3	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Welcome to the
4	regular meeting of the Historic Preservation
5	Commission. It is April 7th, 2014, at 5:02. My
6	name is Frank Uellendahl.
7	MEMBER WALOSKI: Caroline Waloski.
8	MEMBER MC MAHON: Dennis McMahon.
9	MEMBER CLARK: Lucy Clark
10	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay. Welcome. We
11	have two items on the agenda, plus a possible
12	discussion on a sign application.
13	Let's start with Item #2, discussion and
14	possible motion on an application submitted by
15	Deborah Schade, the owner of Special Effects,
16	located in the Historic District at 455 Main
17	Street. The applicant would like to install two
18	salvaged wooden French doors at her store.
19	Suffolk County Tax Map #1001-4-7-19.

20	Welcome, Deborah. Why don't you come and
21	sit right here, so you don't have to raise your
22	voice too much.
23	MEMBER WALOSKI: Debbie doesn't have the
24	application for the signage on there, but we
25	could probably discuss it, right?
	April 7, 2014
1	MEMBER MC MAHON: Uh-huh, get it done.
2	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Is there more than
3	the two doors?
4	MEMBER WALOSKI: Yeah, that's what I said,
5	the signage.
6	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Is that new signage,
7	or is this existing?
8	MEMBER WALOSKI: It's new signage.
9	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay. So then tell
10	me what the new signage is all about, because
11	it's not part of the application.
12	MEMBER WALOSKI: Okay. You know, there's
13	existing signage at that we had approved a few
14	years back.
15	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: A while ago.
16	MEMBER WALOSKI: Right. And now Debbie is

17	opening up this tea parlor.
18	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay.
19	MEMBER WALOSKI: So we wanted to do
20	something that was in keeping with the Victorian
21	look of her building, and that would sort of
22	blend with the signage that she already has, but
23	be a separate identity.
24	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Uh-huh. Okay. So
25	then

1	MEMBER WALOSKI: And we're using the same
2	colors that she had in the in the old sign.
3	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay. So then we
4	will add this to the application to make it a
5	little bit easier, so you don't have to come back
6	next month.
7	MS. SCHADE: Okay. Thank you.
8	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So we'll have two
9	motions. But let's start with the doors
10	MS. SCHADE: Okay.
11	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: that you found.
12	And you told me ahead of the meeting that you'd

like to install them in your store.

14	MS. SCHADE: Yes.
15	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Facing
16	MS. SCHADE: The south side.
17	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay.
18	(Member Roselle Borrelli entered the
19	meeting.)
20	MS. SCHADE: It's the South side. And I
21	brought some photos here. So the doors would be
22	placed right here. Okay? And you'll see that
23	there are two windows that really look like
24	French doors on the same side of the building.
25	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay. So this is

1	right around the corner from Main Street, right?
2	MS. SCHADE: Yes.
3	MEMBER WALOSKI: This is on Main Street.
4	MS. SCHADE: Right on Main Street.
5	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: This is facing the
6	south.
7	MS. SCHADE: This is facing yeah.
8	MEMBER WALOSKI: This is facing south.
9	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay.

MS. SCHADE: And then I $\operatorname{\mathsf{--}}$ these are the

11 doors. Okay? CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay. So are we only 12 talking about installing two doors? 13 14 MS. SCHADE: Uh-huh. 15 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: That's it? MS. SCHADE: (Nodded yes). 16 17 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I thought there were two French doors, but it's only -- we're only 18 19 talking about the one --MS. SCHADE: A set of French doors. 20 21 MEMBER MC MAHON: A pair. 22 MS. SCHADE: Yes, a pair. 23 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: All right. So -- and 24 how would you be using this? Is this part of --I mean, I was in your shop a couple of times. 25 April 7, 2014

- 1 You would obviously, you would like to have
- 2 access to your side yard.
- 3 MS. SCHADE: Yes, that's why.
- 4 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay. And this is
- 5 what —— does this have to do with the signage,
- 6 too?
- 7 MS. SCHADE: Yes.

