2	order at 5:06 p.m.)
3	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: This is the March 27th,
4	2014 meeting of the Village Planning Board. It's
5	a work session.
6	And Item #1 is a to continue to table
7	further action pending interpretation from the
8	Village of Greenport Zoning Board of Appeals on
9	an application submitted by Imran Qasim Khan,
LØ	owner of Layyah Corp., requesting a use
l1	evaluation for the addition of a car service
12	office/operation into the existing convenience
13	store office. The store is located it 331 Front
L4	Street; Section 6, Block 2, Lot 17. So
15	MEMBER BURNS: I move continuation.
L6	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay. I'll second. All
L7	in favor?
L8	MEMBER BURNS: Aye.
L9	MEMBER DOWLING: Aye.

20	MEMBER MC MAHON: Aye.
21	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Aye.
22	All right. Eileen, is this a meeting where
23	the public addresses the Board, or is this our
24	MS. WINGATE: It's a work session. You
25	could certainly talk with people.
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1	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay. And people can
2	speak, okay, and we speak among ourselves?
3	MS. WINGATE: (Nodded yes.)
4	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay. Item #2 is
5	discussion and possible motion to accept the Site
6	Plan submitted by ELIH, the hospital in town.
7	The site plan that was requested has been
8	submitted for this possible motion, and
9	illustrates signage and lights —— and the
10	lighting scheme for the new addition, as was
11	requested. That's Section 2, Block 3, Lot 2.
12	Is there any is there anybody here to
13	discuss that?
14	MR. EBLE: I'm here from the hospital and
15	in the event that you might have some questions
16	in addition to the ones that we discussed last

17	month.
18	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Right. Well, in the
19	meantime, you sent us a site plan that shows what
20	we had asked for.
21	MR. EBLE: That's correct.
22	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: And did the other Board
23	Members see that?
24	MEMBER DOWLING: I did not. I wasn't at
25	the last meeting.

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CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: And right now it's the 1 plan to put a two-story addition on there, and 2 that could change to a one-story; is that right? 3 4 MR. EBLE: Correct. 5 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So -- but, still, the 6 lighting plan is what it is for this and that --7 MR. EBLE: Yeah. And the lighting plan and 8 the signage plan is indicated on that drawing as 9 well, with a key on the lower left there. 10 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: I saw the key there, 11 yeah. We had asked for this plan just to show these items on there, because that's one of the 12 things that the Planning Board --13

	16	And the rest of the requirements that would
	17	go along with the addition are zoning issues and
	18	site alteration issues that are already built
	19	into the plan, right?
	20	MS. WINGATE: (Nodded yes.)
	21	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So
	22	MEMBER BURNS: That you found additional
	23	parking is kind of amazing.
	24	MR. EBLE: Well, it was a challenge, but,
	25	yeah. You know, the charge that I had was to

	1	find the same number of spots that I would lose
	2	with this addition, which was three, and that's
	3	where it's indicated in the highlighted area with
	4	a "P" next to it on the drawing. Those three
	5	areas would be where I would capture or reclaim
	6	parking for the three spots that I would lose
	7	with this project.
	8	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So, can we
	9	MEMBER BURNS: I move we accept it.

CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: I'll second that motion.

25	that.

3 there now.
4 MEMBER MC MAHON: That's my only concern.
5 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: All right. So go ahead
6 and start that again.

22	to put it on the agenda?
23	MS. WINGATE: Yes.
24	MEMBER BURNS: Oh, okay.
25	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Oh, we do?

4 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: I'll offer a motion to

5 accept this motion at the next meeting. Does anybody want to second that? 6 7 MEMBER BURNS: Second. 8 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: All in favor? 9 MEMBER BURNS: Aye. 10 MEMBER DOWLING: Aye. 11 MEMBER MC MAHON: Aye. 12 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Aye. 13 Okay. So this -- next week this will be a 14 motion to -- next time this will be a motion to 15 accept. 16 MS. WINGATE: To accept the site plan the 17 way it was submitted. 18 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay. Item #3, 19 continued discussion: The owner of 34-36 Front 20 Street, Ed Healy, is seeking a site plan 21 modification to include the installation of 22 fencing and a tent/canopy in the rear yard for 23 use as an outdoor dining space/bar area. Since 24 the last meeting, the owner has submitted a site 25 plan for an outdoor bar/dining area. And this is

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1 Section 4, Block 10, Lot 30. Is Ed here?

