- 16 say? I know I need new glasses. Cafe, Sweet
- 17 Spot eatery. So this is going to be a
- 18 take-out and sit in as well?
- 19 MR. LUCE: Very much like it was. Yes.
- 20 Sandwiches, salads.
- 21 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: Caroline, do you
- just want to move onto the next sign?
- 23 MEMBER WALOSKI: Yes. That's fine.
- 24 Let's move onto the next sign.
- 25 MR. LUCE: I just wanted to point out,

1	everywhere there was a sign, we took the
2	existing signage and put it back in the same
3	size. The one that is "MEET" we have not
4	done at all yet. So any direction, size? If
5	that needs to be we would really love
6	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I mean, I don't
7	even know how big the sign is. Do you know
8	how big the sign is?
9	MR. LUCE: Right now. That's Phase II.
10	So we have not even gotten there yet. So any
11	input, you can give, we want to make sure
12	that we do it properly.
13	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I called Eileen.
14	I wanted to know Keith did get approval
15	from the Planning Board, because he has to go
16	to the Planning Board to file an application
17	for a use, and everything got approved.
18	Everything including the signage, but you
19	have to come before our Board for that
20	particular signage. And "MEET" is the only
21	sign that overhangs public property, the

22	sidewalk. That is where we have slightly
23	different codes. Everything else is
24	basically, up we discussed it. The new
25	code for overhanging the signs is limited to

1	a size to two square feet. So when I did the
2	calculation, it's pretty close to 17x17
3	inches. So this is probably a little smaller
4	than what you had in mind, but if you would
5	like to hold onto the square, 17x17 is not
6	bad. So it's something that you probably
7	will have to discuss with Eileen. We need to
8	make sure it's to code, but you can follow-up
9	with Eileen.
10	MR. LUCE: Understood. I just want to
11	make sure we understand the process and do
12	what we have to do.
13	CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: There is no sign
14	there right now, overhanging it. So that's
15	understood. Do you need to see the colors?
16	We can pass them around. I don't have any

17 problems with the "NOSH" sign. The

restaurant is black and white. 18 19 MR. LUCE: Yes. 20 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: "MAIN" which 21 replaces the Oyster Company. What is this 22 square? Is this a sign? 23 MR. LUCE: There is -- from the awning, 24 there is vinyl lettering. Because it's on a 25 vinyl and lettering, it's very difficult to May 6, 2013 Regular Meeting 8 1 get off. So we're shadowing there. So the 2 designers came up with the idea of black. 3 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: You're leaving the awning? 4 5 MR. LUCE: The awning is there, yes. 6 MEMBER WALOSKI: So this is going to be 7 an overlay? 8 MR. LUCE: Yes. 9 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: I was hoping that 10 you were going to have other ideas.

So you will be adding yours, the "MAIN," "NOSH" and "PREP." 23 24 MR. LUCE: Yes. 25 CHAIRMAN UELLENDAHL: And then moving May 6, 2013 Regular Meeting 9 1 onto the "MEET." What is going to be in it? 2 Are you selling -- is this going to be a butcher? 3 4 MR. LUCE: No. I would like to point out on the agenda it says "MEAT," M-E-A-T. 5 6 It's actually M-E-E-T.

8 MR. LUCE: Well, in "PREP," we're

9	curing meats and that sort of thing, but
