liability, that 24 unfunded liability that is Greenport's 25 share would be fairly insignificant in Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107

Regular Meeting - 1-28-16 1 2 relation to your financial position as 3 a village, but I do want to let you 4 know that every local government has to 5 adopt that in 2016 for their share of 6 the unfunded liability, and that will 7 change every year because the New York 8 State Retirement System is what's 9 called a defined benefit pension plan, 10 and it all depends on how the 11 investments are doing that are going to 12 be paying everybody's retirement. Ιf 13 we were to sit there today, where the 14 stock market is today, the unfunded 15 liability is probably a little bit 16 higher than two percent at this point 17 in time, but that will be determined every year by a firm, KPMG, which is 18 19 one of the largest firms in the world, 20 and they do that for the retirement 21 system and the retirement system will 22 be sending you a letter to say what is 23 your portion of the unfunded liability, 24 but it's not a bill. You don't have to 25 pay it. It's just a dollar amount Flynn Stenography & Transcription Service (631) 727-1107