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2 MR. HASS: It's Terry.
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- 3 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Oh, okay. Hi.
- 4 MR. HASS: Hi.
- 5 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So I guess we're going
- 6 to -- if you've got any -- we've got some
- 7 questions. You may have some comments as to what
- 8 your how your plan is developing in the
- 9 backyard there.
- 10 MR. HASS: My name is Terry Hass, H-A-S-S,
- and I'm from 34 Front Street, the Rhumbline.
- 12 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Who's Ed Healy?
- 13 MR. HASS: That's my partner
- 14 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay. Okay, go ahead.
- 15 MR. HASS: What are we --
- 16 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Oh, are you going to
- speak or should we speak?
- 18 MR. HASS: Oh, go ahead, you start.
- 19 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay. Well, let's see.
- 20 One of the questions that came up is the duration
- of the tent being in the backyard. One of the
- ideas was to limit it to the summer season, the
- 23 use season out there.
- 24 MR. HASS: I'm going to probably wait,
- 25 yeah. I'm going to wait until around the end of

1	May, around there. You know, it's 180 days, so
2	I'm going to try to I believe it's the span
3	that it allows.
4	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: I mean, the reason for
5	that is so that it's not up in a place where
6	things get stored outside during the off-season.
7	MR. HASS: Oh, yeah. We don't store
8	anything out there anyway.
9	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay. Well, that's
10	we want to keep to keep it that way.
11	MR. HASS: Yeah, definitely.
12	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: And then, do we I,
13	mean don't you?
14	MEMBER BURNS: Right.
15	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Does anybody else have
16	anything?
17	MEMBER BURNS: The only question I have is
18	concerning music.
19	MR. HASS: Yeah.
20	MEMBER BURNS: And loudness of. We
21	wouldn't want you to compete with Claudio.
22	MR. HASS: No. What we have, we have
23	speakers out there just piped, we're leaving it

24 like that. I'm not putting any live music, nothing like that out there. It's not a large 25 March 27, 2014 1 area. So it's piped music we've had. I mean, 2 it's been out there for like 12 years now, 13 3 years. It's not -- it don't get crazy out there, 4 it don't get loud. 5 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Oh, you've been playing music out there? 6 7 MR. HASS: I always have, yeah. 8 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Oh. 9 MR. HASS: But not — you know, if you walk by the fence, you'll hear it. 10 11 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah. 12 MR. HASS: But, really, you know, if you're 13 out in that parking lot, you're not going to hear 14 anything. 15 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay. The other -- one 16 of the other concerns was the water runoff from 17 that space. 18 MR. HASS: Right. CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Does that -- what's 19

there now, and is that going to -- on the ground

22	MR. HASS: There was a gravel kind of pit
23	there.
24	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: It's gravel?
25	MR. HASS: We'll put it back. And then we
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1	can also on Ben's building next door, we're
2	going to put a sump pump to pump the other side
3	of the tent right through that. So it's already
4	existing. It goes into the ground.
5	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay.
6	MR. HASS: And if we find that it's not
7	enough, we're thinking of going down below. I
8	was just talking to the guy about it, because
9	down below we've got two pumps. We can go right
10	into those that are underneath.
11	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: The sump pumps drain
12	from under the building somewhere?
13	MR. HASS: Yeah.
14	MEMBER DOWLING: And where does the water
15	run to, that it goes into the sewer system or
16	does it just go into the street?
17	MR. HASS: Into the in the system.

19	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: And that's the system
20	under the front?
21	MR. HASS: He said —— he was telling me
22	that that water, yeah, it can go through there.
23	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So and then part of
24	that idea of drainage is what sort of is there
25	going to be any landscaping around the around
12	March 27, 2014
1	the interior perimeter?
2	MR. HASS: On the interior? You're just
3	talking
4	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Is there something to
5	potted plants?
6	MR. HASS: Yeah. Beautify it a little bit,
7	either some plants, this and that, that's all
8	we're doing.
9	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah.
10	MR. HASS: Especially the first year.
11	MEMBER DOWLING: The question on the
12	runoff, so the rainwater runoff is going to be
13	diverted into the sewer system?
14	MR. HASS: Yeah. Well, the sewer system

MR. DOWLING: Okay.

