1	DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: I will call
2	the Regular Meeting of the Village Board
3	to order at 6:40. Stand for salute to the
4	flag.
5	(Whereupon, all stood followed by a
6	Moment of Silence.)
7	DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: Okay. We have
8	a couple of announcements. The Greenport
9	Fire Department annual iWashingtonís
10	Birthdayî parade and celebration is
11	scheduled for February 14, 2015. Last
12	month, that was stated with the wrong
13	date. So that is the corrected date.
14	Community Events: The Village Offices
15	will be closed on February on February
16	16th in honor of Presidentís Day. The
17	February work session meeting will be held
18	on February 17, 2015.
19	Election 2015: A Village election

20	Will be neld on March 18, 2015 for the
21	positions of Mayor and two Trustees.
22	There will be two Village voter
23	Registration Days, March 5th from 8:30
24	a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and March 7th, from
25	11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The Clerkís Office
	January 28, 2015 Regular Meeting
1	is accepting absentee ballot applications
2	for the March 18, 2015 election.
3	We were going to have a presentation
4	from Bill Freitag, from SAGS BST on our
5	audit but with the schedule change they
6	are going to be here on Monday. They were
7	down. They did some work and left before
8	the storm. So they will not be here.
9	That has been postponed. So we will
10	reschedule it when we can work it out with

15	Mark Chandler. I live at 70 Beach Street
16	in Greenport. I wanted to take the
17	opportunity to address a couple of more
18	points with respect to one of the
19	resolutions that is up for vote tonight,
20	that is the Resolution #17, regarding the
21	wetlands permit for the Matassa property.
22	At the work session, a week or so ago, the
23	minutes of which are not available. So I
24	can't be perfectly precise about it.
25	There was a brief discussion about several
	7 20 . 2015 D 1 M

things relating to that property. I would like to clarify a couple of them, the fact that, Mr. Matassaís property is the subject of this application, is next door to his own property, which does have a large dock. Itís not something that he inspires to emulate. More importantly

then that, the question was raised about
the legality of the existing docks on that
side of the creek. I took the opportunity
to do some investigations in the Building
Department and I find that the dock that
exist at the present property, the subject
of this application, there is no permit
for that dock of any sort. Of any entity.
There are several aerial photos that were
available to the Suffolk County mapping
system and if you look at the property, in
1984, there appears to be a 10 foot dock
on the property. There is no permit or
application for that dock to exist. In
2001, the existing dock at the property
appears and there is no and itis
substantially larger. There is no
application or permit issued for the

enlargement and extension of that dock.

In 2010, a more recent picture, you will

see not only is there existing dock to the

Matassa property, to the west of the dock,

5	it has been installed with no permit and
6	no application for that property. And to
7	the east side, east of his original
8	property, that dock has been created with
9	no permits of any sort. Those are the
10	procedural dimensions for denying this
11	permit. Big boats belong elsewhere. Big
12	boats in shallow water do not belong in
13	that section of the creek. For all of
14	those reasons, I urge this Board to deny
15	the resolution that is up before you
16	tonight. Thank you.
17	DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: Anyone else
18	wish to speak?
19	MR. SALADINO: John Saladino, 6th
20	Street. Are there any resolutions on the
21	agenda that you are going to vote on?
22	DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: No. Not that
23	I know of.
24	MR. SALADINO: Is there Executive
25	Session?

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2	MR. SALADINO: The two resolutions
3	that I would like to talk to you about are
4	22 and 24. Resolution 22, the Board is to
5	authorize the Zoning Board and the HPC and
6	others, to provide their comments for the
7	Code Committee. Itís always been my
8	feeling that anybody who has any comments
9	should appear for the benefit of the
10	public. Itís not televised. So I was
11	kind of opposed to the statutory boards
12	being on the committee. If they were to
13	have particular concern for their Board,
14	they would say it here and the public
15	would hear the reasons behind it and
16	either agree or disagree. You are going
17	to poll and I am not even sure you are
18	going to poll all the members or just the
19	chairman, but I think the public would be
20	better served if the people that you are
21	asking their advise with, express it at a
22	Board meeting, before the camera and
23	before the public. Just so the people can
24	learn from it. That would also apply to
25	Resolution #24. You are asking for a 90

1	day public comment period. I kind of
2	think this is personal. There is no grey
3	area. Why would it be unreasonable to
4	have a public comment period as opposed to
5	90 days to submit emails, letter?
6	Sometimes with SPAM filters, emails are
7	disregarded. Just ask Sylvia to put it or
8	the agenda and have public comment period.
9	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Thatis what it
10	says.
11	MR. SALADINO: I don't mean that the
12	public comment period is open for 90 days
13	for people to submit emails. I meant that
14	in that period, people would come to a
15	public meeting. I am not sure if
16	DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: Well, I think
17	on both of them, John, they are trying to
18	get input first of what needs what
19	could possibly be done and then we would
20	have a public hearing after that. It has
21	to go through the process. #22, they are
22	the ones that deal with the signs all the
23	time. So for them to get all the

24 information and then have a public
25 hearing. To come up with something.

