1	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Just for
2	the record, we started our meeting at
3	5:06 and we have our first applicant
4	here. It's Joann Brancato and she's
5	Item No. 2 under our agenda, discussion
6	and possible motion on a sign
7	application submitted by Joann Brancato,
8	the new tenant at Stirling Square at 300
9	Main Street. The commercial property is
10	located in the Historic District. SCTM
11	#1001-4-7-29.1.
12	And we just started to interview
13	Joann and she's telling us about her
14	store, the size of the store and what it
15	is that she wants to sell. This is of
16	course, at least to us, not part of our
17	application, except for the sign. But
18	we're interested in everyone that comes
19	to the Village of Greenport and wants to
20	do business. So Joann, maybe you want
21	to tell us again what your store is all
22	about.
23	MS. BRANCATO: Sure. I am an
24	anterior designer. I have been
25	collecting furniture for the last twenty

1	some odd years. I have had my house out
2	here for 23 years. I have always wanted
3	to have my store out here.
4	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Where do
5	you live out here?
6	MS. BRANCATO: In East Marion
7	behind the Lavender Fields.
8	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Nice.
9	MS. BRANCATO: Amazing lavender
10	field. I am also a jewelry designer.
11	So I will be selling my vintage
12	furniture. I am very architectural in
13	jewelry and some vintage clothing and
14	some vintage accessories. Some pieces
15	of my jewelry that I designed. I also
16	do photography that I frame in vintage
17	frames.
18	MEMBER WALOSKI: Sounds like a
19	place I would visit.
20	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay,
21	Joann, so you are here now to get an
22	approval for your sign. Tell us about
23	the sign and what does it say? The
24	size? The anterior?
25	MS. BRANCATO: It's very

Τ	straigntforward. It's 60 inches by
2	20 inches in the front store and it's
3	outlined in open space. No pun
4	intended. Space in between the letters.
5	And on the back side of the store,
6	which we talked about the last time I
7	was here, said I could put a sign in
8	the back. Right across the street from
9	Chase. And I think that is 49 inches
10	by 11.
11	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So this is
12	basically I am now holding up the two
13	photos that Joann submitted. So this is
14	the front sign
15	MS. BRANCATO: Correct.
16	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: And this is
17	the back of the store. It looks like
18	it's black and white?
19	MS. BRANCATO: Yes.
20	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I mean, I
21	don't have any other questions. Looks
22	to me that you know what you want to do
23	and you're happy with your sign.
24	I will ask the panel, are we
25	happy?

1	MEMBER MCMAHON: Yes.
2	MEMBER WALOSKI: Yes, it's
3	lovely.
4	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I mean, as
5	far as the sign, I have to ask our
6	Building Inspector, are there any other
7	issues as far as size is concerned?
8	MS. WINGATE: There are no
9	issues.
LO	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So then I
11	would
12	MS. WINGATE: And the Planning
L3	Board had no objections.
L 4	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So did you
L5	go to the Planning Board?
L 6	MS. BRANCATO: Yes.
L7	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I wasn't
L8	aware of it.
L 9	MEMBER CLARK: I make a motion to
20	accept the application as submitted by
21	Joann Brancato, for the sign application
22	at 300 Main Street.
23	MEMBER WALOSKI: Second.
24	MEMBER MCMAHON: And I second it.
25	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Caroline

1	seconded it.
2	All in favor?
3	MEMBER CLARK: Aye.
4	MEMBER MCMAHON: Aye.
5	MEMBER WALOSKI: Aye.
6	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Aye.
7	Four of us are in favor. We are
8	now joined by Roselle Borrelli. So we
9	have a full house. It was a breeze.
10	Thanks for joining us and submitting
11	this application. We wish you success
12	MS. BRANCATO: I wanted to ask
13	you one question because you said, 300
14	Main Street?
15	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yes.
16	MS. BRANCATO: I am not sure, is
17	it 300B?
18	MS. WINGATE: As soon as all the
19	construction is done, I think we are
20	going to go in there and issue all new
21	addresses to the whole place.
22	Basically, it's any where from 300 to
23	308 and nobody knows where anything
24	is.
25	MS. BRANCATO: Okay. Because I

