1	MAYOR NYCE: Being six o'clock, I
2	will call this November meeting of the
3	Board of Trustees open. Please rise for
4	the Pledge of Allegiance.
5	(Whereupon, all rose for the Pledge
6	of Allegiance followed by a Moment of
7	Silence for Theodore Charles Henkel,
8	William J. Kart, Carol B.)
9	MAYOR NYCE: A couple of
10	announcements. The Christmas Parade will
11	be held on December 9th, beginning at
12	1:00 P.M. Starts at the school and goes
13	to Main to Center and back down to IGA,
14	South Street and back up to the
15	firehouse. That is the route that kids
16	can all meet Santa here at the firehouse.
17	Village Hall will be closed on
18	Christmas and New Year's days, and will
19	be open for half-day's on Christmas Eve
20	and New Year's Eve.
21	The December regular meeting of the
22	Board of Trustees will be held on
23	December 26, 2012 here at the Third
24	Street Firehouse.

1	seasonal, part-time help at the ice rink.
2	If anyone is interested, please call the
3	main number at Village Hall, #477-0248,
4	and ask for the Village Administrator's
5	Office. They will be doing the hiring.
6	As our monthly reminders, please
7	create a Fire Safety Program for your
8	family. Please be sure to check the
9	batteries in your smoke and CO detectors.
10	Now people with these closed up houses,
11	it's important to make sure that those
12	batteries are checked and are in the
13	right places and working order. We would
14	also like to express our condolences to
15	the Bounty crew members, family members,
16	the organization. And we are planning
17	very loosely at this point, a memorial
18	service of some sort to be held for the
19	Bounty. Probably this summer. With
20	their back offices and crew members and
21	other ship captains that have sailed with
22	the Bounty, to try and create something
23	for some sort of memorial here in the
24	Village, as we were their home port and

1	captain that were lost. We will keep you
2	posted and that happens.
3	I would like to ask the Walden
4	Family to join me up here at the podium.
5	I have to say, that I am sorry that this
6	is happening posthumously, but it came to
7	my attention that your husband was never
8	recognized by the Village for his years
9	of service as the Chief of Police here in
10	the Village of Greenport. I have a
11	proclamation from the Village Board, that
12	I would like to read.
13	Whereas, the Village of Greenport
14	wishes to recognize outstanding
15	participation for the better of our
16	community, and further, to commend
17	members of our Village that give back to
18	their community for their expertise,
19	time, effort and energy, and further,
20	thank said people for their selfless and
21	community minded spirit and, WHEREAS,
22	Robert Walden, who was for 31 years the
23	Chief of Village of Greenport Police

24	Department, and who was for three years a
25	member of the Greenport Fire Department,

1	as well as serving in other numerous
2	volunteer capacities, in this
3	selflessness community minded spirit.
4	THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the
5	Village of Greenport Board of Trustees
6	wishes to offer this proclamation and
7	accomodation to the family of Robert
8	Walden for his service to our village
9	with our deepest gratitude.
10	MRS. WALDEN: Thank you.
11	MAYOR NYCE: Also, as you are all
12	well aware, we did just come through some
13	substantial storms. And I thought that
14	it would be fitting to recognize the
15	groups that got us through it. It's a
16	lot of planning. The management did an
17	absolutely fantastic job in the planning
18	and preparation, but at that point, you
19	just deal with what the storm gives you
20	and clean-up afterwards. And I would
21	like to at this point, recognize, our
22	Village crews. I see some members of the
23	Light Department. If you guys could

24	stand	and	ίf	you	could	join	me	up	here.

Jim, do you want to come up, I have

1	a proclamation for you guys. You guys
2	went above and beyond. Anybody that sees
3	these guys, give them a waive or a
4	thanks. It's amazing.
5	WHEREAS, the Village of Greenport
6	Board of Trustees wishes to recognize
7	outstanding effort on behalf of our
8	community.
9	And WHEREAS, actions taken to help
10	the safety and welfare of our residents
11	is of primary importance.
12	FURTHER, that these actions,
13	although they may be part or in the
14	course of daily living, or course of
15	work, it should be held in the highest
16	regard, and,
17	FURTHER, when under the extreme
18	conditions, extra effort is required and
19	applied, and,
20	WHEREAS, the beginning of the 27th
21	of October, 2012, Hurricane Sandy hit our
22	area causing severe damage and the

23 potential for disaster.

