16	MR DOWLING: I don't have any

17	MR. BURNS: I don't have any.
18	MR. PROKOP: I think he was supposed to
19	provide more descriptive information about his
20	intended use. So I guess that would be for the
21	next work session, right; not for the regular
22	meeting, but for the next work session.
23	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah. Is he here?
24	MR. WILE: Yeah.
25	MR. ABATELLI: He's here.

3 late. Did you give us materials? You did give us

5 MR. WILE: Yeah. And I have some added

6 pictures of a — for tone, of an operation that's

7 similar in California. Obviously, it's an ocean

view here, but it gives you an idea. If you'd

9	like, I have a couple of copies.
10	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Sure.
11	MR. WILE: This has some idea of both
12	character and —— there's some images, as well as a
_	
13	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Oh, right, the thing in
14	San Francisco?
15	MR. WILE: As well as a sample-like calendar
16	of programming events, including lectures,
17	screenings, small business workshops, things like
18	that. You had mentioned the outreach activities.
19	We spoke with people at the County about doing
20	small business entrepreneur and new rancher, new
21	farmer initiatives, which we're pursuing a grant
22	opportunity to host that.
23	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So you I was looking
24	for your site pictures. That means that as you go
25	along, you'll those activities will be either

1 indoors or outdoors?

5

2 MR. WILE: Yeah.

3 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: I mean, you could possibly

4	take those tables that you have placed out front,
5	in front of the little enclosed porch
6	MR. WILE: Porch area.
7	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: open porch and put
8	line up picnic tables instead of other kind of
9	tables.
10	MR. WILE: That is possible.
11	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: So yeah.
12	MR. WILE: The idea is flexibility, flexible
13	use of the space, especially in the interior, which
14	is a you know, it's not a giant space. We're
15	not trying to overfill it. And I think the idea on
16	our side, you know, we ran a kickstarter crowd
17	funding workshop related to East End arts/weekend.
18	And, for example, that would be something I'd like
19	to pursue inside that space for people in our in
20	our community, which tend to be new food startups
21	and things like that. And it's been a great kind
22	of source of outreach to combine all the new
23	businesses that are starting in our immediate area.
24	Everybody was from the North Fork, and we sort of
25	exchange resources together. It's been like almost

- 1 a de facto Chamber of Commerce for a little group
- of people. So that would be one sort of additional
- 3 use in terms of how we how we take our business
- 4 and work with other people. You know, there are
- 5 new applicants for continue the leases in the
- 6 bay, oyster leases in the bay, and we have been a
- 7 source of --
- 8 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: That would be a subject
- 9 matter that you'd discuss at your --
- 10 MR. WILE: Exactly. Like --
- 11 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: -- symposiums, to put it
- 12 another way.
- 13 MR. WILE: Yeah, and hosting permitting
- 14 workshops to help those people through those --
- through the hurdles that we've already experienced.
- 16 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Right.
- 17 MR. WILE: And kind of mentorship, both where
- 18 we can provide it, and then also, ideally —— last
- 19 year, we took a space and brought in members of the
- 20 New York State DEC and Peconic Estuary to try and
- get our own guidance.
- 22 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Right.
- 23 MR. WILE: And so we put in a workshop group.
- So, in addition to --

be part food, part assembly.

MR. WILE: Yeah, it's sort of a —— ideally, it would be a program, almost if I could take a farm stand and program the extra space in there to make sure that we're both a destination for food, but also culture, and outreach, and education, environmental education. We'd love to do some projects with the school. We've talked about building marine observation buoys with students that could be —— we could launch out on the farm and get feedback, and it's just —— we're trying to look for other opportunities to integrate ourselves into the community in a way that's not just sort of a service business.

15 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay.

MR. WILE: At the risk of complicating that proposal, at its most basic, it is, you know, a place for us to put a physical headquarters on our farm, have people — we field phone calls all the time, "Hey, where can we find you? I was in

21	Greenport and I was looking for you. I was here
22	and we couldn't find you." And I think that rather
23	than point them to restaurants in New York City, ${\tt I}$
24	would really like to have a destination where we
25	can put a face on regional product and help kind of

grow that as an element of a working waterfront that actually is working.