1	am in the midst of having my cards
2	made. So I would like I shouldn't
3	yet? I thought it was 300B.
4	MS. WINGATE: I think it's
5	actually 304.
6	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Just for
7	the minutes, you know, obviously, there
8	is a little bit of discussion, so please
9	don't print your cards today or
10	tomorrow. How long do you think you
11	would need, Eileen?
12	MS. WINGATE: A week or two. And
13	then we will make an interpretation. I
14	really have to go to each building.
15	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Is that
16	okay with you?
17	MS. BRANCATO: Yes.
18	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So when do
19	you play on opening the store?
20	MS. BRANCATO: I would really
21	like to by next weekend.
22	MEMBER MCMAHON: Just put
23	Stirling Square on it and you will be
24	all set.
25	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yes.

1	MS. WINGATE: Stirling Square
2	works.
3	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yes, it
4	always works.
5	MEMBER WALOSKI: Will she have
6	problems with the post office if she
7	puts Stirling Square on there?
8	MS. WINGATE: Yes.
9	MS. BRANCATO: So I will just
10	wait.
11	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So you do
12	have to wait a little bit. Thank you,
13	Joann and good luck.
14	Okay. So we have another
15	application. This Item No. 1,
16	discussion and possible motion on a sign
17	application submitted by Arlene Marvin,
18	the owner of the commercial property
19	(currently Cookery Dock) located in
20	the Historic District at 132 Main
21	Street. The applicant is renting
22	her retail space to Heidi Kelso, owner
23	of LIDO Retail, LLC. The store logo
24	will be located above the storefront
25	in the preexisting curved white arch.

1	SCTM #1001-5-3-16.1.
2	So for the minutes, no one is
3	representing the applicant. So I
4	suggest that we look at the application
5	and see if it's what is before us and
6	see if it doesn't require any
7	representation of the owner. We may
8	have to table this application and pick
9	it up next month. So you have all the
10	information in front of me. So Arlene
11	the owner
12	MEMBER WALOSKI: And I am also
13	familiar with LIDO and they already had
14	their logo across the street.
15	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So tell us
16	about this, please?
17	MEMBER WALOSKI: It's a business
18	in Greenport. Across the street from
19	Mark Lamona. So that logo has existed.
20	So the logo was accepted previously.
21	MS. WINGATE: No. Because she
22	didn't go through any approvals
23	previously the last time, which is why I
24	was determined to get her in here this
25	time.

1	MEMBER CLARK: Don't you think
2	she should be present?
3	MEMBER MCMAHON: I think we can
4	handle it. Is this an appropriate sign?
5	MS. WINGATE: The size of the
6	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Dennis,
7	before we wish to any conclusion, we
8	understand that Ms. Kelso is doing
9	things not the way the Village would
10	like. So she obviously Eileen can
11	fill me in. She has posted a sign at her
12	previous store without HPC approval or
13	without any approval.
14	MS. WINGATE: Without nothing.
15	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: There are
16	size regulations. So that's the one
17	thing that I would like for discussion.
18	You know, we would like to invite
19	business or existing business into
20	Greenport. This is all fine. But it's
21	not like the sign is going to disrupt
22	the business. Just a matter of having
23	someone explain what her sign is all
24	about.
25	MEMBER MCMAHON: Yes.

1	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: And if we
2	have any questions. So I am not willing
3	to necessarily rush forward.
4	MEMBER MCMAHON: I am not
5	brushing this under the rug here. The
6	application is in front of us right now.
7	My question, the sign, is that sign's
8	proper size okay. The answer was yes.
9	MEMBER WALOSKI: So 4x2 would be
10	appropriate.
11	MS. WINGATE: Yes.
12	MEMBER WALOSKI: It's black and
13	white.
14	MEMBER CLARK: Is it going where
15	the Cookery Dock Sign is or is it coming
16	down?
17	MS. WINGATE: The sign in the
18	window is coming down.
19	MEMBER WALOSKI: It's going into
20	that space. This arch.
21	MEMBER MCMAHON: Gotcha. And
22	Lucy brought up the description in what
23	she is doing. On the inside
24	MEMBER CLARK: Correct. Light
25	spackle, touch-up paint. No dressing

