MAYOR NYCE: Today is May 29, 2012. Mr.

Prokop is not with us tonight. It being now

just after six p.m. and I will call this

meeting to order. Please stand and join us in

the Pledge of Allegiance.

(Whereupon the Board and Public stood for the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.)

Thank you. You may be seated.

So before we get into the two public hearings, a continuation and a public hearing, I have a couple of announcements. First, is that the Relay for Life will be held this coming weekend. June 2 overnight into June 3 at Jean Cochran Park. They raise money for cancer research and it's a wonderful cause. If you can and have the time it's a great event so go and participate. The Village will be a co-hosting a fishing tournament June 15 through the 17. Co-hosted with the American Legion Hall. I should just let you do this. What are they fishing for?

MR. MURRAY: It's going to be a tournament based on fishing for Stripers, Bluefish and there is going to be three categories; fly rod,

1 light tackle and heavy weight, and we are going 2 to be working with the American Legion Hall. 3 We are also going to have the dinner Saturday night at the Hanffs Boatyard where the Costello's are putting on the fish fry's and we 5 6 will have some conversation about that. It's 7 going to be an all weekend, Friday, Saturday 8 and Sunday tournament.

MAYOR NYCE: Sounds like a wonderful event. Good luck with that.

MR. MURRAY: Thanks.

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MAYOR NYCE: Another announcement. May is building safety month. Please ensure your smoke and CO detectors in your house are in proper working order. It would be a good time to check the batteries and change them out around your house and keep them updated for safety. We suggest you take care of.

The next few are a couple updates for the Board. Osprey Zoned Wetlands Permit

Application was going to have their public hearing tonight sent a letter requesting a postponement. If the Board has not objection

I'm going to add a resolution to the agenda at the front of the agenda to notice, have the

clerk notice the public hearing for the 25 of June at six p.m. Does anyone have an objection to that being done? No, okay.

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The next one is the group that has purchased the old Chowder Pot Pub called, "The Blue Canoe, " has asked as they are getting their business open and ready for the season if the Board would consider waving the thirty day notification required by the State Liquor Authority for a new liquor license application. We can discuss this under announcements and if the public wanted to weigh in they could as well. My feeling is if we can get another business up and running in the Village it would be a privilege. I understand we have rules and procedures with the State Liquor Authority for notification. We also know that that premises there had their liquor license already, as it's a new bar but not really it's sort of a re-up. Does the Board have any comment or any problems with the offering to the resident to waive that thirty day notification period?

None? Then I will offer that resolution before we get started on the regular meeting.

The last announcement is concerning this

past weekend and the Tall Ships event that First of all I am very tired. transpired. There aren't enough thanks around to thank particularly the volunteers. One of them is sitting there. John worked tirelessly all weekend long for no money directing people It was a massive event and I through ships. think the sponsors did a fantastic job. The management staff worked all weekend. people that we hired to do the event did a spectacular job as well. I think the event came together fairly well and the event a success. There will be a full accounting at the next monthly meeting as we did not have time to get all of the materials calculated all the revenues counted but I'm fairly confident in saying we at least broke even. So far we are trying to figure out the net overages but we are confident that we at least broke even and what additional revenues from the sponsors that were acknowledged, and we are also waiting for bills to come in that were not on the The clerks office is doing their best agenda. to make sure that everything is being done as well as for support. We will get through this.

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I am proud of our Village. I am very proud of everybody. Everybody stepped up and the people who came here want us to do this every year. I said, no. But it was a spectacular event overall and thanks to all who participated.

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With that we have two public hearings. First is the continuation of the Exxon-Mobil conservation easement hearing. Prior to reopening that I will say that Trustee Kempner and I have had an opportunity to meet Exxon-Mobil one additional time to discuss the cleanup of the property there and I would like to basically reframe the discussion before we open it up for public comment. Really all we are looking for is whether this Board wants to participate in this conversation. We know that the property owner has the right to transfer his property and create a conservation easement for the property in the town of Southold without there say so. We discussed and they heard our request about to loss of tax revenue on the property. We again are not -- there is nothing we can do to maintain that tax revenue. The property owner has the right to do with that property what they are proposing to do

- within the law. With that I will open it up to
 the public. Is there anyone from the public
 that wishes to address the Board and their
 comments will be taken down for the public
 record at this time?
 - MR. SWISKEY: William Swiskey. 184 Fifth Street. Trustee Kempner had asked the DEC for a review of the file, well after she did that I talked and I actually e-mailed the DEC to see the file under the Freedom of Information Act but they still haven't responded which is strange, they should have responded by now. I would be a little cautious in making something going on. As soon as I get a response Chris, I'll let you know.

MAYOR NYCE: Is there anyone else that wishes to address the Board on this?

If not I'll entertain a motion to close this public hearing.

MR. MURRAY: I'll make a motion to close this public hearing.

MAYOR NYCE: Is there a second?

MR. HUBBARD: Second.

24 MAYOR NYCE: All in favor?

THE BOARD: Aye.

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MR. NYCE: Any opposed or abstentions?

That hearing is closed, and again time wise they are going to do what they are going to do. They will allow us to participate in this conservation if we choose to. Do we want to discuss that at our next work session?

MS. PHILLIPS: Yes.

MAYOR NYCE: So we will put it on next months agenda. I don't think it will change the time frame for them to move ahead one way or the other by June but we should be okay. All right. We will make sure it's on the next work session.

The next public hearing is on the proposed local law amending Chapter 105 of the Sewer Code for the Village of Greenport. This is an updating of the code that we already have for cross connection, backflow prevention in the Village of Greenport. It pertains to commercial properties as I understand it. Primarily this is to prevent anyone from having any backflow go into the public water supply from this common source. This public hearing has been properly noticed. Anyone wishing to make a comment can do so at this time and they

will be taken down for the record. Is there any correspondence?

