10	at 119 Main Street.
11	The applicant is seeking HPC approval
12	for two signs that are attached to the
13	storefront windows on the inside, and one
14	illuminated sign with flashing light bulbs
15	above the entry door. The signs have already
16	been installed without having applied for a

1/	permit. Suffolk County Tax Map #1001-5-4-34.
18	So I received a letter from the Chairman
19	of the ZBA. Mr. LaMaina had applied for a
20	for the sign at the Zoning Board of Appeals
21	and they didn't they could not make a
22	decision, and he's sending — they're sending
23	him to us for approval of the sign. They
24	asked Mr. LaMaina, because the sign is
25	illuminated, which is against the zoning code,

1	to turn the sign off for the time being and
2	get an approval from us, and then he has to go
3	back to the ZBA; is that correct, David?
4	MR. ABATELLI: That's right, yeah.
5	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay.

7	Board can approve the lights.
8	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yes.
9	MR. ABATELLI: But you guys still have
10	to review the signs.
11	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Correct. So
12	MEMBER WALOSKI: Mark, you could bring

up a chair --

4 there last night around 7:30. And I did read

5	your ZBA application, and also the letter from
6	Amy Martin in opposition to your sign. And I
7	must say, yes, you're right, I mean, there is
8	not much foot traffic late on Sunday
9	afternoon, but you were doing quite well. I
10	saw a lot of people in your bar. So,
11	obviously, it has spread and people come back
12	and you're doing business.
13	MR. LAMAINA: I agree, but the sign does
14	help.
15	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yes. Now, as I
16	said before, let's discuss the signage itself
17	without the lighting. Is there does anyone
18	have anything to say about the design of the
19	sign?
20	MEMBER WALOSKI: Well, I think that sign
21	is very handsome. I think it works with the
22	colors of the building, which I imagine were
23	approved, yeah, and
24	MR. LAMAINA: Those are the original
25	colors of the building.

2 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: You didn't paint 3 the exterior? MR. LAMAINA: No. I don't think it's 4 5 been painted in 50 years. 6 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yeah. 7 MR. LAMAINA: It needs to be painted, 8 though, so --9 MEMBER WALOSKI: It's recessed. It's recessed, so it's not in anybody's way. It's 10 11 very handsome. It's in keeping with the 12 colors on the rest of the building. And I 13 don't even mind the lighting. 14 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: We are not talking 15 about the lighting right now. 16 MEMBER WALOSKI: We can't even mention 17 the lighting? 18 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Not now. 19 MEMBER WALOSKI: Okay. CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: What I would like 20 21 to do, to help Mark to get an approval of the 22 sign, because the code says he would have to 23 take it down within 10 days. This, obviously, 24 did not happen.

25	MR. LAMAINA: It's a mechanism that's

- 1 inside of the unit, obviously. It's on like a
- 2 timing belt. I didn't see it. The gentleman

3	that made it described it to me.
4	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: But it's the
5	individual bulbs that blink?
6	MR. LAMAINA: Yeah, so
7	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Is it sort of
8	rolling or
9	MR. LAMAINA: No. One set blinks
10	lightly, and then one set blinks really dim.
11	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: But it has a
12	flashing effect?
13	MR. LAMAINA: Really, it's not that
14	aggressive at all, but I don't think it's
15	aggressive.
16	MEMBER WALOSKI: Is there a way that
17	they can just be on and not blink?
18	MR. LAMAINA: We'd have to take the back
19	of the unit off and the guy would have come
20	and, I guess, shut the timing belt off. I'm
21	not sure. I'm sure it could be shut.
22	MEMBER WALOSKI: Because that might be a
23	solution to the lighting, because I think
24	lighting is important for you on your sign.
25	And I have no problem with lighting. And

1	there are other people, although one is
2	grandfathered in on the street, but they do
3	have lighting, and one of the restaurants,
4	Scrimshaw has lighting that was new neon. And
5	I think that I would have no problem at all
6	with it if the lighting was just on and not
7	MR. LAMAINA: Yeah, I've gotten some
8	people
9	MEMBER WALOSKI: Not doing a dance
10	number, yeah.
11	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So you're against
12	the flashing and the blinking?
13	MEMBER WALOSKI: I'm not against it. If
14	the ZBA would allow him to have the blinking,
15	I would have no objection to it. But I think
16	it would be a little bit more in keeping with
17	the vintage feeling and the historic feeling
18	if the lights were just on, and I think it
19	would I think it would be very attractive.
20	MEMBER MC MAHON: Yeah. I have no
21	problem with the sign being lit, that's all
22	I'm going say about that.
23	MEMBER WALOSKI: Yeah.
24	MEMBER CLARK: Nor I, but not blinking.

_	MEMBER CLARK (CL. L. L. L.)
1	MEMBER CLARK: (Shook head no.)
2	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: And Roselle?