1	rooms. Painting it clear what she wants
2	to do. That's fine. That doesn't
3	affect us.
4	MS. WINGATE: My concern is that,
5	when you're walking on the street, the
6	sign is very high. I asked her if she
7	intends to use decals and she said, no.
8	So I think that you should I can't
9	speak for her.
10	MEMBER CLARK: That is why I am
11	saying that she should be here to speak
12	for herself.
13	MS. WINGATE: Yes.
14	MEMBER MCMAHON: If it's not on
15	the application, then it's not approved
16	and it's not allowed.
17	MS. WINGATE: There you go.
18	MEMBER MCMAHON: If she applies
19	and states what she's going to do
20	MEMBER CLARK: So she has window
21	stickers here on the application.
22	MS. WINGATE: Where? I didn't
23	see that.
24	MEMBER CLARK: Window stickers,

25 here.

          using that as her graphic.
                CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Is there
21
          anything else that you would like to do?

                MEMBER CLARK: You have the
24
          window stickers. What is the logo
25
         stencil, 4' \times 2'?
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1	MS. WINGATE: That is the arch.
2	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: This is
3	this one here. That is what we're
4	talking about.
5	MEMBER CLARK: You have window
6	stickers; right?
7	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yes.
8	MEMBER CLARK: And then you have
9	logo stencils above window, 4 feet wide
10	by 2 feet high.
11	MEMBER MCMAHON: Maybe, okay,
12	that's the sign.
13	MEMBER BORRELLI: I think the
14	window stickers are clear. She says
15	clear window stickers. So I think she
16	is putting clear window stickers, 4 feet
17	wide and 2 feet high.
18	MEMBER CLARK: So we are assuming
19	a lot of things.
20	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: All right.
21	There is a sign, that is the LIDO, that
22	is the most important thing. That is
23	something that we don't have any
24	problems with and can approve. This
25	is something that we would like to

1	see
2	MEMBER MCMAHON: I think we can
3	approve that. I think what she has to
4	make clear is the window
5	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Right. Are
6	we all in agreement? That we need a
7	little bit more information but we can
8	go in and approve the main sign, the
9	archway, 4 foot high and 2 foot wide.
10	MEMBER BORRELLI: Is she allowed
11	to have two stickers in each window?
12	MS. WINGATE: No. She has a
13	door. So I don't know actually,
14	she has here, the floor plan from
15	the Planning Board. She has a
16	large
17	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Eileen
18	Wingate is presenting the floor plan so
19	that we could look at it.
20	MS. WINGATE: So this could be
21	the two windows that she is talking
22	about.
23	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I don't
24	think that it's a big deal, but I think
25	that we should just stick to approve the

1	main sign, LIDO, which she actually
2	presented in her application. And maybe
3	if she wants to do anything else on any
4	other doors, storefront windows, then
5	she has to come back and ask us and tell
6	us what she wants to do. Would that be
7	the right decision?
8	MEMBER WALOSKI: I agree with
9	that. I think we should move forward on
10	approving this right here.
11	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So then may
12	I have a motion to approve the major
13	sign in the curved arch?
14	MEMBER WALOSKI: I make a sign
15	that we approve
16	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: You make a
17	sign?
18	MEMBER WALOSKI: I make a motion
19	to approve the name for inside the arch
20	for LIDO RETAIL, at 132 Main Street.
21	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I second
22	it.
23	All in favor?
24	MEMBER BORRELLI: Aye.
25	MEMBER MCMAHON: Aye.

1	MEMBER WALOSKI: Aye.
2	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Aye.
3	MEMBER CLARK: I Abstain.
4	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Four in
5	favor and 1 abstention. So I will ask
6	Eileen Wingate to contact the owner of
7	the store no, the tenant of the
8	store, to give us more feedback on any
9	more signage in front or behind the
10	store, so we know what it is. So it
11	may be a flashing neon sign. We don't
12	know.
13	MEMBER WALOSKI: Well, she said,
14	stickers.
15	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I don't
16	think it's a big deal. Anyway, I like
17	it when they come to the Board and be
18	present. It's better for everyone.
19	We can ask questions. So if they're too
20	busy, then we may be too busy.
21	MEMBER CLARK: Imagine that.
22	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Now, before
23	we go to Item No. 3, 4 5 and 6. I would
24	like to ask Eileen Wingate about another
25	item that we touched upon last year,

