22	It's going to be a black and red theme. This
23	side will hang. And then, also, I have another
24	one sort of similar to this which also will hang
25	off the posts. And then I have another one like

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this, which will hang off the back deck area,

- 2 which backs up to the pizza place, also the same
- 3 size, black and red theme --
- 4 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay.
- 5 MR. DECILLIS: -- with the name Basso on
- 6 it. I don't have anything planned for the roof.
- 7 There is a sign there that the old owner had. I
- 8 don't plan on using it. It's very large, bulky.
- 9 I just don't care for it. I don't think it looks
- 10 nice, and I have no plans on sticking that back
- on the roof.
- 12 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Oh, that's what the --
- there's that structure for it, though, on the
- roof?
- MR. DECILLIS: Yeah, yeah.
- 16 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah.
- 17 MR. DECILLIS: And, also, getting to the
- 18 garbage --
- 19 MR. ABATELLI: Could we just hold for the
- 20 sirens.

- 23 space already?

8	alcohol, you know, hard alcohol, just wine by the
9	bottle, if you want to sit down and have a
10	bottle, or by the glass, and a two-tap beer
11	system.
12	I'm also with that license allowed, if
13	someone wanted to come in and, say, take a
14	sixpack with them, maybe go out on the boat, or
15	take it to the marina or something. I haven't
16	decided if I wanted to do that yet, but just to
17	sit down and have some cheese, cured meets.

19	MR. DECILLIS: Yup. And I also was told
20	I have available seating for outside, weather
21	permitting. I think it was 12 or 14 seats

But they asked me if 15 I wanted a big, large sign, I said no. 16 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah. This other 17 picture shows the lights and the structure a

9	MEMBER DOWLING: That I'm not sure about.
10	MR. ABATELLI: Well, I
11	MEMBER DOWLING: But HPC would
12	MR. ABATELLI: Yeah. Between the Building
13	Department and HPC is more going to care about
14	how they look.

16 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah. 17 MR. ABATELLI: And not so much the size. 18 These are all over private property, though. 19 MEMBER DOWLING: Oh, okay. 20 MR. ABATELLI: So they're all —— being that 3 they're all over private property. 4 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So three signs seems to be okay, because --5 MR. ABATELLI: It could be, but they're not 6 7 that large. 8 MR. DECILLIS: Yeah. 9 MR. ABATELLI: It's a function of the faces of the building, so it's probably okay. 10 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay. 11

MEMBER DOWLING: Yeah.

12	MR. ABATELLI: And you're saying those are
13	all signs that were on Nosh before?
14	MR. DECILLIS: Correct, and that's the size
15	they're probably going to be, yeah.
16	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Right, right. That's
17	what I
18	MR. ABATELLI: It's probably okay, but that
19	would be the Building Department's
20	responsibility, to make sure the sizes are okay,
21	and the Historic Board as to what they physically
22	look like. You guys, it's like the general
23	layout. And, also, you could care about what
24	they look like, but it's not as critical, where
25	the Historic Board would also look at it.

4 MR. DECILLIS: You know what, yes. Yes,

5 you know, depending on, like I said, weather.

8	be times where I can't even use the outside. And
9	maybe if the sun's too much, an umbrella. And
10	then, you know, everything will come in at night,
11	you know, depending on how much room I have
12	there, but certainly cushions and things like
13	that.
14	MEMBER DOWLING: So I think for us, you
15	know, on this plan, if you showed that you have
16	umbrellas and we approve it for umbrellas, I
17	mean, you don't have to come back again, that
18	kind of thing.
19	MR. DECILLIS: Okay. Okay.
20	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: You know, match up what
21	you need umbrella-wise with the tables out there,
22	so that you have your full capacity, you know.
23	What about that deck? Is that isn't
24	that deck kind of a rattletrap?
25	MR. DECILLIS: It seems in good shape to me
