1	MAYOR NYCE: I will call this Village
2	of Greenport Board of Trustees meeting to
3	order. Please stand for the Pledge of
4	Allegiance.
5	(Whereupon, all stood for the Pledge
6	of Allegiance, followed by a moment of
7	silence.)
8	MAYOR NYCE: We have quite a bit on
9	our agenda this evening. I will try and
10	keep things moving along. We have some
11	announcements. The Greenport Fire
12	Department Annual Washington's Birthday
13	Parade and Celebration will be held on
14	Saturday, February 16th. The New York
15	Conference of Mayors revised Calendar of
16	Dates is available on the Village website.
17	That is for the upcoming elections in
18	March. They were posted incorrectly due to
19	a holiday fall and those new dates are now
20	posted. There will be two Village Voter
21	Registration Days, on March 7th from 8:30
22	a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and on March 9th from
23	11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Anyone wishing to
24	vote may do so at that time at Village Hall

1	be held on March 12th at 10:00 a.m. at
2	Village Hall. With both of those, if you
3	are with any type of special needs and can
4	not go upstairs for voter registration
5	days, it will be held upstairs at Village,
6	arrangements will be made for you. The
7	upcoming Village election will be for two
8	Board of Trustees seats and will held on
9	March 19, 2013 from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
10	It is important to create a Fire
11	Safety Program for your family. Please be
12	sure to check the batteries in your smoke
13	and CO detectors in your house. Also,
14	please be sure that your house is properly
15	numbered outside, so that emergency
16	personnel can easily locate your home, if
17	needed.
18	There has been a Liquor license
19	application. That has been for Lucharitos.
20	With that, we have two public
21	hearings this evening. The first public
22	hearing is amending our Local Code Chapter
23	136, Water Code of the Village of
24	Greenport. This public hearing was

1 wishing to speak to this may do so at this 2 time. Your comments will be taken down for the record. I will give a brief overview. 3 4 This is a portion of our code that has been 5 in existence for quite some time. We are 6 updating the language to bring it up to 7 date. We're updating our code at this time. 8 There are some things that are necessary to say that are in compliance to Suffolk 9 County Water Authority requires. This is 10 11 mostly dealing with Backflow Prevention in 12 our water services primarily for commercial 13 properties, are the ones that are required. 14 There are some residential applications, 15 those being properties that are with 16 separate sprinkler systems. This amendment came from the Director of Utilities through 17 the Code Committee. The Code Committee is 18 19 recommending this be brought to the Board, 20 which we will do so now. We will ask if there is anyone from the public that wishes 21 22 to comment on this, you may do so now.

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Clerk. Anyone wishing to comment on this 1 2 may do so at this time. Your comments will 3 be taken down for the record. Again, just a 4 brief overview, this was presented to the Code Committee by the Village Attorney. The 5 Code Committee immediately passed it back 6 7 to the Village Board for consideration. The attorney brought to our attention while we 8 have fines affiliated with parking 9 10 violations, one's most often prosecuted by 11 us are parking illegally in a handicap spot 12 or parking in front of a hydrant and he had suggested that there be an escalator on 13 14 those fines. And that people were basically 15 skipping out on because there was no real 16 way for us to give back to that, and wasn't worth our money and time to go find the 17 18 fine. So he suggested this wording. He was 19 asked by someone on the Board, I forget who, about collection of these fines. I did 20 have the Clerk contact Southold Town and 21 22 we're in contact with the organization who

23	does collect these fines for the Town of
24	Southold. So it would not be a stress on
25	any of the staff.
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1	I will ask if anyone wants to comment

2	on this, they may do so at this time.
3	(No Response.)
4	MAYOR NYCE: If not, I will entertain
5	a motion to close this public hearing as
6	well?
7	TRUSTEE HUBBARD: So moved.

21	Our next agenda item is a
22	presentation from the principals of Peconic

23	Jitney. Thank you for coming out in such a
24	snotty evening. We thank you for the
25	information in advance and I will turn it

1	over to you.
2	PECONIC JITNEY: Thanks for having me.
3	I really just wanted the opportunity to
4	give a brief summary of the Peconic Water
5	Jitney Pilot Program that we ran this past
6	summer. We ran the ferry on the vessel
7	John Keith from June 28th through September
8	30th, and during that period, we carried,
9	16,650 passengers. Those are one-way fares
10	and not roundtrip. The split oddly enough
11	was between, demographically speaking, it
12	was just about 50/50. I think it was
13	literally, I think we were just two
14	passengers off between Greenport and Sag
15	Harbor organizations, but it was really
16	split right down the middle as far as who
17	was actually riding this. The average
18	passenger account was about 125 a day,
19	which generated approximately \$160,000 in
20	gross revenue. Not as miche as we had hoped
21	for and this is really the bottom line. We