1	which is the signage not in the Historic
2	District. Now, Mary Bess Phillips at
3	the Code Committee asked us to chip-in
4	and give us our take of the signs even
5	beyond the historic district. It's all
6	about the business.
7	MEMBER BORRELLI: Can I just have
8	a clarification on what is the Historic
9	Business Section? We go up to where and
10	down to where?
11	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Well, you
12	should know this by now. It's Main
13	Street going all the way down
14	MEMBER BORRELLI: Right.
15	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: To
16	Claudio's but not beyond that cross
17	section?
18	MEMBER BORRELLI: Right. Front
19	Street?
20	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: No, not
21	Front Street. I think the corner
22	building and
23	MEMBER CLARK: Reese Building, I
24	think is.
25	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: All the

1	stores on Front Street all the way down
2	to the hotel, is not part of our
3	jurisdiction, but this is where at least
4	50% of the signs will be applied for.
5	There is a code.
6	MEMBER BORRELLI: There is
7	important storefront stores on Front
8	Street.
9	MEMBER WALOSKI: We discussed at
10	previous meetings right when I got on,
11	that we were thinking of bringing that
12	part into the Historic District.
13	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Well, we
14	brought up the idea to at least us
15	review signage on Front Street
16	MEMBER BORRELLI: You have
17	tremendous windows on Lloyd's Realty.
18	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Right.
19	MEMBER BORRELLI: Over and above
20	the carousel.
21	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Right. But
22	we're now talking about the signage.
23	You know, signs are closing and opening
24	up all the time. As far as I
25	understand, I would like Eileen to

1	actually give us a little bit of
2	feedback on this. The current code is
3	very liberal. And it's not not as
4	strict as what we are dealing with in
5	the Historic District. We cannot have
6	large signs. It's the width and the
7	length. Everywhere else, we could have
8	anything else.
9	MS. WINGATE: Wingate for
10	example
11	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: For
12	example, Ms. Wingate, please.
13	MS. WINGATE: LIDO, the building
14	is 22 feet 8 inches wide, bu the
15	calculations of the code, she would be
16	entitled to 33 square feet of signage.
17	That is four times what you just allowed
18	her to have. She could just deck that
19	building out. She could cover that
20	window with signs by code. I just think
21	that is really generous.
22	MEMBER MCMAHON: Then it's a code
23	issue. Who would vote on that and
24	change that, the Village Board?
25	MS. WINGATE: Yes.

1	MEMBER MCMAHON: Okay. Then if
2	the Village Board wants to
3	MS. WINGATE: Well, they're
4	asking for your feedback.
5	MEMBER MCMAHON: Feedback, if
6	they want to change it and take it up a
7	little bit, I am all for it.
8	MEMBER WALOSKI: It doesn't make
9	sense to just control Main Street and
10	not control Front Street. It doesn't
11	make sense. It could damage the work to
12	the Village. It's also unfair. You can
13	have as big as sign as you want and
14	then on the other side, you can't.
15	There should be a code for this. My
16	feeling is that we should consider
17	bringing Front Street back into this.
18	MS. WINGATE: It's never been.
19	So it's not back into it.
20	MEMBER WALOSKI: I thought it
21	was. I was told by Mayor Kappell
22	MS. WINGATE: No.
23	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So you
24	would like Front Street to be part of
25	the Historic District?

Τ	MEMBER WALOSKI: EXACTLY.
2	MEMBER BORRELLI: I think any
3	really historic home should really be
4	considered by us and our heritage, to in
5	some way have some kind of opinion. Not
6	to control, but to say, okay, just
7	that's a really old building and we have
8	had it around for 200 years. So maybe
9	we can try and keep it as nice as we
10	possibly could.
11	MEMBER WALOSKI: I agree.
12	MS. WINGATE: There is two
13	issues. They are separate.
14	MEMBER MCMAHON: Yes. We are
15	meddling the issue. Let's stick to the
16	signage.
17	MEMBER CLARK: Back to signage.
18	You just gave a calculation on LIDO.
19	When that young lady was here for
20	White's Hardware, you were supposed to
21	see if she was allowed for those two
22	signs?
23	MS. WINGATE: Because of the
24	weather and we got put off by the
25	Planning Board, we just really haven't