3 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Right.

4 MR. BURNS: Is there a problem with this 5 property?

MR. PROKOP: Well, we have to straighten out the easement. You know, there's an easement across the back. The Village expects to retain 20 feet.

MR. WILE: Yeah. You brought that up last week, and I was under the impression that after further investigation on my side and further communication, that that was a previous issue that had been settled last April, where the State deeded that down to a — seems to be some discussion about whether it's six feet or 10 feet, but that deed was recorded as of last April.

17	MR. PROKOP: Well, it's actually there was
18	a deed that was recorded, but it's actually in
19	litigation now. The Village is claiming in that
20	litigation that it has a 20-foot right-of-way. So
21	I don't think that I don't think the Planning
22	Board would approve an application with a 10-foot
23	right-of-way while the Village Board is litigating
24	that it has a 20-foot right-of-way.
25	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Can we do that

conditionally, though, because I don't think his 1 2 activities go that far into the --MR. PROKOP: As long as it was done by --CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Yeah, I think we could 4 5 make that a condition of it. MR. DOWLING: His site plan doesn't go over 6 that 20-foot line. 7 MR. 13	MR. WILE: Yes, an owner.
14	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: And as a tenant?
15	MR. WILE: As a tenant, we obviously would
16	love to know if the Village was intending to put a
17	10-foot wall that obscured the view of the water,
18	but we're not looking to clutter the space. You
19	could see it's a fairly
20	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Well, then that's
21	something you should write into your lease, you
22	know.
23	MR. WILE: Yeah. I would, frankly, leave it
24	to the landlords to make sure that they sort that
25	out. But, as you could see, I think on our site

1 plan, we don't encroach even --

2 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Right.

3 MR. WILE: — into that 20-foot zone even as

4 is, you know.

	5	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Do you have the copy of
	6	that?
	7	MR. DOWLING: Of what, the

	22	CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: To the extent that it's a
	23	restaurant. I mean, I see it
	24	MR. WILE: I would say I would be very
	25	hesitant to call it a restaurant.

- 1 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Call it a restaurant, 2 right.
- 3 MR. WILE: Truthfully --
- 4 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: But, I mean, just in terms
- of your hours, you know, if it's going to be like
- 6 11 a.m. until the evening or --
- 7 MR. WILE: Yeah.
- 8 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Then that's the time
- 9 somebody's going to be there on site handling food
- 10 and customers.
- 11 MR. WILE: Exactly.
- 12 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: And you expect that to
- occur on a seven-day-a-week basis during the
- 14 season? Or tell me.
- 15 MR. WILE: Yeah, I think —— you know, I think
- 16 during the summer and —— late summer through the
- fall season, we would expect a Wednesday through
- 18 Saturday operation like that, with Sunday
- 19 afternoons.
- 20 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Okay. So --
- 21 MR. WILE: We will be using the space during
- the week for our own use. This is still the
- 23 headquarters for the farm and there's a lot of
- packing, shipping and paperwork, you know.

1 MR. WILE: It would become the de facto 2 headquarters for us. 3 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Oh, okay. 4 MR. WILE: So we can represent ourselves, and 5 make phone calls, and handle our own marketing needs, and things like that. That's -- we don't 6 7 have --CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: And then occasional --8 9 MR. WILE: It's just two people, so that's very simple. 10 CHAIRMAN JAUQUET: Right. And then, 11 12 occasionally, there'll -- the seating arrangement 13 and the configuration is basically going to change 14 for the classroom type seminars? 15 MR. WILE: Right. I've indicated on that 16 sample calendar, for example, there's a documentary 17 that's touring the country now about the resurgence 18 of small shellfish farms called Shellshocked. We'd

love to have them come in, present their film, and,

you know, run it, project it on a wall inside the

21	space and have people, and that would be an evening
22	event, you know, so I could see that. I'd like to
23	see that activity.
24	One of the big reasons for us there is we'd