24 WHEREAS, the actions taken by the25 Village of Greenport Electrical

1 Department personnel did with immediate 2 and efficient response to mitigate 3 damage, nullify the potential of personal harm and limit the hazardous preparation 4 5 for during the course of and after the 6 storm. 7 THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the 8 Village of Greenport Mayor and members of the Board of Trustees wishes to confer 9 10 upon the staff of the Village of 11 Greenport Electrical Department, this 12 proclamation of accomodation on behalf of 13 the entire community, for their actions above and beyond the call, with our 14 sincerest thanks and respect. 15 16 This is our newest lineman, Doug Jacobs. I do have some for our sewer. 17 They are not here. So I will not read 18 19 those. They all read pretty much the 20 same. 21 Chief, it's pretty much the same 22 thing. Our sincerest thanks to the

23	police department for all their planning
24	and preparation that goes on. You worked
25	very closely with the Village of

1	Greenport and while I was not able,
2	because I was sick, during the
3	preparation, the best way to prepare
4	talking on the phone and talking your
5	brains out. I was on the phone with the
6	Chief constantly who was updating us
7	constantly on what was going on. So me
8	and the supervisor were there, and
9	through the entire event there was
10	constant communication. We knew they had
11	our back and vice versa. And we have a
12	proclamation for you as well, for the
13	Southold Town Police Department with our
14	sincerest thanks.
15	I also have for our fire departments
16	and rescue squads. I don't see the Chief
17	here. So I will give that to them later.
18	We have one more. As I said, I
19	thanked our management. They did an
20	outstanding job. Jack, the Director of
21	Utilities. Dave Abatelli as the Village

22	Administrator, Charlene Charlene
23	called me in the middle of the storm and
24	said, "I think I can make sure that
25	payroll gets out on time." Which was the

1	last thing that I was thinking of. And
2	Sylvia as well. They all worked
3	tirelessly through it, as I expect them
4	to. They're paid very well. They did
5	job. They did their job extremely well.
6	For that, I am really proud and thankful.
7	This is proclamation is for the Village
8	Clerk, because above and beyond that, she
9	and Trustee Hubbard made sure that the
10	shelter was fine. It was one of those
11	things that we do, but if someone doesn't
12	pick it up and do it, it will go to the
13	waist side and doesn't get done. I spoke
14	to somebody today, who went on about what
15	a wonderful experience it was to be in
16	that shelter. They felt safe. They felt
17	secure. It was quiet, organized, and so
18	Sylvia, if you could join me up here. I
19	would like to present this proclamation
20	to you, for your actions above and beyond
21	the Village calling.

22	Deputy Mayor George Hubbard is the
23	other management officer, and it was a
24	heck of a couple of days, and without his
25	help in doing that and picking up the

1	stuff that I couldn't do, we would not
2	have gotten through as we did. And I
3	want to thank you, as well as the rest of
4	the Board for all the support. I got
5	calls from all the Board members, texts,
6	calls, throughout the entire event. It
7	really was a cohesive effort. So thank
8	you very much.
9	Our next agenda item is presentation
10	on financial's. The audit that was done
11	by Bollam, Sheedy & Torani, and I will
12	turn the podium over Mr. Freitag.
13	MR. FREITAG: I thought those
14	proclamations were a very nice thing. My
15	presentation will not be as nice. Again,
16	I am Bill; Freitag, I am a partner with
17	the firm, BST in New York, and with
18	offices also in New York City. This
19	presentation will be a brief overview of
20	the audit of the fiscal year ending May

21	31, 2012. We were at the Village during
22	the month of July to perform the Electric
23	Fund Audit. And again in the early part
24	of August, we came down again to perform
25	the rest of the audit for the Village

1	funds, as well as prepare a sync audit.
2	During the August time period through
3	October, we worked diligently with the
4	Treasurer's Office to wrap up some of the
5	older items that were from the last one
6	in August. And I have to say, that we
7	issued the finance reports, that are in
8	front of you, on November 5, 2012 after
9	your review and approval of the drafts.
10	And I am believe that is the only issue
11	that was over the last six or seven
12	years. One of the other things that I
13	wanted to point out was the Power
14	Authority report, that report was filed
15	on time by August 31st, also for the
16	first time in several years. The audit
17	went very well. We appreciate all the
18	efforts from the Treasurer's Office and
19	the rest of the Village staff who
20	afforded us great hospitality and

21 insight.