14	MEMBER BORRELLI: You don't?
15	MR. LAMAINA: No, not at all.
16	MEMBER BORRELLI: I do.
17	MEMBER WALOSKI: I don't get it either.
18	I'm a senior citizen and I sort of

MEMBER BORRELLI: Yeah, all the time

19	MR. LAMAINA: I think it looks fun and
20	inviting to the parents with children.
21	MEMBER MC MAHON: I was going to say
22	fun.
23	MEMBER WALOSKI: It's just fun, it's
24	playful.
25	MEMBER BORRELLI: You think it looks

1	good for children?
2	MR. LAMAINA: Of course.
3	MEMBER BORRELLI: Why?
4	MR. LAMAINA: We do probably 60% of our
5	business with children meeting there,
6	unfortunately, because they make huge messes,
7	but we do.
8	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yeah. I mean,
9	I
10	MEMBER WALOSKI: I think it has a
11	playful feel and I think it's fun.
12	MR. LAMAINA: I think that's the tone
13	that we went for and I think that's the tone
14	that we got with the sign.
15	MEMBER WALOSKI: I don't think it has a

16	bawdy feeling to it.
17	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Mark, of course
18	you have to understand, you know, I would have
19	loved for you to come to HPC first
20	MR. LAMAINA: As I should have.
21	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: before the
22	Building Inspector sends you to the ZBA. And
23	this is something that we have to discuss
24	internally. So at least you have some kind of
25	approval or nonapproval to move forward. But

we — if you had come to us first, we could have discussed this with you, having the sign recessed. Or, if you want more attention, you could possibly bring the sign out into the sidewalk, it is allowed. And you could also light it from the outside with one of those — very simply with a light that illuminates it from the outside. But the code does not allow you to illuminate it from the inside, which this is.

So there are different ways, and this

would be a calmer way, as some of the Board

13	members here expressed. We have to be careful
14	becoming too garish. I mean, this is the
15	Historic District, and some of those examples
16	that you cited are not in the Historic
17	District. It's very difficult for a lot of
18	Greenporters even to identify the Historic
19	District, because it really doesn't make a lot
20	of sense. It should be much larger. A lot of
21	other buildings should be part of the Historic
22	District, but that's what we have to deal
23	with.
24	East, you know, South Main Street is
25	all these huildings on both sides are within

the Historic District, going all the way up

Main Street and First Street, but then Front

Street is not. So you — of course, you have

those competitors on Front Street. Some of

them have signs, but lighted or illuminated

signs really don't get approved. It's going

to be very difficult to get an approval for

illuminated signs.

MR. LAMAINA: Well, I assume that there

10	was a time in history when Bill Claudio's
11	father went for approval and got it.
12	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yes. Well, this
13	was this is all
14	MR. LAMAINA: So, I mean, I'm just a new
15	generation trying to do something different.
16	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yeah. But if you
17	read the zoning code, and it's online, you
18	know, it's Paragraph 150. Go down to I car
19	actually give you the quote. It's Paragraph
20	15, G2. It tells you what is prohibited and
21	what is allowed. And it also tells you that
22	owners of, for example, Claudio's or the
23	Whiskey Wind, if they need to repair, if this
24	sign breaks down, they're not going to be able
25	to have it repaired. They have to go back to

23

1 an unilluminated sign. So a lot of people

2 don't know this, but that's our code.

3 MR. LAMAINA: I think Bill Claudio was

4 on record at the last meeting I was at saying

5 that they replaced the neon signs on his

6 anchor last year.

/	MEMBER WALUSKI: It has been repaired
8	last year.
9	MR. LAMAINA: So I don't know if that's
10	completely true.
11	MEMBER WALOSKI: Yeah.
12	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yeah. I mean, I
13	just read the code, because I wanted to be a
14	little bit prepared for this meeting tonight.
15	But, you know, I don't know how this happened.
16	Maybe Dave Abatelli can talk to this, but, I
17	mean, that's the fact.
18	So I think —— do we have to make a
19	motion, Dave Abatelli, as far as the lighting
20	is concerned, or is this enough, our
21	discussion being part of the minutes of
22	tonight's meeting for the ZBA? I can write
23	something.
24	MR. ABATELLI: I mean, I think it could
25	be either way. I mean, if you're kind of

- unanimous, then it could probably be in a
- 2 motion, if you want.
- 3 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay.

4	MR. ABATELLI: If you're kind of
5	scattered, it may not matter too much. You
6	know, I mean there could be the minutes and
7	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I mean, I have a
8	feeling we can make a motion as far as the
9	nonblinking and the flashing is concerned. I
10	think we are all against it or not?
11	MEMBER WALOSKI: Yeah, I just want to
12	make it clear that well, I just wanted to
13	underline the fact that Claudio's did have
14	extensive work done on their sign last year
15	with the neon, so they and I don't know
16	whether they went through the Board or not,
17	but their sign was not working and they had a
18	neon specialist artist come and work on it.
19	So, you know, if that's the case, that's
20	you know, Mark should not be
21	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay. So, I mean,
22	this is
23	MEMBER WALOSKI: Mark should be treated