THE CLERK: No, sir.

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MAYOR NYCE: Is there anyone here at this public hearing who wishes to address the Board on this local law?

MR. MOORE: Doug Moore. 145 Sterling I'm a member of the Zoning Board of Street. Appeals as Chair. And in that position now am a member of the Code Committee. I think this translation passed through before I became a member as far as discussion. Normally I would come in after it was directed back to Code Committee but I think there are a few suggestions for the legislation. First of all I'm not familiar with what section of the code that actually already exists and sits in whether or not it's in Section 105 or not. looked on line in the E360 but I didn't find 105 refers to sewers that is actually it. potable water so perhaps it should be with the water section within the Village Code, just as a suggestion. Or rename the sewer section of the code to include potable water because of this cross connection with the water supply.

One issue that I think is missing is on the second page, "New Commercial Buildings." I think we should also have some version in there that should include marina property. That is one very important cross connection in support of Greenport marina. There is a reference for residential accounts and was requiring check variances, I believe and I have to question why check variances are installed in residential properties when there is no attic. Doesn't seem to make much sense especially when there are no such variances for commercial property and they may be excused from having cross flow protection.

MAYOR NYCE: I had asked them to start doing this in stages. There is already code wording that is used for commercial property and did not include residential. That's what this is about.

MR. MOORE: And then it mentions the RPZ devices for much of the heating enclosure for above the ground, I don't know if that is the right syntax, an above ground heater as opposed to one beneath the ground.

MAYOR NYCE: Above ground vault.

MR. MOORE: Yes, I don't know where that
heater would be. But just on Page (4) there is
a typo at the top of test score. The main
point that I would make is that I think that
you should have specific versions including
residential as it is in the code to improve
operations.

MAYOR NYCE: That is an important issue.

Thank you.

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Is there anyone else that wishes to address the Board on this?

MR. SWISKEY: Somebody pointed out to me about 105-42,D, Residential accounts with no degree of hazard will be required to have dual checks done. So what are you talking about every house in the Village.

MAYOR NYCE: The question has been asked and answered and I would ask that you please move on.

MR. SWISKEY: I didn't get an answer.

MAYOR NYCE: Yes, you did. Residential is not supposed to be in this code.

MR. SWISKEY: So then --

MAYOR NYCE: I will be asking for that portion to be removed before we take action.

1 MR. SWISKEY: All right. Thank you.

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2 MAYOR NYCE: Anyone else wishing to address 3 the board?

> John Munn (Phonetic), Greenport, MR. MUNN: Last year I had a sprinkler system and I had to back it off the regular system. They put in on a separate meter and I don't understand the accounting. Like it might be after the season was over I requested can I take the meter out for the time I am not using it, So I don't get a multiple service fee for the extra meter being that I don't use it for nine months. I know there might be fees for the Village to come in and take it out and then put it back in or whatever but it might be cheaper to do that than just leave it there for nine months and not use it. So again I don't know if this is even part of that but I have been looking for an answer on that.

MAYOR NYCE: I will see that you get an answer on that particular. I think we had a couple of other people ask about that on Sandy Beach etc, etc. I am working with the water department to come up with an answer for you as to whether there is a fee or whether there is

1	no fee, and what that would be and it might
2	make more sense for those customers to have us
3	remove and reinstall that meter at the end and
4	beginning of the season less the monthly
5	license. Thank you.
6	Is there anyone that wishes to address the
7	Board on this item?
8	If not the Board at this time will discuss
9	whether to close this public hearing or have it
10	remain open. We may have to redo it but change
11	the wording.
12	MS. PHILLIPS: That's what I was thinking.

Street. A few days ago I got my hands on basic

Bond provisions about four pages. I was leafing through it and I remember exactly the answers after everybody had asked their questions at the budget hearing and it was residential and no fire department bonds involved in this refinancing. Don't quote me on that but I asked people what they said. But if we refinance the fire department bonds from three hundred and thirty some thousand dollars I mean some of this equipment may be worn out before these twelve year extension on these bonds are paid for. And also I notice the bonding is for 4,190,000 and the final payout is well over five million there is not much achieving and some of the interest rates well above 3.0 that I noticed. I would urge that the Board sit down with the treasurer and Munistat and get the full facts because full facts actually weren't present at that meeting.

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MAYOR NYCE: Anyone else wishing to address the Board?

MR. MUNN: I was down at the Fifth Street

Park last week and I noticed somebody actually,

I think it was copper cables that were cut all

along and a braided metal cover that was around

those cables and whoever stole the wire left all this mesh that they took off the cables on It's sharp and I know that that the beach. beach is getting used this summer with kids. Ι think it's a concern and when Verizon came in to do whatever they had to do they left these two big junction boxes right on the beach with the cable hanging out laying there, they didn't cut them up or anything, they didn't cover them It's really a mess. The wires are all up. over and just hanging there and somebody could get poked in the eye with it. So I think we should contact Verizon.

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MAYOR NYCE: We did and they didn't do anything so maybe they need another call or something. We know there is a problem. Right. Thank you.

Is there anyone else that wishes to address the Board? If not, we will move to our regular agenda. Before I do that Residence 24, when we get to it I am going to offer a motion to rescind. Signid Burton would like to serve on the Planning Board but at the moment unfortunately her mother is ill and lives in California. She is not sure of what amount of

time she will be able to spend so would like additional time. So I'm frantically looking for members for this Planning Board. At this point I don't know if we have enough for a quorum. It's desperate. If Anybody sees they have time for the meetings please let me know if you are interested.