22	Just going to give you a general
23	summary of the audit. Going to jump
24	around. We do a compliance audit, which
25	shows how they administrate, specifically

1	under the Section VIII housing. As a we
2	complete the audit, we issue what is
3	called a well qualified opinion on the
4	highest level of assurance you can get
5	from CPA firm. So your financial
6	statements for the year ending May 2012,
7	are materially correct as set forth by
8	your guidelines. As we have done most
9	audits, we do basic adjustments. When we
10	get here, we present with the accounting
11	records. We do a verify and checking
12	function and a propose adjustments with a
13	concurrence of the Treasurer's
14	department, and the Board. Our checking
15	function increases the fund balance of
16	about \$400,000.00. As with most
17	audits, we come across some
18	observations and basic recommendations
19	and suggestions. There are about four or

20	five of what we consider minor
21	recommendations. Just to get tightener
22	control with the funds. If you go to
23	Page 9 first, which is the Electric
24	Fund income statement. The Electric
25	Fund had another very strong year. From

1	what was put into four years ago, it
2	allows the Electric Fund to increase.
3	There as \$300,000.00 of gross revenue.
4	So last year, it was around \$500,000.00.
5	The revenues were down 5%, as well as
6	kilowatt unsafe by customers. This
7	reduction was brought in by the net
8	reduction in household income. As a
9	result, operational balances increased
10	about \$300,000.00. When you look at the
11	cash balances, it represents about five
12	months worth of cash balances of fund
13	operational costs. If you go to Page 6,
14	the water fund has no long term debt as
15	of May 31st. So those cash balances are
16	not marked for debt services. You do
17	still have a long term receivable from
18	the electric fund which was outstanding
19	for about ten years now. When the

20	electric fund was having struggles, they
21	borrowed money for the electric fund.
22	There is an position that you are paying
23	back \$10,000.00 every year plus interest.
24	And you are sitting at \$125,000.00. That
25	has come down significant over the last

1	couple of years. The sewer fund is
2	\$31,000.00 net income. The sewer fund
3	has a lot of depreciation expenses. It's
4	a non-cash item. If you strip out
5	\$174,000.00 you would really be sitting
6	on a cash balance of about \$24,000.00.
7	Operating cash balances is about
8	\$600,000.00 which is about a \$50,000.00
9	increase. Recreation fund reported a
10	\$213,000.00 net loss for the year.
11	However, a big chuck of that was related
12	to the big depreciation expense of
13	\$158,000.00. So going on the whole cash
14	basis of a net loss, you are sitting on
15	about a \$55,000.00. Why is that greater
16	than the prior year? Gross revenue was
17	down, which was primarily made of the
18	marina, carousel. Marina increased about

19	\$60,000.00 over the year. Recreation
20	fund, one of the expenses is debt
21	services and that is because of the
22	transfer from the General Fund.
23	MAYOR NYCE: I just have a question
24	on that General Fund. Those expenses,
25	year by year, we have a bunch of people

1	pre-pay. There has been a fluctuation of
2	the past, because we had the pre-pays.
3	Is it possible that we are a little low
4	because of the pre-pays for the same
5	reason?
6	MR. FREITAG: Yes. So I think that
7	you are dealing with true apples to
8	apples. I am not exactly sure. The
9	General Fund operated on a surplus of
10	about \$314,000.00. Most of what that
11	comes from, you budgeted one number and
12	when those results came, in this case,
13	about \$200,000.00 above. So you have
14	favorable variances going on in the
15	positive side, which is a plus. As of
16	May 31, 2012, the General Fund continues
17	to have bonds. The General Fund has
18	about \$750,000.00 worth of bonds