1	been able to take the sign down and
2	measure it. She will be back.
3	MEMBER CLARK: Okay.
4	MEMBER WALOSKI: I had a problem
5	with the big sign. I voted "no" for th
6	big one because I thought it was huge.
7	MS. WINGATE: She will be back.
8	MEMBER CLARK: I just find it
9	interesting that LIDO was allowed so
10	much and she wasn't allowed as much.
11	MS. WINGATE: She was allowed
12	more actually. She asked for that much
13	more. She asked for a big sign
14	MEMBER CLARK: And we approved
15	it.
16	MS. WINGATE: She asked for a
17	lot.
18	MEMBER BORRELLI: Can I not
19	complicate this and maybe ask a silly
20	question?
21	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Well, we
22	are always up for silly questions.
23	MEMBER BORRELLI: Feedler
24	Gallery, right, the storefront that he
25	has, how much signage would that store

1	be granted?
2	MS. WINGATE: It's a small -
3	would you say it's 15 feet?
4	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: It's a
5	narrow storefront.
6	MS. WINGATE: It's 1 1/2 square
7	feet per linear foot of storefront.
8	MEMBER BORRELLI: Because I have
9	the original sign that went over that
10	storefront and my original sign is
11	almost 12 feet long. It's a good 11
12	feet long, for the original store, and
13	it's wood sign. So I am thinking
14	historically, we are pretty okay.
15	That's pretty much in line of what was
16	going on in 1850.
17	MS. WINGATE: If you guys feel at
18	any time you want to expand the Historic
19	District or take on all signage, all you
20	need to do is compose yourself and bring
21	it to the Village Board. And ask them
22	for the authority to do this.
23	MEMBER BORRELLI: I have been
24	doing a lot of research for my homes
25	and it's mostly 1856, with my

1	expertise so far. But there were Beer's
2	Map that exists from 1858 that show
3	Greenport Business District. The
4	Business District was all of Main
5	Street, Front Street and where the
6	boats came in and some of Carpenter's
7	Street. That was the Business
8	District. They are all there.
9	Wouldn't that be considered the Historic
10	Business District of Greenport
11	Village?
12	MS. WINGATE: The Historic
13	Business was a line that was drawn in
14	1971, I think. Regardless of the
15	historic nature. We had to put together
16	a district
17	MEMBER BORRELLI: There are still
18	older buildings in that District that
19	we're not controlling.
20	MS. WINGATE: Yes.
21	MEMBER CLARK: Which doesn't seem
22	right. They are not using the word
23	"Historic" in my opinion.
24	MS. WINGATE: That probably will
25	be coming to you soon. When it gets a

1	new owner, it will get a new use. Once
2	it gets a new use, it will get a site
3	plan review.
4	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: That is
5	another option. That applications get
6	to us or other Board's I mean, it's
7	up for discussion.
8	MS. WINGATE: Other Board's can
9	ask for your opinion. Once you're
10	outside of the district, your input is
11	voluntary.
12	MEMBER MCMAHON: It has to start
13	with the code. If we have a code
14	change, then simply you have to abide by
15	the code.
16	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Our code is
17	very liberal.
18	MEMBER BORRELLI: But large signs
19	aren't bad.
20	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Basically,
21	what I am trying to say is rule on signs
22	based on individual buildings. It's an
23	historic structure. Not all structures
24	on Front Street are in the Historic
25	District. Then we have more interest in

1	determining what goes on with the
2	building. We have to come up with some
3	kind of response.
4	MEMBER WALOSKI: We have to be
5	very, very careful with that.
6	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Right.
7	Obviously in the Historic District, we
8	have much more control. So what are we
9	going to tell the Code Committee? I
10	mean, Dennis said we have to possibly
11	restrict or reduce the signage
12	MEMBER MCMAHON: Change the
13	formula is what I would tell them. A
14	bigger sign fits a bigger building.
15	So if the formula meets the criteria,
16	then a big sign should be on a big
17	building.
18	MEMBER WALOSKI: Don't you think
19	there is inequality in that?
20	MEMBER MCMAHON: There always is.
21	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: You may
22	want to give them the opportunity
23	MEMBER MCMAHON: That is why they
24	come here.
25	(Whereupon, a discussion was held