22	had hoped we were looking for about
23	\$250,000.00 in gross revenues. That was
24	sort of the magic number for us that said
25	that we were going to continue this on our

9

1 own. We didn't quite get that. We were 2 pretty impressed with the number of 3 passengers, particularly toward the end in 4 August and September. It was beautiful weather, if you were remember. There were 5 6 actually some trips that we had to turn 7 some people away because the boat was full. 8 Anecdotally, and certainly through the 9 surveys, that we submitted to the Village 10 of Sag Harbor, the service was a hit. There 11 was a lot of positive feedback. I got a lot 12 of nice comments on the service. Overall, 13 it was a positive experience. Something not just for the day trippers and not just for 14 15 the tourists, but for local residents. They really took advantage of it. I spoke to a 16 lot of people who came to Greenport from 17 18 Sag Harbor for lunch and vice versa. So we were really encouraged by that as well. 19 20 There was very little negative feedback on 21 our service. A few things about the vessel

22 but some of the other problems in terms of	22	but some	of the	other	problems	in terms	of
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23 traffic and parking, really did

24 materialize. Financially for us, the report

25 doesn't have the total numbers, but we

1	spent over a half million on this pilot
2	program. So for us on our own to continue
3	it by ourselves. So we do not have plans
4	for 2013 as far as service and operation of
5	the vessel. The vessel is still available
6	that we used this last summer. It's still
7	at New York Harbor. What we're really
8	trying to do right now is see if we can
9	raise some money for capital expenditures.
10	So we can have a vessel and maybe two
11	vessels on a longer term basis, as well as
12	some expenditures for terminals to house
13	these vessels. If we have that upfront,
14	public or private partnership I am not
15	exactly sure which route it is going to
16	take, but that would give us the ability to
17	operate the service on a two to three year
18	basis and obtain the ridership that it
19	needs to sustain itself. We really think
20	that there is an opportunity here to open

21	up to other destinations on Peconic Bay as
22	well, but really need some outside help.
23	Those have been our endeavors as well as
24	myself and my brother Andrew. I have been
25	in touch with Tim Bishop and Fred Thiele

1	has taken these meetings. I went to there
2	to see if there was something possibly. We
3	have the passenger experience as a data to
4	submit and apply for some of these grants.
5	I am optimistic that something will take
6	off but as of right now, there is nothing
7	for the 2013 season. I did want to publicly
8	thank a few people in particular, the Board
9	and the Village for letting us operate this
10	service. Certainly, if we didn't get
11	through the two Village Boards none of this
12	would have happened. Also here in
13	Greenport, we have great support and
14	locals. Steve basically let us house the
15	vessel basically for free. Costello Marine,
16	they did a lot of work to have the docks
17	set up to make this happen. Bridge Hunt, of
18	course, from Shelter Island. He helped us
19	our quite a bit. Overall I was really happy
20	to see the support. Certainly, one of the

21	things that we achieved is opened
22	everybody's mind to this service and
23	possibility. So I am hoping that people
24	have realized that this type of water
25	transportation can only enhance on our

1	transportation on the east end and I think
2	the positives would certainly outweigh the
3	negatives. So thank you very much.
4	Any questions, I can answer them?
5	MAYOR NYCE: Quick comment. I
6	attended our Business Improvement Meeting
7	this past Thursday and they were very
8	optimistic about they way that they felt
9	the service has done for the Business
10	District this summer. And they offered up
11	letters of support and I would certainly be
12	willing to draft one, letters from this
13	Board, as you are going out looking for
14	additional funding. I think it is a
15	wonderful addition for downtown this
16	summer. I would also like to take the time
17	and applaud you. You took a huge risk. I am
18	sorry that you didn't make money.
19	PECONIC JITNEY: We knew that it

20	wasn't going to make money. We were hoping	
21	for that certain threshold number that	
22	would say "let's do this." We are a for	
23	profit organization and we do have a Board	
24	to answer to. We can keep funding that	
25	loss. I do believe that with the right	
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1	capital expenditures, we can make this	
2	happen.	
3	MAYOR NYCE: I agree. We all talked	

1	capital expenditures, we can make this
2	happen.
3	MAYOR NYCE: I agree. We all talked
4	about this for a long time.
5	PECONIC JITNEY: Thank you very much.
6	MAYOR NYCE: Thank you.