19	outstanding. Not taking into
20	consideration the recreational debt. The
21	General Fund is sitting on \$2.9 million.
22	Also, there were no deposits that sit out
23	there that were potential to risks. The
24	total debt of the Village sits on about
25	\$9 million dollars. About \$3 million in

1	bands, \$5 1/2 million in bonds and
2	\$100,000.00 in State funds related to the
3	sewer project. The refinancing was
4	probably one of the most beneficial
5	things the Village could have done to
6	correct itself. That was extremely
7	beneficial. I think the Village had a
8	very positive year. I think you also
9	have a positive outlook for the future.
10	Especially the electrical department, has
11	a positive outlook. That's really it.
12	Any questions?
13	(No Response.)
14	MR. FREITAG: Thank you very much.
15	I do hope everyone has a very Happy
16	Holidays.
17	MAYOR NYCE: Thank you.

18	The next portion of our agenda is
19	the Public Portion. I will say, there is
20	a resolution that has been passed to the
21	Trustees that has been brought to my
22	attention today that we adopted a
23	resolution in August placing a moratorium
24	on subdivision and subdivision
25	applications, which expires the end of

1	this month. The attorney has provided
2	the Board with a resolution that will
3	amend that and extend it till March 31,
4	2013. The reason for March 31st is that
5	you will see on the agenda, we have a
6	public hearing. So this will be to add
7	to our code. Other than that, the agenda
8	is pretty much the way that it is.
9	So I will ask if there is anyone
10	that wishes to address the Board?
11	MR. SWISKEY: My name is William
12	Swiskey 184 Fifth Street. This has to do
13	with a couple of items about the Tall
14	Ships Festival and the revenues. For
15	months and months, I was told no such
16	document existed. That I even appealed
17	to the honorable attorney there and on

- 18 October 11th he sent me a letter,
- basically there are no records in Village
 Offices for this. So being the
 persistent type, I put in a FOIL for the
 Treasurer's Office and long and behold,
 this document that the Board or Mr.
 Prokop said didn't exist, suddenly
 existed. Maybe incompetence or maybe I

1	was lied to. So I would like to know,
2	how this document, because I was told by
3	two public officials who are sworn to
4	uphold the law when you take the oath,
5	and one of them is an attorney, and is
6	telling me that no record exist in the
7	office, and then we have this record.
8	But we also have all these redaction and
9	some of them for expenses. So you can't
10	when you spend money, you can't keep
11	it from the public. You can't redact it.
12	So I would like to know you can sit
13	there all you want, Mr. Mayor, but this
14	is a document that for many months I was
15	told did not exist. I would like
16	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Can I answer him?

17	MR. SWISKEY: Yes, go ahead.
18	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Bill in all
19	honesty, after Mr. Freedman's
20	presentation, there was an e-mail that
21	was sent to the Village Treasurer and
22	Village Board, requesting the document
23	you have in your hand now. Up until that
24	date, there was no such report.
25	MR. SWISKEY: I find that hard to

1	believe.
2	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Well, I would be
3	more than happy to send you a copy of the
4	e-mail.
5	MR. SWISKEY: I just don't believe
6	Mr. Prokop said that no such document
7	exist. I mean, your Treasurer's Office
8	had no documents. No nothing. I mean,
9	it's boggles my mind. If you choose to
10	take that path, then it's your privilege.
11	Another thing here, another mistake that
12	was made by the Mayor of this Board about
13	the plant being operational. Clearly,
14	it's not. It's been down since they took
15	the deed out of it. That is way back in
16	the end of May. When they tried to

17	restart it out, and I guess they blew a
18	transformer or something. So without
19	that engine, that can't be operational.
20	How do I get a reasonable answer on how \ensuremath{I}
21	was lied to, because I was lied too?
22	MAYOR NYCE: Does someone else wish
23	to address the Board?
24	MS. PASARELLI: My name is Cynthia
25	Pasarelli. I would really like to