8	MEMBER WALOSKI: Well, it's part of
9	Debbie's new project.
10	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So there's something
11	happening in the side yard, like seating and
12	MS. SCHADE: Yes.
13	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay. All right. So
14	tell us a little bit about where you found these
15	doors. And are they in good condition?
16	MS. SCHADE: They're in beautiful
17	condition, they are. They're sturdy and they're
18	outdoor.
19	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: And they fit? You
20	probably have to adjust them to the existing
21	opening, or do they actually fit?
22	MEMBER MC MAHON: No. This is a new
23	opening, isn't it?
24	MS. SCHADE: It would be a new opening.
25	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Oh, okay. All right.

- 8 tell you this? If it's not a -- if it's not a
- 9 structural change, then, Dave Abatelli, please
- 10 help us, then.
- 11 MR. ABATELLI: Right, yeah. Is it
- replacing windows or something?
- MS. SCHADE: No.
- 14 MR. ABATELLI: It's just a wall?
- MS. SCHADE: Yes.
- 16 MR. ABATELLI: Yeah. Then you definitely
- 17 need an actual permit.
- 18 MS. SCHADE: Okay.
- 19 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Yeah. Okay. So
- 20 where did you find these doors?
- 21 MS. SCHADE: I found them at a tag sale in
- 22 Southold.
- 23 MEMBER WALOSKI: They're beautiful.
- 24 MS. SCHADE: They really are.
- 25 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: How old you are they,

do you know? Did they give you any information?

- 4 I -- these are the doors here.
- 5 MEMBER WALOSKI: Yeah.

- 9 MEMBER MC MAHON: -- fit. I mean, look at
- 10 the windows and look at the layout of the door.
- 11 MEMBER WALOSKI: They're great.
- 12 MEMBER MC MAHON: So wonderful, no problem.
- 13 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I don't have a
- 14 problem with it either.
- 15 MEMBER WALOSKI: Yeah.
- 16 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So --
- 17 MEMBER WALOSKI: Well, I can vote on this
- 18 part of it, so yeah.
- 19 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay. Then why don't
- 20 you? And, by the way, Roselle Borrelli is
- joining us, so we are complete and we have a
- 22 quorum.
- 23 MEMBER WALOSKI: I make a motion that we
- 24 accept the presentation of installing a set of
- antique French doors into 455 Main Street, which

1	will be part of the Tea House.
2	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Okay.
3	MEMBER MC MAHON: I second it.
4	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: All in favor?
5	MEMBER CLARK: Aye.
6	MEMBER MC MAHON: Aye.
7	MEMBER WALOSKI: Aye.
8	MEMBER BORRELLI: Aye.
9	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Aye.
10	All in favor, okay. So that went well.
11	MEMBER WALOSKI: That's done.
12	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So but now there
13	is a second part of the application. And,
14	Deborah, please tell us what your we're
15	curious, we want to know what you're planning,
16	since you're presenting a new sign here. It says
17	Special House Special-Tea House.
18	MS. SCHADE: Special-Tea House.
19	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: So what are you
20	trying to do?
21	MS. SCHADE: So I wanted to incorporate a
22	tea room into the building, especially since the
23	Greenport Tea House closed.

MS. SCHADE: Yes. And it would -- I mean, 25 April 7, 2014 1 I plan -- I believe that it would -- each 2 business would compliment, and, you know, each 3 other. And I think that it certainly would be an additional draw to the end of town. 4 5 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I would think so. MS. SCHADE: Yeah. I would -- yeah. 7 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I think there will be 8 a lot of people happy about the fact that there 9 is more seating and more activity at that end of Main Street. 10 Do you have to do anything? I forget what 11 12 it looks like. You need to pave this, or what 13 are your plans for outdoors? People will be 14 sitting outside, right? 15 MS. SCHADE: Yes. Well, last year I had taken the deck down and put in a brick patio, 16 17 beautiful courtyard back there, so I plan to use 18 that for seating. And then, as you come out the 19 French doors, then that's my side lawn, which I would love to have tables. 20

19	wanted to design something that had it's own
20	identity, but was in keeping — any signage we
21	didn't want to compete in any way with what was
22	already there, so that it would be it would
23	stand alone, but have synergy. So we kept the
24	same colors. We kept it much simpler than the
25	original sign, which has a little bit more

25	is right here?

9	in order to install the fence that he's trying to
10	get approved.
11	MR. ABATELLI: Okay. So that's a good
12	question, yeah. I mean, not that you have to
13	resolve it, but at least you can move a little
14	bit further.

CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: He would have to.