1	L6	MS. WINGATE: No.
1	L7	MEMBER BURNS: No.
1	18	MR. HASS: All right. It's not the sewer
1	L9	system, though. One's already set up for
2	20	rainwater that's coming off of one building, that
2	21	comes off his gutters.
2	22	MEMBER DOWLING: Okay.
2	23	MR. HASS: It's enclosed totally. It goes
2	24	right into the ground.
2	25	MEMBER DOWLING: Okay.

	1	MR. HASS: So we're hooking into that. And
	2	underneath, I don't think that's a sewer system.
	3	MS. WINGATE: It could be a storm drain.
	4	MR. HASS: Right, and it gets pumped. Like
	5	if you get flooded, it gets pumped out into
	6	another system where it's supposed to go anyway.
	7	I'm not familiar with this stuff.
	8	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So there's two sump
	9	pumps serving the back?
1	LØ	MR. HASS: We already have two down there.
1	11	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah.

is the rainwater allowed in the sewer system?

	13	MR. HASS: But the other one, I think it's
	14	just going I think the gravel might be enough
	15	for it, to tell you the truth. It's not like a
	16	lot.
	17	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: What's under the gravel?
	18	It's just dirt under the gravel?
	19	MR. HASS: That's what's been there.
	20	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah, whatever's there,
	21	it's not concrete under the
	22	MR. HASS: Right now, we've got to break it
	23	up again. Somehow it got on the plans it
	24	showed the gravel, but somehow I guess the other
	25	guy must have went over it. You know, we got to

	2	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah, okay.
	3	MEMBER BURNS: I can't visualize that.
	4	Does that make sense?
	5	MS. WINGATE: I'm not sure myself what's
	6	there, but we could look at it.

MR. HASS: I was talking to John Schott and

he was telling me -- I don't know if you know

MEMBER BURNS: Is that set up like --

10	MS. WINGATE: I don't.
11	MR. HASS: All right. He does all the
12	work a lot of work around here, and then he
13	told me it was legal to do that, or that's how,
14	you know, it would work.
15	MEMBER DOWLING: We just have to make sure
16	it doesn't go actually into the sewer system.
17	MR. HASS: Right. No, definitely not.
18	MS. WINGATE: Yeah, it's definitely not
19	allowed in the sewerage system.
20	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Where does the sump pump
21	drain to now, do you know exactly?
22	MR. HASS: No.
23	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Can you find that out?
24	MR. HASS: I can. I don't know who
25	would know that?

1	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: I mean, you should know

2 anyway.

MS. WINGATE: We could do some 3

exploration --4

5 MEMBER DOWLING: Yeah.

6 MS. WINGATE: -- and find out where it's 7 going. I could talk to --8 MR. HASS: There's traps down there that 9 takes different -- there's two of them, you know. 10 One's, I guess, for sewage and the other one's not. There's two different ones --11 12 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah. 13 MR. HASS: -- that were built down there. 14 They've been there a long time. And we just put new pumps in. 15 MS. WINGATE: Well, we have until next week 16 17 to come up with some feasibility. 18 MEMBER DOWLING: Yeah. 19 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah. You know, we're 20 just concerned with the -- the runoff from the 21 tent --22 MR. HASS: Right. 23 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: -- canopy is going to go 24 into one place on probably two sides or three

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sides, or whatever. It's going to be to the

2 MR. HASS: It will be two -- yeah, it

3 should be two sides there. 4 CHAIRMAN JAUOUET: And if there were 5 vegetation or dirt, or something that can absorb 6 that, that's just natural --7 MR. HASS: Right. CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: -- is something that we 8 9 might prefer. MR. HASS: I'd rather that, too, than have 10 11 pumps. CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So what are the other 12 13 things here? The gate, the egress and the 14 security. 15 MR. HASS: Right. The gate's going to be a 16 push-bar. I want to see if I can get --CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So that people can get 17 out of there? 18 19 MR. HASS: Yeah. 20 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Out to the parking lot? 21 MR. HASS: It will always — it will never 22 be locked. 23 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah. 24 MR. HASS: You know, you can always push it

25

out.