1	address this question to Mr. Hubbard.
2	Mr. Hubbard, do you mind?
3	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: Go ahead.
4	MS. PASARELLI: I have only been
5	here eight years and I have been here
6	full-time. Since I have been there, I
7	have tried to understand the logic of the
8	problems of a street. I was here last
9	month and raised some issues. I am only
10	going to address one tonight. I would
11	like you to explain to me, what is the
12	process this has no reflection on the
13	Village of Greenport, but Main Street and
14	FirstI had to trim my hedges because I
15	am painting my house. I am getting such

16	a view of this. People are constantly
17	driving the wrong way. I know it's a lot
18	to ask for a police car to sit there. I
19	do see them around the Village. It's a
20	tiny Village. I know every street is
21	important. I know every person is
22	important. I pay taxes. I appreciate my
23	community very, very much. But I am
24	frustrated how this is being done so
25	slow. I am not used to that. I own my

1	own business. If there is a problem, it
2	gets addressed and we move along. I
3	don't understand how people are being
4	allowed but I find it extraordinary,
5	the individuals not behaving to the rules
6	and regulations and ethics. So I am
7	just hear to ask, can somebody just give
8	me an answer. I don't want anyone to get
9	hurt. It implores me, I follow the
10	rules. I have not been given a ticket in
11	a really, really long time. Not since I
12	was a teenager when I was going too fast
13	on 95. There are some things that are
14	wrong and that they are overlooked. So
15	Mr. Hubbard, at some point, can you meet

16	with me and let me know what is going to
17	take place?
18	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: Sure. I can give
19	you a brief answer right now. I was
20	there yesterday. Every time I leave my
21	house, somebody comes out the wrong way.
22	I go like this. The reason we always
23	change this, is because the reason what
24	we are talking about. People trying to
25	cut all the way across. At the same

1	time, they go so far out. They can't get
2	it. I was going to my moms house to get
3	coffee in the morning, and I had to slam
4	on the brakes and stop. Put my hands up
5	and they look at me, like what did I do.
6	They go the wrong way. How do you
7	control peoples driving ethics? I don't
8	know. If there is no signs at the
9	cemetery
10	MS. PASARELLI: There are two signs
11	there that say, Do Not Enter. There was
12	a very significant sign, that said "One
13	Way". That was removed.
14	MAYOR NYCE: We will get those signs

15 replaced.

16	MS. PASARELLI: It just boggles my
17	mind.
18	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: A lot of people
19	don't pay
20	MS. PASARELLI: But I do think it's
21	incumbent upon us, because we are a small
22	community and we need to get this
23	resolved.
24	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: I will go down and
25	check it in the morning.

1	MS. PASARELLI: You know where I
2	live.
3	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: Yes, I do.
4	MS. PASARELLI: Thank you very much.
5	MAYOR NYCE: Is there anyone that
6	wishes to address the Board?
7	MR. SALADINO: I wasn't going to
8	comment this evening because the Mayor
9	was nice about the resolution. In the
10	interest of full disclosure, I just
11	looked at that document that Bill has,
12	and Mr. Freedman was here in October. I
13	was at the meeting. Trustee Phillips just
14	said that was form was generated after

15	TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: That was the
16	report that I generated by e-mail the
17	next day because Mr. Swiskey was upset
18	that he had not received that document.
19	So I asked for a copy. I asked for it to
20	be generated. That is the report that I
21	received.
22	MR. SALADINO: The report is dated
23	August 31st.
24	TRUSTEE KEMPNER: Yeah. I actually
25	have a copy of that report.