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1 TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: If I may just say, 2 and I think that Trustee Murray will agree 3 with me, was to help the Code Committee to 4 get out to the public in a bigger forum. 5 Especially on the MVAB to see how they felt about it. On #22, part of that was 6 7 brought up because we are looking to see 8 if that sign code is working for the 9 Board. To see if the code needs to be 10 tweaked or changed. That is one of the 11 reasons why they were asked, the Chairmans 12 to go back to the Board, for them to see 13 if they re any problems. I think this is 14 a way of getting different opinions, other 15 than those sitting the committee. 16

MR. SALADINO: I disagree. The Code Committee, a year — Trustee Murray's rental permit, took a year for it to come out of code. Eight months to get a ruling on Article 48, Boating. Just stating that

21	you need insurance to work on your boat.
22	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: John
23	MR. SALADINO: If I could just on
24	this one thought, putting the Board heads,
25	Zoning, HPC, unfortunately no body
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1	represents everyone interested has
2	their own heart. The Zoning guy is
3	interested in zoning. The HPC guy and you
4	guys are listening to that. If you guys
5	were to come here. I don't know why it
6	has to be a separate process. I know we
7	have this public meeting. And the truth
8	of the matter —— this is going to go to
9	the code committee and perhaps it will be
10	discussed that night at the work session.
11	You are talking about June or July or even
12	August. And then notice of public
13	hearing, you are talking about next year.
14	The people who have an investment, should
15	not have to weight nine months.
16	DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: We will try
17	and shorten the time period and bring it

18	to head even sooner.
19	MR. SALADINO: And thank you for
20	that. The last thing I would have. I was
21	at the work session and you were nice
22	enough to clarify the ferry, but the one
23	thing that you left out, there is no
24	agreement.
25	DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: Correct.

MR. SALADINO: Last year during
August, there was no agreement. I happen
to know two captains that were refused
dockage on the west pier even though there
was none. One went to North Sea and the
other one went to Sag Harbor. When I had
asked about it, I was told, the marina was
told not to rent that space. I found it
odd because there was no agreement in
place. So my question to you, there was
no agreement then and you chose not to
rent that space, and it cost the village,
at least in my mind, \$7–8,000.00. Is that
going to be the same position this summer

if there is no agreement? DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: There is room for one boat on there. MR. SALADINO: You can put a 120 foot boat on there. DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: Which we did have for two weeks last summer, which the boat did pay for that. The marine manager got phonically from the north ferry about it. We kept the boat there because there was a reason for it to be there. We try

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not to use it, only for liability purposes and everything else. We have had lawyers and every investigating, if something happens, who is responsible and that has not been resolved yet.

MR. SALADINO: I had a conversation with you and you said that one lawyer said they were entitled to keep the boat there and one said he wasn't quite sure. One guy says, yeah. And one guy says, maybe. But, I am looking at resolutions \$200.00

12	and \$500.00 and \$10.00 raise there. This
13	could be a lot of money for the Village.
14	Boat of those boats were over 100 feet.
15	If you do the numbers, thatis a lot of
16	money. Thank you.
17	DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: Anybody else
18	who wishes to address the Board?
19	MS. HORTON: Can I just stand up and
20	state a historical fact?
21	DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: Go ahead.
22	MS. HORTON: My name is Gail Horton
23	1st Street, Greenport. Itis about the
24	Railroad Standard Hose. I was told by
25	many fireman, that itis over there because
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of the train that could possible -- this 1 is many years ago, that could possible 2 3 break off fire trucks from getting here and to a fire on the other side of the 4 5 Town. I assume that we have shorter trains. Thatis all I wanted to say. 6 7 DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: Thank you. Okay. I want to thank everybody that got 8

their cars off the road during the recent
storm. Thank you everybody to move their
cars. Most of the roads were clear the
night of the storm. The Village crew did
a wonderful job during the storm,
preparing for it and now cleaning up
downtown. Started up at Third Street and
working downtown to the district. They
are working most of the day today and down
tomorrow and getting the piles of snow out
of there. So I wanted to thank all the
people that did it. Our electric guys did
stand by at the power plant in case
something did happen. Power stayed on.
The roads stood clear. Everybody was able
to get through. I just wanted to thank
all of them publicly. They did a great

job. I know they missed their families

and their families missed them, but they

went above and beyond and they are still

doing a cleanup now. So a big thank you

5 to all of our Village workers.

6	TRUSTEE ROBINS: Can I also comment?
7	That prior to the storm on Monday, I was
8	at Village Hall. Clerk Pirillo and her
9	staff were at Village Hall getting all
10	press releases out and getting statements
11	out next day. When the State of Emergency
12	was going to go into effect and for people
13	to be off the roads. Also earlier in the
14	day, our code enforcement was out there
15	putting little pink slips on the cars
16	asking people to please move their cars.
17	And actually going the extra distance to
18	knock on doors for the people that were
19	not responded. He did try and go a little
20	easy at first and warn people that their
21	car might be towed and eventually put a
22	notice of it on it this morning that the
23	cars would be towed. I just wanted to
24	point out that Clerk Pirillo called PLNG.
25	DEPUTY MAYOR HUBBARD: I did not mean

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to slight Sylvia. She came to my house 1 with the State of Emergency paperwork to

3	sign it and get it going. When I said,
4	Village workers, I did not single her out.
5	CLERK PIRILLO: Thank you.