1	MEMBER DOWLING: There's not a gate there
2	now, is there?
3	MR. HASS: Yeah.
4	MEMBER DOWLING: There is?
5	MR. HASS: Yeah.
6	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So that's going to be a
7	wood
8	MR. HASS: I just wanted to see if it was
9	possible, the same gate, to put the push-bar, but
10	my partner, that's what he does, he's security
11	and all this, you know.
12	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay.
13	MR. HASS: Alarms, this and that. So he
14	said they can do it, he's going to do it.
15	MEMBER DOWLING: You said you're going to
16	have that open until one a.m. in the morning?
17	MR. HASS: I'm going to try to keep the
18	door open until about one in the morning, then I
19	shut it. That way you can't get in from the
20	outside. It's up to how busy it gets. If the
21	parking lot's too busy, I'm going to have the
22	door closed, if you get too many walkers.
23	MEMBER DOWLING: Yeah.
24	MR. HASS: At that time, you get the wrong

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1	MEMBER DOWLING: Right. At one o'clock in
2	the morning, you also have residential apartments
3	above, so I was just wondering about the noise
4	and stuff like that. I don't know if what the
5	zoning is for noise outside.
6	MS. WINGATE: That's up to you guys to
7	decide.
8	MEMBER DOWLING: Right, okay. But there's
9	no zoning requirements for that?
10	MR. HASS: Yeah, it is, there's always a
11	lot of noise in that area. They don't
12	MEMBER DOWLING: Or laws in the Village for
13	congregating past a certain hour or anything like
14	that?
15	MS. WINGATE: Let's see. We have some
16	residential units above Rose and Dee's, and we
17	will be having residential units above the
18	laundromat, one unit, soon. There's not a lot of
19	residential units, but certainly noise from the
20	parking lot is an issue.
21	MEMBER DOWLING: Right.

	23	MEMBER DOWLING: Yeah.
	24	MR. HASS: In the summer, three in the
	25	morning, it's loud out there.

	1	MEMBER DOWLING: Yes.
	2	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: You already play music
	3	in the back anyway.
	4	MR. HASS: In the front, too, everybody has
	5	speakers outside. It gets loud.
	6	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah.
	7	MR. HASS: The police usually come around
	8	at 12 o'clock, they give us a sign to lower it,
	9	they tell us when, and it all gets lowered.
	10	MEMBER BURNS: So can we have that written
	11	into your final
	12	MR. HASS: Oh, yeah, yeah. That's when we
	13	lower everything, midnight, for outside.
	14	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: And what time does the
	15	restaurant close itself?
	16	MR. HASS: The restaurant's going to be
	17	going until about one this summer.
	18	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Same thing.

MR. HASS: It's loud out there.

19	MR. HASS: We're going to leave it a little
20	later. It was 11, 12.
21	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Is there any signage
22	that's going to be on the gate or anything out
23	there on that boundary?
24	MR. HASS: No.
25	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: At the south boundary,
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1	any other surfaces in itself?
2	MR. HASS: The only sign I need for that
3	side will be a small dress code type of sign.
4	That's what I did last year, but I take it down,
5	because it applies on weekend nights mostly.
6	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So how do they know it's
7	the Rhumbline, isn't there a sign?
8	MR. HASS: Oh, there is on top of the gate.
9	It says "Rhumbline Restaurant" on top of the
10	gate.
11	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: All right. That's
12	MEMBER DOWLING: That's a preexisting sign
13	that's there already?
14	MR. HASS: Yeah, that's it. I'm not
15	changing it.

	6	water run now?
	7	MEMBER DOWLING: Yeah.
	8	MEMBER BURNS: Rainwater.
	9	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Do you maybe have an
	10	answer to that?
	11	MR. HASS: From the building?
	12	MEMBER BURNS: In the back, yeah.

CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So that's your sign for

	13	MR. HASS: I don't have an answer for that.
	14	There's about three different pipes coming out,
	15	then I got the next doors's pipe coming on to my
	16	the next door's stuff coming on my back, too.
	17	MS. WINGATE: It's a big octopus up there.
	18	MR. HASS: Yeah.
	19	MS. WINGATE: Yeah.
	20	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Oh, it is? Yeah.
	21	MR. HASS: Yeah.
	22	MS. WINGATE: I'll go out this week and
	23	have a look at it.
	24	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: I mean, we're just
	25	you know, I'd say the east and west edges inside.
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22		
	1	MR. HASS: Right.
	2	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: If there were, you know,
	3	a you know, landscaping strips that went down
	4	some to
	5	MR. HASS: Right.
	6	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: I mean, I don't know
	7	what it looks back there, but
	8	MEMBER DOWLING: Is this all concrete slab

9 right there?