1	MAYOR NYCE: I will give the same
2	explanation that I gave to the paper last
3	week.
4	MR. SALADINO: I do attend the
5	meetings. Since there was a little bit of
6	confusion about when this report was
7	generated, I thought I would address the
8	Board.
9	MAYOR NYCE: Is there anyone else
10	that wishes to address the Board?
11	If not, that will conclude the
12	public portion. As to the power plant
13	transformer, I believe you are drawing

14	your own picture there, Mr. Swiskey.
15	Generating engines for functioning, they
16	are doing work up there. They had a
17	tie-in that they were using. What
18	happened prior to Sandy, in preparing for
19	the storm, they were cranking up the
20	engines and that transformer gave out. In
21	the meantime, we started to get a
22	transformer to replace that transformer.
23	No, as I stated before, the generating
24	engines, function and ready to function,
25	if we needed them. Minus that small

1	engine.
2	As to the Tall Ships report, we
3	started that event we started
4	fundraising for that event, seems like
5	two years ago. As we did that, I went
6	back and looked at all the folders with
7	similar events to it that the Village
8	had. Most of what it contained, was
9	flipping through newspapers. There was
10	no financial's. There was no anything.
11	As I said to this Board when we were
12	doing it, that I would like to make sure
13	that we give some sort of record at the

14	end, as to whether it makes money or
15	doesn't make money. And to the extent
16	that it does not harm anybody, we will
17	make that information as open as
18	possible. We also determined that
19	wanted to determine if this was going to
20	make money or not make money. Which
21	meant, asking companies to discount their
22	work or to just flat out give money. I
23	had several businesses say to me, that
24	they would love to contribute but that it
25	would be detrimental to do so. And I

1	further, asked the attorney if I could
2	keep this information confidential, and
3	the answer was yes. The other thing that
4	we were doing, we were also under the
5	impression that a draft document of
6	confidential nature, and after Mr.
7	Freedman's presentation, a document is a
8	document, is a document. So that
9	document was released and redacted and
10	redacted the names. I had a subsequent
11	conversation with Mr. Freedman, that had
12	we adopted the amounts, that document

13	might have been acceptable. Nothing
14	changes in the bottom line. The
15	individuals name is kept off. The amount
16	of money that we made is the amount of
17	money that we made. That is the amount
18	of monies that we spent. The document
19	that was given is the same thing. At the
20	end of the day, it's the same thing. It
21	was a highly successful event that made
22	somewhere's in the amount of \$25,000.00.
23	In the end result, some of the businesses
24	that contributed, may be damaged with
25	that information. They may also not wish

1	to contribute the next time and that is
2	what we were trying to avoid. The end
3	result is, started off going in one
4	direction and doing the right thing for
5	everybody, and now we have a document out
6	there and that makes no difference in the
7	summary. It proves that the event did
8	make money. And that is the full
9	explanation that I gave I am actually
10	going to ask Jill Gunderson from the
10 11	going to ask Jill Gunderson from the paper who is here No, she is shaking

13	In hindsight, everything came
14	together and we all made money in the
15	event. I don't see how that is a bad
16	thing.
17	MR. SWISKEY: So I will ask for the
18	document
19	MAYOR NYCE: You can please be quiet
20	now. The bottom line is, the Village
21	made money. We wanted to make sure
22	that is why we
23	MR. SALADINO: Could you expand, Mr.
24	Mayor
25	MAYOR NYCE: Could you please keep

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1	quiet
2	MR. SALADINO: The people
3	MAYOR NYCE: Mr. Saladino, you are
4	out of order.
5	MR. SALADINO: If you are going to
6	give an explanation, give an explanation
7	
8	MAYOR NYCE: Mr. Saladino, you are
9	still out of order.
10	MR. SALADINO: Do you understand how
11	you look now? Do you understand that

12 people are asking --

MAYOR NYCE: John, you are gone. 13 14 Please leave. 15 MR. SWISKEY: Bye, because I won't 16 listen to any more lies, Mr. Mayor. 17 MAYOR NYCE: They are not lies. The truth is what you wanted it to 18 19 be. MR. SALADINO: That kind of answer 20 21 is okay with you? 22 MAYOR NYCE: With the additional 23 resolution that you have all seen, if you are comfortable with that, I will offer a 24 RESOLUTION #11-2012-1, RESOLUTION 25

1	adopting the November, 2012 agenda as
2	printed with the addition of what would
3	be RESOLUTION #11 2012-19. Making
4	RESOLUTION #20, the RESOLUTION to
5	adjourn. So moved.
6	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: Second.
7	MAYOR NYCE: All those in favor?
8	TRUSTEE KEMPNER: Aye.
9	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: Aye.