10	MR. HASS: Actually, I'd probably do
11	something like that.
12	MEMBER DOWLING: Is it just a concrete slab
13	now?
14	MR. HASS: It's a concrete slab, yeah.
15	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Where's the gravel that
16	you're talking about?
17	MR. HASS: There was. Somebody went over
18	it with the cement. I've got to open it up
19	again.
20	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Oh, I see, I see, I see.
21	MR. HASS: I guess the last guy that was
22	there didn't realize what it was for, you know.
23	MEMBER DOWLING: So are you thinking of
24	doing the whole back over in gravel now?
25	MR. HASS: No, no.
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MEMBER DOWLING: Just in this area?

MR. HASS: Yeah, I'll do the area — I

think we can manage to do that, actually, if that

works. That would be more of a natural kind of

drain—off.

6 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah. And then your

7	decorating scheme landscape—wise inside would
8	just be
9	MR. HASS: I could work more on it that
10	way.
11	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: in the containers.
12	Add that to it, too.
13	MR. HASS: Yeah.
14	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: If you're going to do
15	some landscaping, tell us if it's going to be in
16	the ground or in containers.
17	MR. HASS: Right.
18	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: And, you know, come up
19	with a some sort of a response on that drainage
20	and whether it's feasible for you to put, you
21	know, a strip on both sides that's, you know,
22	naturally absorbant.
23	MR. HASS: Right.
24	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Or not, you know.
25	MR. HASS: No, that's easy enough also.

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24

1 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Well, okay. Does

that -- how does that sound so far?

3 MS. WINGATE: (Nodded yes.)

4 MEMBER BURNS: I don't know that we have a hydro -- somebody who looks at water down there. 5 6 But the water along that area is really 7 problematic because it encroaches from the bay 8 and --MR. HASS: Yeah, in the front there, 9 10 actually. 11 MEMBER DOWLING: Yeah, so close to the 12 water table and the groundwater wells up when you 13 get really high tides. MEMBER BURNS: The water table, yeah. 14 15 water table is right there. 16 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: You don't get water 17 coming in from the sidewalk, though? 18 MR. HASS: No, no. 19 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: In the back. In the 20 back I'm talking. 21 MR. 7	ask if you would sign it again so I can file it,
8	because I can't file it unless it gets signed
9	within a 60-day period. The 60 days has expired
10	because there was no one here to sign it.
11	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay.
12	MR. CUDDY: So that's all it is. I'm just
13	asking you to sign it. I can show you the map.
14	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: All right. Well, do you
15	want to brings that up here?
16	MR. CUDDY: Thank you.
17	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Have we seen this
18	before?
19	MS. WINGATE: You have not seen this. This
20	goes bay way back. This goes back to Lara, Amy.
21	MR. CUDDY: No. It was approved a while
22	ago. There's nothing about the map that's
23	changed. What's happened is that every time that
24	we brought it to the County, they found something
25	else that was a problem. This as a layout is fine.

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1 One of the problems that they found was 2 that there was an old map from 1890 that had 3 never been abandoned, so we had to abandon it.

4	When we abandoned it, we had to have somebody
5	sign it. The Mayor signed it because he didn't
6	have any Assessor here. Then the County Clerk
7	decided that the Town Assessor in Southold could
8	sign it, so we brought it in. When that
9	happened, the time ran out again. So each time
10	we've done it, something happened. When I
11	finally brought it back, which is the last time
12	it was signed, there was a mislabeling in the
13	description of one of the lines, and the title
14	company, they just made an error.
15	And so it's the same map and has never
16	changed, but we're just trying to get it filed,
17	and Mr. Monsell has been very patient.
18	MEMBER MC MAHON: And I'm not sure if it
19	matters or not, but Judy no longer lives there.
20	MS. WINGATE: It's now or formerly.
21	MEMBER MC MAHON: Oh, okay. Okay.
22	MR. CUDDY: That's the way
23	MEMBER MC MAHON: I didn't want you to have
24	it rejected one more time.

CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So this is an existing

- house, right?
